## From the Desk of Fr. Bart

### Fifteenth Week of Ordinary Time

Hospitality is a major theme in this Sunday's Gospel. In Jesus' time, in the Middle Eastern world, hospitality is a value extended exclusively to strangers. (Relatives and friends are extended steadfast loving kindness.)

The process involved three steps: The stranger is taken under the protection of a host for a given time, transformed into a temporary guest, with hopes that the two will part friends. The host provides lodging, food, and especially a safe haven or protection from the suspicions and possible attacks of villagers. Failure to extend hospitality in the Middle East is a serious breach of honor.

One of the major areas of our parish renewal that we will focus on this upcoming program year is hospitality. I want us to presume that at every Mass, we will have people joining us who are new to our community, or are coming to Mass for the very first time and are seeking a deeper relationship with Jesus. The culture of hospitality is dependent on each and every one of us who make up our STA parish family. We cannot leave hospitality up to our dedicated Hospitality Ministers and Ushers. These people are certainly on the front lines of our welcome, but to be truly hospitable, we all need to take part in welcoming visitors.

Our goal for hospitality is not to just be a friendly place. Yes, we do want to be friendly, but ultimately, we want to be a place where people encounter Jesus Christ in a life-changing way. We want to evangelize! Through our actions of hospitality and invitation, we can evangelize those who join us for Mass. These are the easiest people to evangelize really, because they are already attending Mass. It will be more of a challenge to evangelize our family and friends who do not join us for Mass.

Here are some suggestions for us to help us create a culture of hospitality:

- SMILE and greet others. If Jesus is in your heart, please notify your face! Pope Francis tells us that an evangelizer should never look like he or she is coming back from a funeral.
- Introduce yourself and offer to answer any questions others might have.
- Pray for the people around you at Mass.
- Imagine you are a stranger at another parish, how would you like to be greeted/assisted?
- The Church exists for the marginalized. We are called to be fishers of people. We should not only reach out and greet those that are like us, but we must also reach out to those who are different from us, broken, and/or differently abled.

Keep in mind that our ultimate goal of hospitality is to welcome guests so well that they themselves decide to join the parish and help welcome other guests. I am excited to work together with all of you to create an amazing culture of hospitality here at STA!

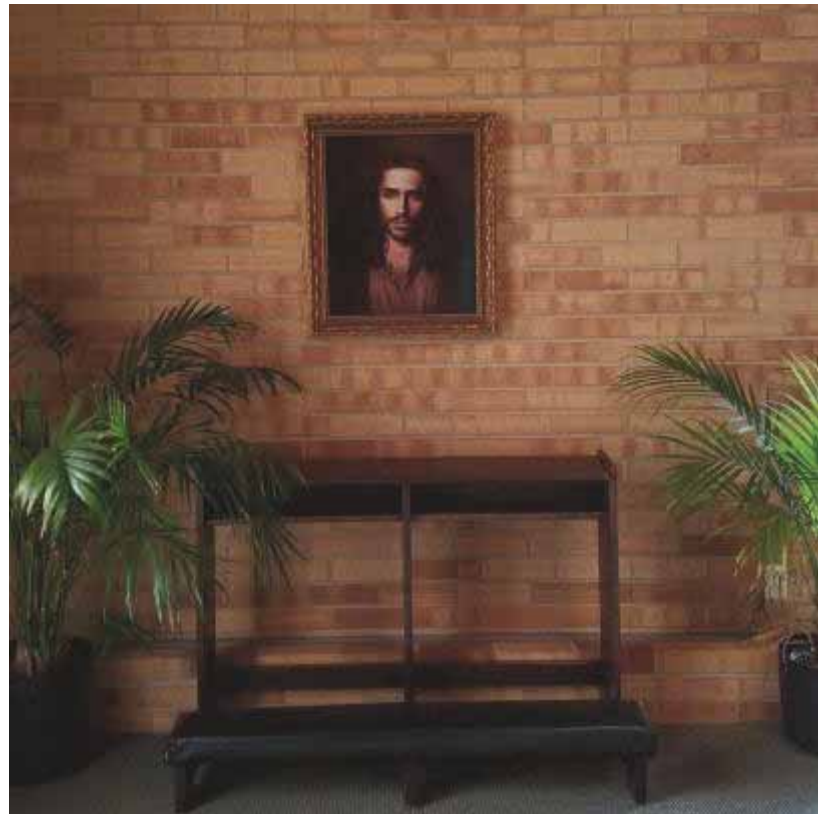
Parrish states that "God told me that it is through the eyes of My Son that you will also find Me. You will know the eyes of My Son when you see them and all will come together."

## Discipleship with Holly Irving



### The Spirituality of Stewardship:

#### A Process of Conversion

Recently, I have found myself in conversation with leaders who truly grasp the responsibility of leading others to embrace stewardship as a deeply spiritual way of life. As one noted, “It is one thing to take the call to live and grow as a steward to heart in my own life. It is quite something else to lead others to put stewardship into practice.” This is true in our own lives, and in the life of our parish or diocese and involves four inter-related steps (see United States bishops’ pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple’s Response* USCCB Publishing, Washington, D.C. quotations are cited in the tenth anniversary edition, 2002:

1. **Commitment.** Living as disciples requires us to make a “conscious, firm decision, carried out in action, to be followers of Jesus Christ no matter the cost to themselves.” As stewardship leaders, we grow in our own commitment to Christ and invite others to do so as well. Our commitment as Christians becomes the vision and purpose for our lives.
2. **Call.** Disciples answer the call of the Lord in their daily lives. Jesus does not only call once, but over and over, throughout the course of our lives. This truly is life-changing! When people grasp that they are called to carry out Christ’s mission in the world, their lives take on new and greater meaning.
3. **Discernment.** Discernment is more than simply deciding to do something. It is a process of prayerfully aligning our heart and life with God, recognizing our many blessings, and responding out of gratitude by sharing the gifts that have been entrusted to us. Discernment is sometimes a straight-forward process of doing what we know is right, but often needs and benefits from the companionship of others, as we listen for and respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.
4. **Action.** It is not enough to know ourselves as Christ’s people and to become attentive to the Lord’s call. “This commitment is expressed not in a single action, nor even in a number of actions over a period of time, but in an entire way of life...”

This conversion process is about having a vision of ourselves and our faith communities as disciples and stewards firmly in mind and moving more toward the vision every step of the way.

## Volunteers Needed: Answer Pregnancy Helpline Calls from Home!

Phone volunteers are greatly needed. The goal of a phone volunteer is to help the caller determine the kind of assistance she or he needs and to facilitate the next step. Phone volunteers provide compassion, active listening, and connect the caller with community resources. All calls are confidential, and the volunteer's contact information remains private as well. You can choose the monthly shifts that work in your schedule. All training is provided, including monthly meetings for ongoing education and support. The minimum commitment is 4 hours a month.

Bilingual volunteers also needed for our Spanish-speaking Team. It can be intimidating to think of counseling a woman out of an abortion, but Pregnancy Helpline doesn't see a large number of those types of calls. Most of the calls are from women who already intend to keep their baby but just need resources.
