From the Desk of Fr. Bart

Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus began his ministry by calling simple fishermen in today's Gospel to be his most trusted co-workers. Simon and Andrew's "abandoning" of their nets and James and John's "abandoning" of their father illustrate the total trust and commitment Jesus wants of those who would be his disciples. What "fishing nets" must we "abandon" if we are to follow Jesus as true disciples?



Masses for the Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas

In the introduction to the Roman calendar published in 1969, paragraph # 58 states: "For the pastoral advantage of the people, it is permissible to observe on the Sundays in Ordinary Time those celebrations that fall during the week and have special appeal to the devotion of the faithful, provided the celebrations take precedence over these Sundays in the Table of Liturgical Days. The Mass for such celebrations may be used at all the Masses at which a congregation is present." Therefore, it is legitimate to transfer the celebration of a parish's patron saint (which has the rank of solemnity in the parish itself) to the following Sunday if this is a Sunday of Ordinary Time.

Given this rubric, as pastor, I have made the decision to use the prayers and readings for the Mass on the Feast Day of St. Thomas Aquinas next weekend at all of our Masses, instead of the readings and prayers for the Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time. I am looking forward to celebrating our Family of Faith at our Masses next weekend and at our Spaghetti Supper next Saturday! St. Thomas Aquinas, Pray for us!

Theme for March For Life 2018: Love Saves Lives

This year marks the 45th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* decision legalizing abortion. Even though January 22 is the actual anniversary day, this year's March for Life was held on Friday, January 19. Fifty-nine million Americans have been lost to abortion since the *Roe v. Wade* decision and mothers and fathers have been wounded by their choice.

As Pro-life Catholics, we have great hope that we are making progress in our work to protect the unborn and help bring an end to abortion. The year 2013 marked 40 years since the Supreme Court invalidated all 50 states abortion laws in *Roe v. Wade*. The pro-life movement has made tremendous strides to educate the American people on the gift of life. Although there is much more to do, there are many reasons that pro-lifers must have hope! Here are some bright spots I found on the website: marchforlife.org

1. According to polls, "pro-life" has been the "new normal" for Americans since 2009. In 2012, 50% of Americans identified as pro-life, while those identifying as "pro-choice" hit a record low of 41%.
2. Young people are increasingly pro-life, which is evident as thousands of youth travel to the March for Life each year. Trends show that support of unlimited access to abortion by young people has dropped 12 percentage points since 1990. According to Gallup "support for making abortion broadly illegal

Reflection from Our Summer Seminarian, Michael Wanta

Last Sunday I was instituted as a Lector, which is one of the steps in seminary along the way to the priesthood. This may seem odd – that there is an instituted ministry of Lector ordered to the priesthood – since I’m sure some of you in the pews are lectors now or at some time have been a lector at Mass.

Lector used to be one of the minor orders: tonsure, porter, lector, exorcist, and acolyte. Originally these minor orders were ministries of the lay faithful who exercised them in the worship of God and service of the people of God. Eventually these roles came to be seen as preparations for the priesthood and were codified into seminary structures. After Vatican II, these orders were simplified into the Institutions of Lector and Acolyte which are still conferred on those preparing for the priesthood in a formal ceremony. But to be a lector is not only ordered toward the priesthood for a seminarian. At the core of being a lector is to be a witness to the Gospel, proclaiming the Word in word and example. Since we all participate in the baptismal priesthood of Christ, we are all called to holiness and to proclaim the Gospel to all nations. The ordained priesthood helps us do this not only through teaching us but especially through the sacraments which give us grace. And we, in turn, take what we have received and give it to others.

Let me close with two simple points that struck me as I prepared to become an Instituted Lector.

Last week, St. Andrew asked Christ: “Teacher, where do you dwell?” (Jn1). To proclaim the Word of God, we must live in it. We must dwell in it. We must spend time with Him who has spoken to us.

Secondly, Christ said today: “Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.” (Mk1) This applies especially to priests as it was spoken to the Apostles in a specific way, but it is applicable for all Christians. Our relationship with Christ which gives a peace and joy, even in spite of suffering, is not for ourselves alone. To follow Christ is to share Christ with others.

- [is] growing fastest among young adults.”
3. Most Americans do not agree with United States abortion laws. Abortion is legal through all nine months of pregnancy, but most believe that abortion should be highly restricted: 79% believe it should be illegal after the first trimester; 87% of Americans believe that abortion should be illegal after 6 months of pregnancy, while only 16% believe it should be legal through all 9 months of pregnancy.
 4. Throughout the United States, there are more than 2,000 Pregnancy Resource Centers (PRC) that offer help to mothers experiencing unplanned pregnancies. There are 1,793 abortion providers through the country.
 5. PRCs report that up to 90% of women contemplating abortion who see the ultrasound, and hear their baby's heart beat, choose to carry their baby to term.
 6. Many PRCs offer ultrasounds free of charge to mothers. Free services offered by PRCs in 2010 were worth well over an estimated \$100 million.

Let us keep praying and keep working to change hearts by joining together to build a culture of life. On Monday, January 22, the Rosary For Life will be prayed before Mass at 8:00 AM and Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 AM on this the Day of Prayer for Legal Protection of Unborn Children.



Prayers by the Patron Saint of Our Parish

A Prayer of St. Thomas Aquinas Before Communion

This prayer gives us a moving example of love and humility in the presence of our Savior. St. Thomas, the celebrated 13th century “Angelic Doctor” of the Church, is considered to be one of the greatest theologians and intellects in our faith.



Almighty and Eternal God, behold I come to the sacrament of Your only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. As one sick I come to the Physician of life; unclean, to the Fountain of mercy; blind, to the Light of eternal splendor; poor and needy to the Lord of heaven and earth. Therefore, I beg of You, through Your infinite mercy and generosity, heal my weakness, wash my uncleanness, give light to my blindness, enrich my poverty, and clothe my nakedness. May I thus receive the Bread of Angels, the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, with such reverence and humility, contrition and devotion, purity and faith, purpose and intention, as shall aid my soul’s salvation.

Grant, I beg of You, that I may receive not only the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of our Lord, but also its full grace and power. Give me the grace, most merciful God, to receive the Body of your only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary, in such a manner that I may deserve to be intimately united with His mystical Body and to be numbered among His members. Most loving Father, grant that I may behold for all eternity face to face Your beloved Son, whom now, on my pilgrimage, I am about to receive under the sacramental veil, who lives and reigns with You, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, world without end. Amen.

A Prayer of St. Thomas Aquinas After Communion

In this prayer, we feel his ardent desire for the soul-cleansing power of the Eucharist. He once said that “in this Sacrament sins are purged away, strength renewed, and the mind fortified with generous spiritual gifts.”

This great 13th Century “Angelic Doctor” also expresses here his deep desire that Holy Communion may aid him on his journey towards Eternal Life and help him to experience joy that “no one shall take from you” (John 16:22), as our Lord called it when speaking to His disciples at the Last Supper.

I thank You, Lord, Almighty Father, Everlasting God, for having been pleased, through no merit of mine, but of Your great mercy alone, to feed me, a sinner, and Your unworthy servant, with the precious Body and Blood of Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that this Holy Communion may not be for my judgment and condemnation, but for my pardon and salvation. Let this Holy Communion be to me an armor of faith and a shield of good will, a cleansing of all vices, and a rooting out of all evil desires. May it increase love and patience, humility and obedience, and all virtues. May it be a firm defense against the evil designs of all my visible and invisible enemies, a perfect quieting of all the desires of soul and body. May this Holy Communion bring about a perfect union with You, the one true God, and at last enable me to reach eternal bliss when You will call me. I pray that You bring me, a sinner, to the indescribable Feast where You, with Your Son and the Holy Spirit, are to Your saints true light, full blessedness, everlasting joy, and perfect happiness. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.



Edgewood Campus School Open House


