Divine Renovation Conference 2018

In June I had the opportunity to attend the Divine Renovation Conference in Halifax, Nova Scotia hosted by Fr. James Mallon and Fr. Simon Lobo of St. Benedict Parish. Fr. James Mallon is the author of the book, *Divine Renovation*, a book about parish renewal and moving from a "maintenance" style parish to a "mission" style parish. We are attempting to do this with our Parish Vision to become an evangelizing parish of missionary disciples. I would like to share with you a list of ways we can create a culture of discipleship in our parish:

8 Ways for Pastors and Pastoral Leaders to Create a Culture of Discipleship

1. Cultivate a deep reliance on God in prayer – for yourself, your family, and in your parish
2. Preach disciple-making homilies
3. A culture of hospitality
4. Invest in a few disciple-makers. Jesus and Paul ask their disciples to invest in a few who will in turn invest in others – see Mt. 28:18-19 and 2 Tim 2:2
5. Make small group studies central to your disciple-making strategy
6. Raise the bar of church membership. Say no to minimalism!
7. Read disciple-making books with your leadership
8. Provide ample opportunities for encounter/conversion. The sacraments are key here!

This year we are going to focus on hospitality and forming small group studies (Numbers 3 and 5). More information will be forthcoming. In the meantime, please pray for the success of these endeavors!

Reflection from Our Seminarian, Deacon Lawrence Oparaji



Today's reading has the theme of rejection sprinkled all around them. In our first reading Ezekiel is sent to his own people and he is being warned that he will face rejection and stubbornness of heart from his own people. In the gospel Jesus faces rejection from his own people, and because of their rejection he was unable to do great things for them. But why do they reject Ezekiel and Jesus? We can give two answers to this question.

The first answer is that they reject them because they lacked faith, that is what differentiates the people of today's gospel from the woman who suffered from blood hemorrhage for thirty years in last Sunday's Gospel. While she had faith and believed in the saving power of Jesus, the people of today's gospel lacked faith and their lack of faith led them to refuse Jesus an entrance into their lives. Because Jesus was not granted entrance into their lives, he was limited in the wonderful works he could do. Christ never forces himself on us, he knocks on our doors and if we open he will come into our lives and be with us.

The second answer is that they reject Jesus because He had called them to higher and better standards and this hurt their ego so they resorted to attacking Him and His message, they resorted to being resentful.

The second answer reflects more the situation of our world today. People reject Jesus not because what He is saying is bad, but because what He is saying is true and because He calls them to a higher standard, so instead of acknowledging the truth in what Jesus has said and trying to live accordingly, they prefer to be resentful and to despise Jesus. They say to themselves: How dare He tell me how to live my life? Who does He think He is?

So today let us ask God for the gift of faith and for the grace to be able to live out our Christian vocation. Let us also pray for those who constantly reject Jesus, that they may have a deep and life-changing experience with Jesus. We ask God to grant them the kind of experience that changed St. Paul from Saul, the zealot Jew and persecutor of Christians, to Paul, the Missionary Apostle of Christ.

Missionary Disciples: Stewards of the Gospel

Pope Francis is urging Catholics across the globe to make a radical shift in their outlook on life and become "Missionary Disciples." The pontiff maintains that only by making this radical turn toward an "evangelizing" way of life can we truly experience the joy and peace of Christ Jesus.



What's "new" about a concept which has always been the core mission of the Church? We are receiving a "wake up" call from the Holy Father, reminding us of the urgent need to reach out and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. By our Baptism, we are natural evangelizers and understand the need to share our faith with others. In their pastoral letter on stewardship, the United States bishops wrote:

Every member of the Church is called to evangelize, and the practice of authentic Christian stewardship inevitably leads to evangelization. As stewards of the mysteries of God (cf. 1 Cor. 4:1), people desire to tell others about them and about the light they shed on human life, to share the graces and gifts they have received from God, especially knowledge of Christ Jesus.

Every member of the Church is called to evangelize. But how do Catholics answer that call?

First, as Catholic Christians we need to be mindful of the renewal of our own Baptismal promises at Easter and educate ourselves in our faith. We understand the need for ongoing formation and catechesis in their ever-deepening relationship with Christ.

Secondly, we must never forget the witness value of our own lives. Through our everyday actions, lived in Christ, we give the world the clearest sign of God's presence among us and within the Church.

Third, inspired by the Holy Spirit, we must proclaim the Good News in words. In his 1975 pastoral letter, *On Evangelization in the Modern World* (*Evangelii Nuntiandi*), Pope Paul VI stressed the importance of not only living in Christ, but SPEAKING about our life in Christ with others. We must summon the courage to invite others to join us in our relationship with Christ. This includes other Catholics, and those who no longer practice their Catholic faith.

Fourth, we must be willing to dialogue in a spirit of love and respect. We must listen with tolerance to others' disbelief, doubts, pain and suffering. Our sharing of the Gospel should not be demanding or coercive. The sole desire of authentic evangelizers is to bestow freely with patience and love what they themselves have freely received.

Just before he ascended into heaven, Jesus gave this mandate: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). Evangelization is not an option. It is part of our Baptismal commitment and it goes to the very heart of our faith. Exercising good stewardship of the Gospel implies the willingness to share it with others.

SVdP Report on Activities Completed

In the first half of 2018 the St. Thomas Aquinas conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society has completed:

- Visited the homes of 42 families.
- Met with 8 homeless families.
- Made utility or rent payments on behalf of 24 families.
- Provided security deposits for 4 homeless families.
- Responded to 220 phone calls from individuals seeking assistance.
- Collaborated with 7 other conferences to assist 15 families who had contacted us.
- We spent \$10,600 in assisting needy families
- SVDP District Council spent an additional \$4,470.13.

We want to thank the Human Concerns Funding Board and parishioners who have contributed money to make our ministry possible. Special thanks to Deacon Lawrence for joining us on home visits.
