### Divine Renovation Conference 2018

This week I will be attending a three-day conference in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada given by Fr. James Mallon, author of the book, *Divine Renovation*. I look forward to this experience and learning more about parish ministry. This is my second three-day conference this summer. The first was sponsored by the Diocese of Green Bay on the topic of Evangelization. Last week I attended a training day in Chicago for the new Spanish translation of the Roman Missal. I am grateful that I have been able to use my annual seven days of continuing education in such a useful way for my ministry among you.

### Communal Anointing of the Sick

**Saturday, June 30 at 4:30 PM**

**Sunday, July 1 at 8:00 AM**

“Is anyone sick among you? Let them bring in the priests of the church, and let them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith shall save the sick persons (James 5:14-15).”

During Masses on Saturday June 30 at 4:30 PM and Sunday July 1 at 8:00 AM we will celebrate a Communal Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This sacrament is not just for those who are at the point of death. It is a sacrament of the *sick*. This Sacrament of Healing can be received by those whose health is compromised through either sickness or old age. Here are some guidelines to consider for participating in this Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:

- “As soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for that person to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived (Vatican II, *Sacrosanctum Concilium* 73).”
- “The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is given to those who are seriously ill (Paul VI, Apostolic Constitution *Sacram Unctione Infirmorum*, 30 Nov 1972).”
- “The anointing of the sick can be administered to any member of the faithful who, having reached the use of reason, begins to be in danger of death by reason of illness or old age (Canon 1004.1).”
- “Great care and concern should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age

## RCIA – Should I Become Catholic?

## Reflection from Our Seminarian, Deacon Lawrence Oparaji



*"Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking around at those seated in the circle he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."*

As Christians our main focus and life is to do the will of God. This can be difficult at times; the journey of a Christian is never one that is uneventful. It is instead one filled with ups and downs. Many of our fellow Christians have given up on God in these tumultuous times; they cannot comprehend why and how they should believe in a God who cannot make life easy for them. They forget that the only begotten Son of God, Jesus Christ, suffered and died a criminal's death; they forget that Christ told all of us, his followers, to "take up our cross and follow him." God never promised us comfort and a life without problems or issues; instead He promised us salvation and a life filled with peace amidst all the troubles that may come.

Thomas Merton wrote a beautiful poem and I think it is worth sharing:

*My Lord God,  
I have no idea where I am going.  
I do not see the road ahead of me.  
I cannot know for certain where it will end,  
nor do I really know myself,  
and the fact that I think I am following your will  
does not mean that I am actually doing so.  
But I believe that the desire to please you  
does in fact please you.  
And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing.  
I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire.  
And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the  
right road,  
though I may know nothing about it.  
Therefore will I trust you always though  
I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death.  
I will not fear, for you are ever with me,  
and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.*

God created us and He ultimately knows what is best for us, even more than we know for ourselves. Let us ask him for the grace to trust Him more, for the grace to bear our crosses patiently and follow Him unreservedly.

receive this sacrament. A prudent or reasonably sure judgment, without scruple, is sufficient for deciding on the seriousness of an illness; if necessary a doctor may be consulted (General Introduction to the *Roman Ritual, Pastoral Care of the Sick: Rites of Anointing and Viaticum*, par. 8)."

- "It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation (CCC 1515)."
- It must be noted that certain severe forms of mental illness, which seriously impair health so as to potentially lead to death, are also cause for the administration of Anointing.

We will have two priests present in addition to myself to help with the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please consider bringing your family member or neighbor who may be homebound to come and receive this Sacrament of healing.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick *is not* the "Last Rites." The "Last Rites" are prayed with people who are dying or near death and usually include the "Apostolic Pardon," for the forgiveness of sins and "Viaticum" or Last Eucharist. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for those who are suffering serious illness of body, mind, or spirit and need the special help of God's grace at this time of anxiety. This sacrament is a prayer for healing and restoring hope. Please call the Parish Office with any questions or concerns about this special Sacrament. I can also come to the home or care facility of someone who is ill and celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick or the "Last Rites" with them, depending on the situation.

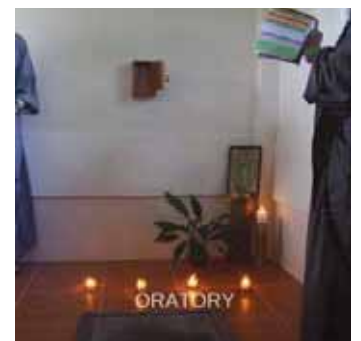
## Thank You STA!

# St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish: 60 Years of



Our first pastor, Fr. Arnold Lehman (1958–1966), dealt with the challenges of starting a new parish, such as baptizing babies in the small trailer that served as the first rectory.

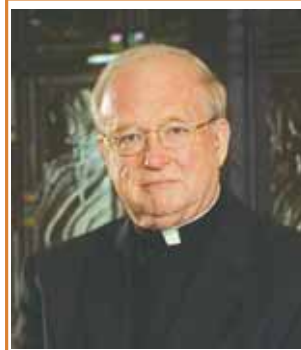
Msgr. Andrew Breines, pastor from 1966–1972, implemented the reforms from Vatican Council II. A pastoral council was established and religious education classes moved from members' homes to 6 new classrooms.



On June 6, 1958, Bishop William P. O'Connor signed a decree effective June 13, 1958, establishing St. Thomas Aquinas. Our first Masses were celebrated at the Westside Businessman's Club. After 4 months they moved to the studios of WMTV.



Our first church building, at the corner of Rosa Road and Mineral Point Road, was dedicated July 10, 1960.



Fr. Murray retired in 2001 and was succeeded by Msgr. Terry Connors (pastor 2001–2006). He brought a greater emphasis on stewardship of time, talent, and treasure, and the parish increased its long-standing support for ministries aiding those in need, both locally and abroad.

The parish thrived on Everglade Drive, and by the 1990s the original building was too small. In July 1998 construction started to add a religious education wing and expand the chapel, gathering area, social hall, nursery, kitchen, bride's room and ushers' room. The renovated church was re-dedicated on August 29, 1999.

Locally, the parish supported and continues to support food pantries, meal programs, such as the Community Meal Program and meals at the Catholic Multicultural Center, and the ministry of a vibrant parish conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

# Loving God, Loving Others, and Making Disciples!



In 1984 Fr. Flanagan suffered a serious heart attack. He passed away at the parish on January 25, 1985.



By the early 1970s it was clear that Madison's growth was not following the pattern planners had expected, so the parish acquired land on Everglade Drive for a new church, which was dedicated on August 13, 1976, with Fr. John Flanagan (pastor 1972-1985) both blessing the cornerstone and mortaring it into place.



Fr. Flanagan was succeeded as pastor by Fr. Donald J. Murray (pastor 1985–2001). The parish experienced robust participation in religious education and sacramental preparation, and parishioners enjoyed a variety of activities, such as the 1988 Outdoor Mass and Summer Festival pictured above.



From 2006 to 2013, Msgr. Donald J. Heiar, Jr. was pastor. In 2008 we celebrated the Golden Jubilee of our founding with Bishop Robert C. Morlino presiding at our Jubilee Mass.

Msgr. Heiar also became a chaplain with the Wisconsin Air National Guard and served two deployments in South Asia.



The parish continued its long-standing support for San Rafael Parish in Waspam, Nicaragua. In 2009 San Rafael gave us this plaque to commemorate our decades of friendship.

In 2013 Fr. Bart Timmerman became pastor. In the last 5 years, our parish ministry has become more multi-cultural with a growing Hispanic community and the addition of our Nigerian seminarian, Lawrence Oparaji, who was ordained a deacon this past May 25.

## Living with the Saints - June

**1** St. Justyn Martyr (c. 100-165) was born into a pagan family and converted to Christianity as an adult. He was one of the first apologists-- one who makes a case for the faith with nonbelievers. Find time today to read his description of the Mass written in the year 155 (quoted in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1345).

**6** St. Norbert (c. 1080-1134) was a German bishop who founded an order called the Norbertines, which is still active in the world (and our state) today. He is the patron saint of a safe childbirth. Pray for the safety of babies who will be born this day and for respect for all children in the womb.

**8 & 9** The celebrations of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary always take place on the Friday and Saturday following the Sunday commemoration of the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus' heart was overflowing with love and the Blessed Mother's heart was broken but remained faithful. Look into your own heart today, considering whether or not it is filled with love for God and one another.

**11** St. Barnabas, while not among the Twelve Apostles, still bears the title of Apostle. He is mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles and was commissioned by the Twelve to travel to Antioch (Acts 11:20-22). He recruited St. Paul to assist him (11:25-26). His name means "son of encouragement." Who can you encourage in the faith today?

**13** St. Anthony of Padua (1195-1231) is one of the busiest saints in his role as the patron of lost objects! He was a great teacher and preacher and for this reason is another Doctor of the Church. Today, ask St. Anthony's intercession for lost people (especially missing children) and lost souls.

### Get Involved in Music Ministry

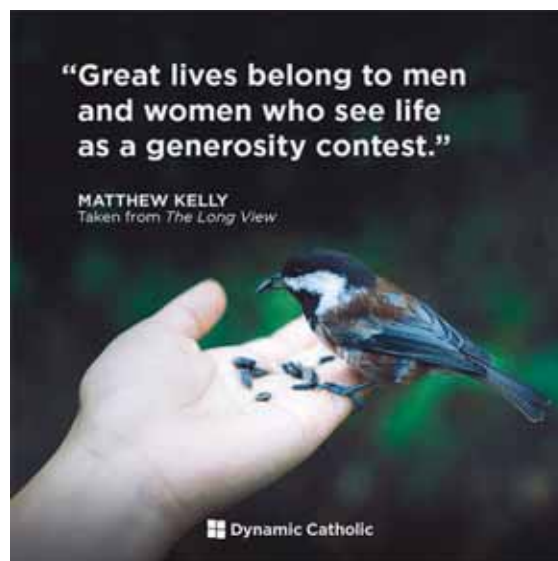
Do you like music? Do you love to sing? Are you committed to being a disciple of Jesus? Do you want to grow in your faith? Would you like to help our assembly to pray well? These are all important questions as we continue to grow our music ministry and encourage our parishioners to pray well.

You do not need to be a trained musician to join our music ministry. Rather, you should have a heart for prayer, worship, and the Mass, and of course, you should enjoy music and singing! We work hard and we strive for excellence, always giving to God the very best that we are able to offer. Students and adults are welcome to join us! No experience is necessary and training is provided.

There are opportunities for our parishioners to become active in our music ministry in the following areas: Cantor/Small Ensemble, Psalmist, STA Parish Choir, STA Choristers, STA Spanish Choir, Instrumentalist, or Accompanist.

Our formal choirs are off for the summer months but will begin rehearsals again in September. The Parish Choir sings weekly during the school year at the 10:00 AM Mass in addition to our evening Holy Day Masses. Our Choristers rehearse on Wednesdays during the school year and sing on Saturdays at 4:30 PM or Sundays at 10:00 AM. This is open to students in grades 4 and up! Adults and students are also encouraged to join our small groups, which sing at our Masses throughout the year, primarily on Saturdays at 4:30 PM and Sundays at 8:00 AM, but also during the summer months at 10:00 AM. Our STA Spanish Choir rehearses on Sundays at 5:00 PM and sings weekly for the 6:30 PM Spanish Mass. There are other opportunities to become involved as well, based upon age and ability.
