Solemnity of Pentecost

Happy birthday to the Catholic Church! Happy birthday to you, who are the body of the Church! The word Pentecost is Greek, and it means “50th day.” Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their Earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations.

At Pentecost, the Apostles, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and their followers were gathered in a room and the Holy Spirit came upon them with a great wind, and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire and split itself into many individual flames above the heads of all those present. St. Peter called all those present to be baptized, and about three thousand people were baptized that day. These people were among the first Catholics, and Peter is the first Pope of the Catholic Church.

The symbols of Pentecost are the flame, wind, and the dove, which represents the Holy Spirit. The color of Pentecost is red, and the priest wears red vestments on this day.

Reflection from Seminarian, Michael Wanta

“O most Blessed Light Divine,
Shine within these hearts of yours,
and our inmost being fill!” (from
the Sequence *Veni, Sancte
Spiritus*)



Last week with the Ascension, we celebrated that our human nature has been lifted up to heaven and drawn into God in Christ. Because Jesus first took on our nature, redeemed it through the Cross and Resurrection, and then ascended to the Father, we can dwell in God.

Today we celebrate the converse of this mystery: that God dwells in us through the gift of His Holy Spirit, who is the infinite love shared between the Father and the Son. By receiving this Spirit of adoption we cry out “abba,” Father (cf. Rom 8:15). It is by the reception of the Holy Spirit in baptism that we are made sons and daughters of God, and we are able to live with Him and like Him. We are then able to call God “Father” because we have been incorporated into the body of His Son.

In living things, the soul is the principle of unity: binding all the parts of the body to function as one organism. Thus the Body of Christ is the supreme analogy for the Church with Christ as the head, us as the members, and the Holy Spirit as the soul. In baptism we are “born of water and Spirit (John 3:5),” water as a symbol of Christ’s death and the Spirit being his new life that animates us.

It is important for us to dwell on this mystery. We have received the Holy Spirit, the very life of God, and God dwells in us by grace. In times of trial and distress, worry and anxiety, let us turn again to this great wonder. We need not seek fulfillment through our own actions but in the realization of what Christ has done for us. Let us open ourselves to this gift, and conform ourselves to Christ who sacrificed himself for all people and who wills our greatest good and happiness, ultimately union with Himself.

Lastly, Mary is the mother of this Body which belongs to Christ. This year, Pope Francis has reinstated the memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church, which takes place on the Monday after Pentecost. Let us turn to our Mother who waited and prayed with the apostles so that they would be united by the Holy Spirit into Christ’s Body.

The Holy Spirit is the fire of love burning in the Church and in our hearts, even though we often cover him with the ash of our sins. Let us ask him: “Spirit of God, Lord, who dwell in my heart and in the heart of the Church, guiding and shaping her in diversity, come! Like water, we need you to live. Come down upon us anew, teach us unity, renew our hearts and teach us to love as you love us, to forgive as you forgive us. Amen”. Pope Francis June 4, 2017

New Feast Day! Mary Mother of the Church

Pope Francis has made the devotion to the Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, a new fixed celebration in the Roman Catholic calendar. The Vatican published a decree recently in which Pope Francis declared that the “Mary Mother of the Church” feast would be celebrated on the Monday following Pentecost. This year, it falls on May 21.



This feast day honors Mary as Mother of the Church, a title whose roots trace back to the 4th century. As mother of Christ, she is also mother of all who are members of his body, the Church. The decree said Francis wanted the devotion to “encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety.” Let us embrace Mary’s motherhood, and turn to her on this feast day -- and every day -- for her intercession and her help!

This is the latest official celebration that Pope Francis has decreed to honor women in Jesus’ life and women in the Church. In 2016, Francis declared the elevation of St. Mary Magdalene’s memorial to feast day of St. Mary Magdalene on July 22.
