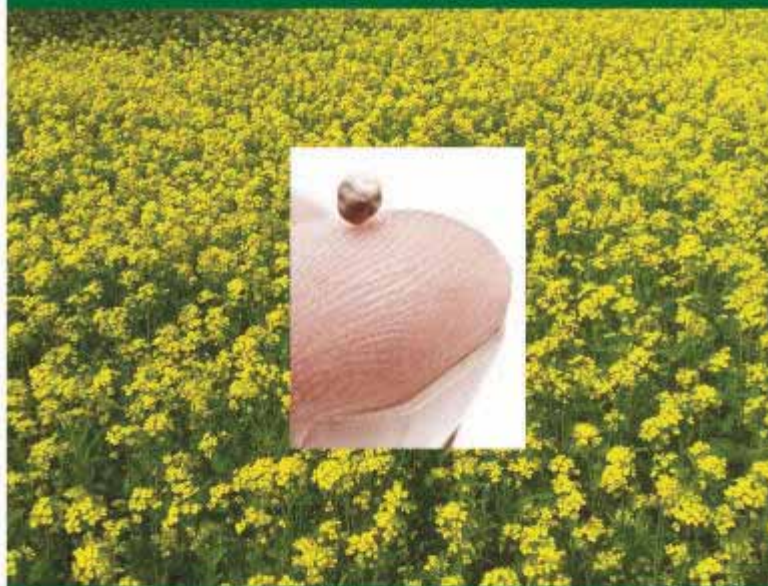

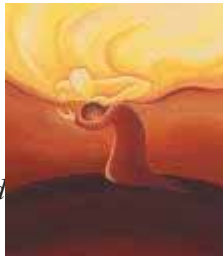

Communal Anointing of the Sick

Saturday, June 30 at 4:30 PM

Sunday, July 1 at 8:00 AM

"Is anyone sick among you? Let them bring in the priests of the church, and let them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith shall save the sick persons (James 5:14-15)."



During Masses on Saturday June 30 at 4:30 PM and Sunday July 1 at 8:00 AM we will celebrate a Communal Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This sacrament is not just for those who are at the point of death. It is a sacrament of the *sick*. This Sacrament of Healing can be received by those whose health is compromised through either sickness or old age. Here are some guidelines to consider for participating in this Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:

- "As soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for that person to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived (Vatican II, *Sacrosanctum Concilium* 73)."
- "The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is given to those who are seriously ill (Paul VI, Apostolic Constitution *Sacram Unctione Infirmorum*, 30 Nov 1972)."
- "The anointing of the sick can be administered to any member of the faithful who, having reached the use of reason, begins to be in danger of death by reason of illness or old age (Canon 1004.1)."
- "Great care and concern should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive this sacrament. A prudent or reasonably sure judgment, without scruple, is sufficient for deciding on the seriousness of an illness; if necessary a doctor may be consulted (General Introduction to the *Roman Ritual, Pastoral Care of the Sick: Rites of Anointing and Viaticum*, par. 8)."
- "It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation (CCC 1515)."
- It must be noted that certain severe forms of mental illness, which seriously impair health so as to potentially lead to death, are also cause for the administration of Anointing.

Two priests, in addition to myself, will be here to help with the Anointing of the Sick. Please consider bringing family members or neighbors who may be homebound to receive this Sacrament of healing.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is *not* the "Last Rites." The "Last Rites" are prayed with people who are dying or near death and usually include the "Apostolic Pardon," for the forgiveness of sins and "Viaticum" or Last Eucharist. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the

Reflection from Our Seminarian, Deacon Lawrence Oparaji

Today as a gift to our beloved fathers, I want to introduce every father to a man, St. Joseph, the foster father of Jesus. In my reflection I found two aspects of St. Joseph's life interesting, and I want to share them with you.



The first is that St. Joseph was a man for others. Though the Scriptures say very little about Joseph, even that absence speaks volumes. Why? Because to Joseph, he was not the one who was important, others were. He loved Mary above himself, and his behavior was just a result of his love. He gave Jesus the greatest gift a man can give to a child, which is to let them know and see that he loves their mother. He was prepared to do the right thing when she was found to be with child. He could have chosen otherwise. Real fathers live their lives for their families; they support their wives and children in every godly and manly way possible. They lay down their lives to give life to their family.

The second is that St. Joseph was a man of faith and courage. Along with loving his wife, Mary, he loved his God courageously. He had a close, intimate personal relationship with God. He listened to the voice of God and constantly gave his yes to God's divine plan for him. Fathers are called to be spiritual leaders of their homes. They are called to have a deep and close relationship with God, and to share their faith with the family. As you cannot give what you do not have, so also are you unable to share Christ with others if you do not have a personal relationship with Him. One major study found that children raised in households where fathers are not active in the faith have about a 3 percent chance of being faithful to their faith as adults. Fathers also need to guard and protect their homes. In our day and age this is not an easy task.

There are many challenges, but I strongly believe in the graces that flow from the altar of the Eucharist, and I strongly believe that God who called you men of this day and age to fatherhood will see you all through it. Have faith, stand firm, and trust in the Lord.

Lightning Update

We are still working on some repairs needed as a result of the May 9 lightning strike. Specific to the music ministry at STA, the main mixing board of the sound system has been replaced, as well as another one of the main processors for sound in the chapel, gathering area, and social hall. Because of this, we still have to fine tune a number of things. Some of you have shared issues with us, so please know that we are working to address them. The organ still has repair work to be completed, hopefully in the next couple of weeks. Also, you will notice that the video feed from the church into the gathering area and chapel is still not working. This repair will take some time to finish, as the entire video system was damaged and must be replaced. I will keep you updated as we find out more. Thanks to all of you for your patience and understanding.

Each year, people come forward and ask about joining the Catholic Church and/or being baptized. Others who are Catholic but not Confirmed decide that now is the time. If you are considering becoming Catholic or want to complete your sacraments of initiation, you are invited to participate in our parish RCIA program. Last year there was 1 active parish priest for every 1,484 registered Catholics in our Diocese, and that is not the whole story. Catholics not registered in a parish may also need a priest when in a life-threatening situation or approaching death. Our priests are spread very thin, and we need more priests to adequately serve everyone. Having 24 seminarians is a hopeful sign, but we still have to plan for priests retiring, getting ill, and passing away!

This is why it is so important to pray for vocations. The Traveling Chalice / Crucifix program lets your household do that. I will be sending out an email inviting people to sign up to take the chalice or crucifix for a week. If you can't participate in the program, please pray for vocations any way you can.
