Second Sunday of Lent: Inviting Jesus to Be a Part of Our Lives!

The Transfiguration of Jesus that is experienced by Peter, James, and John, is a watershed moment in Jesus' relationship with His disciples. In this extraor-



dinary vision, the disciples perceive the divinity that exists within Jesus, a divinity that is affirmed by the voice heard in the cloud. This season of Lent is a good time for us to have a "watershed moment" in our relationship with Jesus. We can encounter Jesus Christ Sacramentally in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is a powerful "watershed moment" for us in our relationship with Jesus. In confession, we can pray to Jesus, tell him we are sorry for our sins, invite Him into our lives, and surrender our lives to Him. He will give us the gift of the Holy Spirit for a new life in His Church! Please remember there are two priests available during our regular weekend Confession times and also Confessions available Tuesday evenings in the Library after 5:30 PM Mass.

Reflection from Our Parish Seminarian, Lawrence Oparaji

Today's Gospel presents the transfiguration, when Christ gives His disciples a

glimpse of what eternal glory will be like for all of us who endure till the end. In other words, Christ reveals to the apostles the goal we are all running toward: to see the glorious face of God and share forever in His eternal banquet. This is why we come into the faith, and it is the Christian's ultimate end. The beginning of Lent is a good time for this reminder, because that is one area the Devil uses to tempt us, coming to us and asking in a friendly and deceitful voice "Why do you do all these good works and live this virtuous life?"

As we journey in this life, this period of transformation and drawing closer to the Sacred and Precious Heart of Jesus, we can look forward to the same experience the apostles had when they exclaimed "Rabbi, it is good to be here, as we enter one day to our heavenly reward." But while we wait for that day—and none of us knows when, how, or where it will come—we have work to do in the present. We have to continuously work and walk with Jesus; we need to listen to Him. Listening to Him transforms our stony hearts into fleshy hearts. This means trusting in Him, especially when things do not go our way; it means learning to take God's "no" as a good answer; as a "yes" to something bigger and better than what we crave in the present.

May God give us his saving grace to constantly trust in Him, to love Him and love all His creatures, to listen to His voice and inner promptings so that one day, someday, we too, can exclaim "It is good to be here" and enjoy God's everlasting company with all His Saints in heaven.
