#### Our Lady of Fatima:

#### 100th Anniversary of the Miracle of the Sun

May 13, 2017 was the 100th Anniversary of the first Fatima Apparition. On that date in 1917, Mary appeared for the first time to three shepherd children. The apparitions continued for the next six months, culminating with the "Miracle of the Sun" on October 13, 1917. This miracle was witnessed by 70,000 people who had joined the three child-visionaries. This past Friday, October 13, 2017 marked the 100th Anniversary of the final Fatima Apparition.

After the miracle *O Dia*, the newspaper in the Portuguese capital Lisbon, reported that "at midday by the sun, the rain stopped. The sky, pearly grey in color, illuminated the vast arid landscape with a strange light. The sun had a transparent gauzy veil so that the eye could easily be fixed on it. The grey mother-of-pearl tone turned into a sheet of silver which broke up as the clouds were parted and the silver sun, enveloped in the same gauzy grey light, was seen to whirl and turn in the circle of broken clouds. A cry went up from every mouth and people fell on their knees in the muddy ground..."

Many witnesses corroborated the phenomenon of the whirling, dancing colorful sun which at one moment seemed to be terrifyingly plunging toward earth, with the crowds "expecting the end of the world to come at any moment" one witness reported. After that moment, the oncesoggy and muddy crowd discovered that they were completely dry.

This miracle was the proof for the people that Mary truly did appear to the three children and supports one of the important messages of the apparitions that "even if humankind has separated God from their existence, God is present in human history and doesn't abandon humanity." The miracle broke the darkness of Portugal's atheist regimes. Pope Francis visited Fatima last May and canonized two of the child visionaries, who died just a few years after the visions. The essence of the message of Fatima is a call to conversion, penance, and praying the rosary daily for world peace, something that is as important in our life today as it was when Mary appeared in 1917. This 100-Year Anniversary is a great opportunity for us to revisit our devotion to Our Lady of Fatima and re-incorporate Mary's message into our lives today.

Craig Turner, a well-respected journalist and researcher, shares the unmistakable connection between the apparitions of our Blessed Mother at Fatima in 1917 and the fall of communism in Europe more than seventy years later. This talk is sure to provide a greater awareness of the motherly help and protection that Mary offers mankind through her powerful intercession. The importance of entrusting ourselves to her care has never been so evident as it is today.

### Reflection from Our Parish Seminarian, Lawrence Oparaji

Today's Gospel reminds me of the hvmn "All Are Welcome." Indeed all are invited into God's house.

Christ died for all of us so that we can

be welcomed into His house and partake in the banquet He has set before us. The problem however, is with us; all are welcome but not all want to accept this invitation. We refuse God's invitation by being too busy to come to God's mountain (the church), we do this when we have no time to pray, when we fail to develop a closer relationship with God, and this leads us to an inability to be able to recognize God's invitation to us and accept it accordingly.

Towards the end of the Gospel, we encounter something strange: the King who wants to invite all, who says all are welcome, now turns away a guest for not wearing the right clothes. How could this be, how could he be so mean? Well this man, obviously, did not follow instructions, he was not properly prepared for this feast; we are all invited but we have to wear the garments of faith (which by the way are free garments we are given by virtue of Christ's passion, death and resurrection). We have to live lives that are in keeping with people who partake in the banquet of the Lord. This is not easy but God's grace is there for us. We have to learn to ask for God's grace and remember that on our own we are not worthy and can do nothing, but in and through Christ we can do all things.

Today we are gathered around the altar of the Lord to celebrate a banquet, a banquet of thanksgiving - The Holy Eucharist. We are all gathered because we want to respond positively to God's invitation to us - to eat the life-giving bread and drink from the life-giving cup and because we believe in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. May the Eucharist we receive help us to live lives worthy of those to be invited into the eternal banquet of God in heaven. May we know the joy and peace that Christ promises to all who respond positively to His invitation.


