ME 25 Survey

This weekend at all of our Masses, we conducted a survey during Mass to assess the engagement level of parishioners. This survey is an extremely important tool to help us understand where we are at as a parish today. As we begin to embark on our New Vision for our parish, we need to be able to measure our progress. As we begin to embark on this new vision for our parish, your participation is crucial in these beginning days. The more we participate in the initial steps in these early months, the more success we will have in our mission to "Love God, Love Others, and Make Disciples!"

Confirmation Retreat

This Sunday we are having our Confirmation Retreat for our 37 ninth graders who are preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation this Spring. Please keep all of our young people in your prayers, but especially our Confirmation Candidates, pictured on today's bulletin cover. We pray that our youth will have an encounter with Jesus Christ and come to know, love, and serve Him in this life and be with Him forever in the next. I want to share with you a portion of Pope Francis' message to the youth of our Church from World Youth Day 2017 as he reflected on the life of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

Our age does not need young people who are "couch-potatoes!"

According to Luke's Gospel, once Mary has received the message of the angel and said "yes" to the call to become the Mother of the Savior, she sets out in haste to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who was in the sixth month of her pregnancy (cf. 1:36, 39). Mary is very young; what she was told is a great gift, but it also entails great challenges. The Lord assured her of his presence and support, yet many things remain obscure in her mind and heart. Yet Mary does not shut herself up at home or let herself be paralyzed by fear or pride. Mary is not the type that, to be comfortable, needs a good sofa where she can feel safe and sound. She is no couch potato! If her elderly cousin needs a hand, she does not hesitate, but immediately sets off.

It was a long way to the house of Elizabeth, about 150 kilometers. But the young woman from Nazareth, led by the Holy Spirit, knows no obstacles. Surely, those days of journeying helped her to meditate on the marvelous event of which she was a part. So it is with us, whenever we set out on pilgrimage [or go on retreat]. Along the way, the

Reflection from Our Parish Seminarian, Lawrence Oparaji



In today's Gospel we are told that the Pharisees instigated a conspiracy against our Lord Jesus Christ. A team made up of Pharisees and Herodians was formed to approach Jesus with a question. The two groups represented two extremes. The Pharisees were religious extremists while the Herodians favored secularism. The question they asked our Lord was a trick question to force our Lord take a side so that the other side would attack him. The question was: "Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar or not?" This is obviously a yes or no answer question. If Jesus says yes, he will please the Herodians and offend the Pharisees and if he says no the reverse will be true. Of course being God, Jesus could already see through them.

Jesus' response to the representatives of the Pharisees and Herodians is also good advice to every Christian: we have an obligation not only to God, who is Lord and King over all, but also to our nation as citizens. The welfare of both the Church and of the nation should necessarily be our concern. As Christ instructs the representative of the Pharisees and Herodians, Christians should always "Give the Lord glory and power" and also honor legitimate authority and be obedient to the just laws of society.

When we Christians live in societies, our fellow citizens should be able to see in us the light of Christ, they should be able to taste the salt of Christ from the way we live our lives. We are called to live out the motto of the American Legions "for God and for country" by standing up for truth, justice, equality, equity and all other virtues and shunning vices and other ills that harm our society. We are called to do this not out of hatred but out of love for God and for our society. May God help us as we seek to serve Him and serve our society.

events of our own lives come to mind, we learn to appreciate their meaning and we discern our vocation, which then becomes clear in the encounter with God and in service to others.

Pope Francis inspires us to love Jesus as Mary did and to spend our life in service to others. Our youth are the Church of today and the future. Let us continue to pray for them as they prepare to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Already did Alpha? Wondering what's next?

A small group of parishioners who participated in Alpha over the summer want to continue meeting, to continue to grow in faith together. They shared how they were looking for ways to improve their prayer life (and learn to be more comfortable with spontaneous prayer and praying out loud for people), continue faith sharing (because our stories of faith can uplift others, and hearing the stories of others can help inspire us to do better), and gain the strength to face the craziness of the world with hope.

The intention is that this will develop into a small faith sharing group, a circle of friends, that get together regularly for prayer, laughter and accountability as they continue growing in faith. To begin, they felt that they needed to lay a foundation so that as they move forward, they can effectively and meaningfully pray with God's living Word – listening to the very personal message that Jesus speaks to our hearts through scripture, and then letting that shape our lives.

In order to start on the right foot, they are going to use a short book called **Praying Scripture for a Change**. A short description: If you're looking to learn how to get the most out of prayer, this book is indispensable. As St. Augustine notes, When we pray, we speak to God; when we read Scripture, God speaks to us. The key to enriching our prayer is learning the language of Christianity, and the most effective way to learn the language of Christianity is an ancient technique known as *lectio divina* (divine reading).

Jenny Ludtke will facilitate these beginning sessions for the group. We will **meet every 2 weeks, Wednesday morning 9:15-10:30 AM in the library**, after 8:30 AM Mass, starting on November 1. The rest of the dates are November 15, 29, December 13 and January 3. The cost of the book is \$15. After finishing this short study, the group intends to continue on their own, putting to use the skills they have gained.

Discipleship Moment

“Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar’s and to God the things that are God’s.” - Matthew 22:21

Everything we are and everything we have belongs to God. We aren’t “owners” of anything, we are merely “Stewards” of the gifts God has given each of us.
