Thirty-first Sunday of Ordinary Time

November: Month of the Holy Souls

We began this month with the celebrations of All Saints and All Souls last week. Each November, the Catholic Church remembers all the Holy Souls in Purgatory - those who have died in grace, yet who failed in this life to make satisfaction for all of their sins. It seems the Catholic Doctrine of Purgatory has become misunderstood by the faithful in recent years. Discomfort with this Doctrine leads to us downplaying the remembrance of souls.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 1030-1031 explains, "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven ... From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God."

Purgatory is not one last trial; all of those who make it to Purgatory will one day be in Heaven. Purgatory is where those who have died in grace, but who have not fully atoned for the temporal punishments resulting from their sins, go to finish their atonement before entering Heaven. Catholics believe that Purgatory is an expression of God's love, His desire to cleanse our souls of all that might keep us from experiencing the fullness of joy in Heaven. While in Purgatory, the Holy Souls can pray for us and we should pray for them, the faithful departed, that they may be freed from the punishment for their sins and enter into Heaven.

Praying for the living and the dead is a Spiritual Work of Mercy. Praying for the dead is one of the greatest acts of charity we can perform. When we pray for the dead we can start by praying for those closest to us, like our parents, grandparents, and family members; but we should also offer prayers for all the souls, and especially for those most forsaken or who have no one to pray for them.


Let's be sure to teach our children to pray for the Holy Souls so that one day, they can remember to pray for us and help us pass through Purgatory into our Eternal Reward. This also teaches children to hope for Heaven. Here is a beautiful traditional Catholic Prayer for us to memorize. We can substitute a particular loved one's name for the word "them."

Parking Lot Safety!

At St. Thomas Aquinas we try to maintain a safe, welcoming environment for everyone who comes to worship with us. One area where we need your help with this is in our parking lot. Recently many cars have been parked in the traffic lanes, and this makes it difficult for first responders to get close to the church in case of an emergency and dangerous for people walking in from the outer parking spaces and the street.

How can you help?

- Be sure to park only in marked parking spaces or on the street.
- If you need to park close to the building, you can usually find reasonable spaces up to 15 minutes before the start of the 10 am Mass or even later at the other Masses.
- If you need to make a quick getaway after Mass, parking on the street will help.
- If you dislike crowds, arriving early and waiting about 10 minutes to leave will help you miss the worst congestion. Before and after Mass are wonderful times to pray in Church or chat with the staff and other parish members in the Gathering Area.

None of these ideas are perfect; they all ask us to make some sacrifice for the good of the rest of our parish family. The members of this community have shown themselves capable of self-sacrificing love for others, so we are confident that together we can also handle this challenge in a way that lets us show our love for God through our consideration for the needs of others. Reflection from Our Parish Seminarian, Lawrence Oparaji



Today's Gospel reminds me of the rite of ordination for a deacon. The bishop when handing the Book of the Gospels to the deacon-elect, says "Believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach." This is what Jesus tells us in today's Gospel. He is calling us to not be like the Pharisees "who preach and do not practice" and "tie up heavy burdens and do not lift a finger to move them". Our Christian faith is very practical. Christianity is a lived experience not just a bunch of theories or abstract concepts—we are called to be Christians both in our words and deeds. St. Francis of Assisi would say "preach the Gospel and if necessary use words." Our faith is contagious when truly lived, it is an encounter through the Eucharist and many other ways Christ chooses to reveal Himself to us with a true person (Jesus Christ) and this encounter nourishes/feeds/strengthens us and allows us to live out this encounter. Our world today shies away from these encounters. People find it difficult to encounter Jesus and as Christians we sometimes contribute to these difficulties by living the Christian faith like Pharisees: we preach but do not practice, we judge, we fail to love, we do not speak the truth etc. These acts of ours have led many to turn away from the faith because they feel it is difficult and they do not know how to encounter a God whose followers preach and do not practice. I personally have experienced this resentment. Jesus is calling us today to examine our lives, and see those areas we have failed to put our faith into action, where we have served as a stumbling block to others and to approach with humility those faults of ours and resolve to make amends by making efforts to become Christians who preach AND practice the faith. He is calling us to spread His fragrance everywhere and to help people understand that His yoke is easy and His burden light, all we need to do is ask for His grace which is always abundant and sufficient.

I am very pleased that our St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church will be joining our brothers and sisters from Advent Lutheran Church, E.L.C.A. and Community of Hope, U.C.C. this year on Wednesday before Thanksgiving to pray together.

Authentic Catholic Ecumenism does not ask us to compromise our faith and is essential for Christian Unity. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Christ bestowed unity on His Church from the beginning. This unity, we believe, subsists in the Catholic Church as something she can never lose, and we hope that it will continue to increase until the end of time. Christ always gives His Church the gift of unity, but the Church must always pray and work to maintain, reinforce, and perfect the unity that Christ wills for her.... The desire to recover the unity of all Christians is a gift of Christ and a call of the Holy Spirit" (n. 820).

In *Crossing the Threshold of Hope*, Pope John Paul II also speaks of the urgent need for Christian unity: "By the year 2000 we need to be more united, more willing to advance along the path toward the unity for which Christ prayed on the eve of His Passion. This unity is enormously precious. In a certain sense, the future of the Kingdom of God in the world is at stake."

An excellent way to engage in authentic ecumenism is praying together and opening up dialogue with other Christians and people of good will to bring our culture to God, while at the same time acknowledging our obvious differences.




