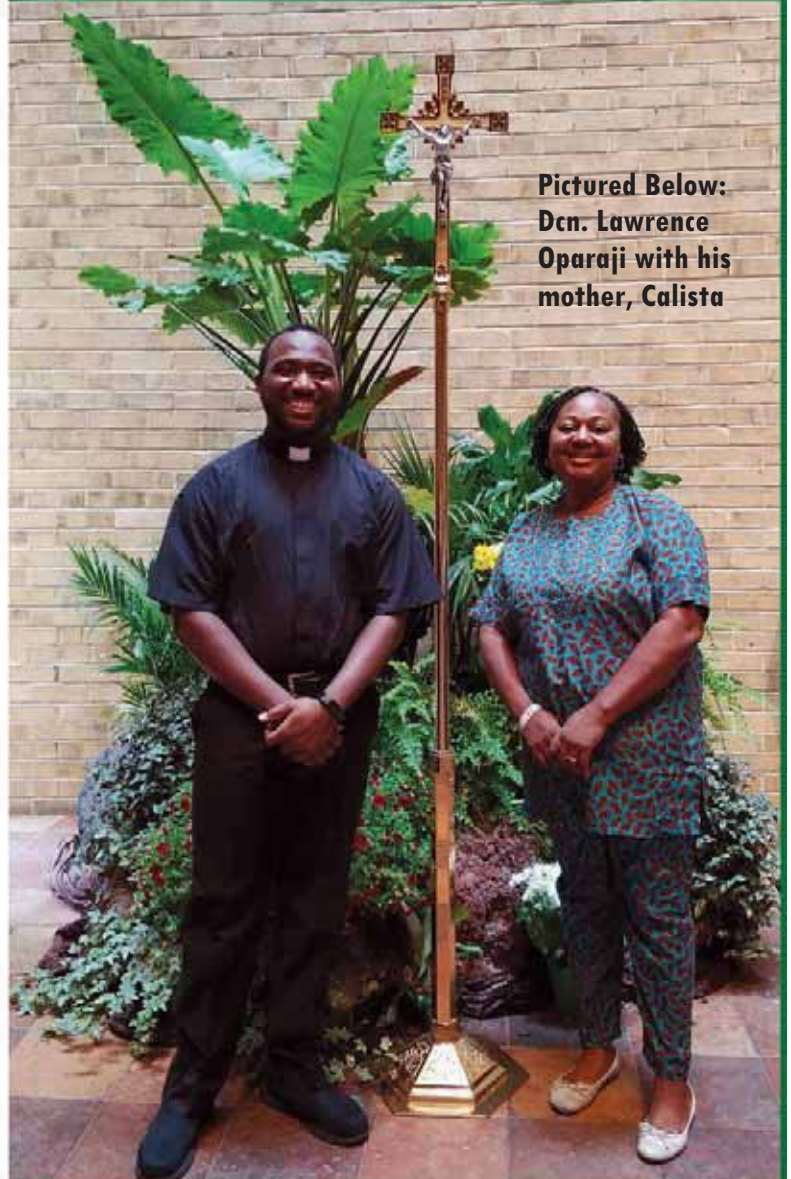

From the Desk of Fr. Bart

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Today's celebration honors the most fundamental of Christian beliefs—belief in the Holy Trinity. The human mind can never fully understand the mystery of the Trinity, but we can sum it up in the following formula: God is three Persons in one Nature. There is only one God, and the three Persons of God—The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—are equally God, and They cannot be divided.



Congratulations to Deacon Lawrence Oparaji!

With great joy and thanksgiving to Almighty God, we congratulate Deacon Lawrence on being ordained to the Transitional Diaconate this past Friday. God willing, Dcn. Lawrence will be ordained to the Catholic Priesthood next summer in June 2019 for our Diocese of Madison. We are blessed to celebrate this milestone with him as a parish family. Dcn. Lawrence will be the first parishioner of St. Thomas Aquinas to be ordained a priest! We continue to pray that more vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life will come forth from the families of our parish.

Thank you for your generous outpouring of support for Dcn. Lawrence with your prayers and ordination gifts. As he makes this lifelong commitment to celibacy and service in the Church, it is a blessing to receive so much love and support from the people of God.

As I mentioned at our Easter Masses, Bishop Morlino has assigned Dcn. Lawrence to our St. Thomas Aquinas Parish for his Deacon Assignment for this summer of 2018. This is great news for us! Lawrence has been a positive addition to our parish family since arriving here in 2015 as a Seminarian for our Diocese of Madison. The Role of Deacons in the Catholic Church is described in the book, *Catholicism for Dummies*:

“In the hierarchy of the Catholic Church, you have the Pope at the top (well, after God), cardinals, bishops, priests, and then deacons. Catholics recognize two types of deacons:

Permanent deacons are men ordained to an office in the Catholic Church who normally have no intention or desire of becoming priests. They can be single or married. If the latter, they must be married *before* being ordained a deacon. If his wife dies before him, he may be ordained a priest if the bishop permits and approves.

Permanent deacons, especially those who are married, have secular jobs to support their families and also help the local pastor by visiting the sick, teaching the faith, counseling couples and individuals, working on parish committees and councils, and giving advice to the pastor.

Transitional deacons are *seminarians*, students in the last phase of training for the Catholic priesthood. After being a deacon for a year, they're ordained a priest by the bishop.

Deacons can baptize, witness marriages, perform funeral and burial services outside of Mass, distribute Holy Communion, preach the *homily* (which is the sermon given after the Gospel at Mass), and are obligated to pray the Divine Office (Breviary) each day. (*The Divine Office, Breviary, or Liturgy of the Hours* are all the same thing. These are the 150 Psalms and Scriptural readings from the Old and New Testament that every deacon, priest, and bishop must pray every day and a few times during each day.) This way, in addition to the biblical readings at daily Mass, the cleric is also exposed to more Sacred Scripture each day of his life.”

What a great blessing it is for us to be able to share in Lawrence's diaconal ministry as he performs many of these ministries for the very first time. I will try and offer him opportunities to observe and practice

Reflection from Our Seminarian, Deacon Lawrence Oparaji



Today we as a church are called to celebrate the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Three persons in one God, the Trinity. The teaching of the Trinity lies in the truth that God is one being with three distinct persons, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. A being is what makes us *what* we are; in that regard we are human beings, we have body, soul, reason, etc. A person is what makes us *who* we are; so I am a human being, that is what I am and what I share with 7.8 billion human beings that make up the earth but in terms of who I am, I am Lawrence Kelechi Oparaji; this is distinctly me and differentiates me from every-one else. So in the Trinity, God is one being - a spiritual being, which he shares with every other person in the Trinity and in this spiritual-being we have three distinct Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Throughout all the events of our salvation history, from creation to our present age, we constantly see that the three divine persons are not divided in their actions. Instead, they are working and walking together for our salvation and success. They agreed to create and redeem us. This Unity is an essential part of what we celebrate today; it is always a joy to see couples celebrating their wedding anniversary and the joy with which they exclaim "we have been married for 5, 10, 50 years" I share in the joy of these couples because they replicate the Trinitarian unity. They prove to us that in spite of our differences we can work together as a family and community.

A second aspect of what we celebrate today is love. It is often said that people always try to be like the god, that they worship. So those who worship a warrior god tend to be warmongering people; and people who truly worship the God of love tend to be a loving people. The God we worship does not exist and thrive on individualism. Rather He exists in a trinity of love, a community of love and sharing. Our God is not a loner! Consequently, a Christian disciple must shun every inclination to selfishness and isolation. Christianity is a communion of people who love and want to be loved, people who give love and are open to receive love!

Music & Liturgy By Greg Buchberger, Director of Music Ministries



Should I Sing During Mass?

We live in a society today marked by an explosion of celebrated singers and musicians, and their music is available to us in such quality and quantity as we have never seen before. We also have more variety in choices for music and instead of listening to music with others, our enjoyment of music has become inwardly focused as we put in our earbuds so we can listen to music in our own space and time. We see shows that put individual singers and soloists on a pedestal, like American Idol and America's Got Talent. But are we, as a people, as a community, still practicing the art of common song?

Sadly, group singing has been declining for decades. How many times today do we attend a sports event and listen to the singer instead of everyone singing the National Anthem together? How many times do we attend birthday parties where attendees don't even try to sing Happy Birthday or where a majority of folks, especially our youth, don't sing? This has had a drastic impact on our churches, not only with a decline in numbers of choir members, but also with fewer people in our pews lifting their voices in prayer and song to God. How many times do we look around when we are at Mass and see those around us not responding to the prayers or not singing? The documents of our Church are very clear about our participation at Mass... the participation of all who are present... not just those that like to pray, or like to sing, or are virtuosos!

The Promotion of Active Participation

Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people, is their **right and duty** by reason of their baptism. In the restoration and promotion of the sacred liturgy, this **full and active participation by all the people** is the aim to be considered before all else; for it is the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit.

(Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 1963)

A wonderful priest once shared with me some insight which is a good reminder to us. Whenever we are talking about the Church, our prayer, or our parish community, either you believe it is sacred or you don't. But if you truly believe, then this belief calls you to something higher, something better, something more. If you believe that our Liturgy (the Mass) is Sacred, then your response should be clear. If you believe that Christ died for you, then that has some serious implications for your life.

If you believe that our Parish Community is truly the Body of Christ present in our world, how are you actively being Christ to/for others? How are you being called to be active in your belief in the Church? In our Lord, Jesus Christ? In our Liturgy? In our Parish Community?
