



Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Desk of Fr. Bart

Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time and the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene

Today is the Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time and it is also July 22, the Feast Day of St. Mary Magdalene. Recognizing St. Mary Magdalene's role as the first to



In an article for the Vatican newspaper, Archbishop Arthur Roche, secretary of the Congregation for Divine Worship, wrote that in celebrating "an evangelist who proclaims the central joyous message of Easter," St. Mary Magdalene's feast day is a call for all Christians to "reflect more deeply on the dignity of women, the new evangelization and the greatness of the mystery of divine mercy." He continued to explain that, "Pope Francis has taken this decision precisely in the context of the Jubilee of Mercy to highlight the relevance of this woman who showed great love for Christ and was much loved by Christ."

While most liturgical celebrations of individual saints during the year are known formally as memorials, those classified as feasts are reserved for important events in Christian history and for saints of particular significance, such as the Twelve Apostles.

In his apostolic letter "Dies Domini" ("The Lord's Day"), St. John Paul II explained that the "commemoration of the saints does not obscure the centrality of Christ, but on the contrary extols it, demonstrating as it does the power of the redemption wrought by him."

Preaching about St. Mary Magdalene, Pope Francis highlighted Christ's mercy toward a woman who was "exploited and despised by those who believed they were righteous," but she was loved and forgiven by Jesus. Her tears at Christ's empty tomb are a reminder that "sometimes in our lives, tears are the lenses we need to see Jesus," the Pope said April 2, 2013, during Mass in his residence, the Domus Sanctae Marthae.

If you recall, Pope Francis also mentioned her specifically in the prayer he composed for the Year of Mercy: "Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured paradise to the repentant thief."

Emeritus Pope Benedict XVI explained in his Angelus Address on Sunday July 23, 2006: "St. Luke lists her among the women who followed Jesus after being 'healed of evil spirits and infirmities,' explaining that 'seven demons had gone out' from her (*Lk* 8:2). Magdalene would be present beneath the Cross with the Mother of Jesus and other women. In the early morning on the first day after the Sabbath she was to be the one to discover the empty tomb, beside which she stood weeping until the Risen Jesus appeared to her (cf. *Jn* 20:11). The story of Mary of Magdala reminds us all of a fundamental truth: a disciple of Christ is one who, in the experience of human weakness, has had the humility to ask for his help, has been healed by him and has set out following closely after him, becoming a witness of the power of his merciful love that is stronger than sin and death."

Archbishop Roche explained that in giving St. Mary Magdalene the honor of being the first person to see the empty tomb and the first to **Prayer for Life**



Reflection from Seminarian, Michael Wanta

Wow, has time flown by! I finished up my exams around the 18th of June. In Italy, the exam period can last up to about a month since most of the finals are oral examinations and the professor offers to hear exams on a few different days. This time round it took

me nearly three weeks. It is quite a different experience to the normal finals' week in America, it still has some of the stress but allows for a slower pace and much more time for study.

My dad and brother arrived the day after I finished exams. It was great to see family after a year abroad. It was great to share a little bit of my life here in Rome with them as we toured the Roman Forum, walked from church to church, visited the underground tomb of St. Peter, and watched the sun set over St. Peter's from the seminary. We stayed close to St. Peter's basilica and it was a blessing to go there for morning Mass; it was our giant, local parish church!

And now, as I write, I find myself in the North Italian city of Bologna staying with some religious brothers of the Community of St. John as I attend language school to brush up on my Italian to help with my theological studies. It has been a full immersion experience as I am even using Italian prayer books!

Next, I head back to Rome to welcome and orient the new seminarians who will be arriving from the States. I will help show them around the seminary and Rome for about a week before they head off to language school and I go to the northern mountains of Italy to help out in a parish and plunge into the culture and language.

listen to the truth of the resurrection, "Jesus has a special consideration and mercy for this woman, who manifests her love for him, looking for him in the garden with anguish and suffering." Drawing a comparison between Eve, who "spread death where there was life," and St. Mary Magdalene, who "proclaimed life from the tomb, a place of death," the archbishop said her feast day is a lesson for all Christians to trust in Christ who is "alive and risen!" He concludes, "It is right that the liturgical celebration of this woman has the same level of feast given to the celebration of the Apostles in the General Roman Calendar and highlights the special mission of this woman who is an example and model for every woman in the church."

Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness Week July 22-28:

Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness Week is a national educational campaign. The NFP Program of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops develops a poster each year (see the cover of today's bulletin) with basic supportive materials. It is the individual dioceses however, that offer a variety of educational formats in the local church to focus attention on NFP methods and Church teachings which support their use in marriage. At St. Thomas Aquinas, engaged couples are introduced to NFP during our Marriage Preparation Program.

As a parish family we encourage our families who are practicing NFP and thank them for their faithful witness to the teachings of the Church in their marriages. NFP calls for sacrifice and communication between married couples. We celebrate NFP Sunday with you and pray for the grace to live as faithful disciples of the Lord Jesus. For those couples who do not practice NFP, we encourage you to become educated about this method and prayerfully consider practicing this method that our Church promotes.

The Church teaches that the sacrament of marriage symbolizes Christ's relationship with His Church. What is this relationship, but one of total, faithful, permanent, and fruitful love!

When couples live their vocation according to Church teachings, especially with regard to the transmission of life, many benefits can be reaped. Indeed, married couples who use NFP report that among these benefits is their mutual growth in holiness and consequent deepening of their respect and awe of God's gifts of human sexuality, marriage and family. These are gifts that call for praise!

The dates of Natural Family Planning Awareness Week highlight the anniversary of the papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae* (July 25) which articulates Catholic beliefs about human sexuality, conjugal love and responsible parenthood. This year is the special 50th Anniversary of the encyclical. The dates also mark the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne (July 26), the parents of the Blessed Mother. Volunteers Needed: Answer Pregnancy Helpline Calls from Home!

Phone volunteers are greatly needed. The goal of a phone volunteer is to help the caller determine the kind of assistance she or he needs and to facilitate the next step. Phone volunteers provide compassion, active listening, and connect the caller with community resources. All calls are confidential, and the volunteer's contact information remains private as well. You can choose the monthly shifts that work in your schedule. All training is provided, including monthly meetings for ongoing education and support. The minimum commitment is 4 hours a month.

Bilingual volunteers also needed for our Spanish-speaking Team. It can be intimidating to think of counseling a woman out of an abortion, but Pregnancy Helpline doesn't see a large number of those types of calls. Most of the calls are from women who already intend to keep their baby but just need resources.
