## From the Desk of Fr. Bart

### Eighteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

As you know, our Readings for Sunday Mass are on a three-year cycle. We are now in Year B. Year B focuses on the Gospel of Mark, except for beginning today, these five Sundays of Ordinary Time, we will be hearing from the Gospel of John. Specifically, we will be reflecting on John, chapter 6, the “Bread of Life Discourse” of Jesus. We see in this chapter in John’s Gospel a development of the theology of the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Jesus’ feeding of the multitude with scraps of bread and fish is the only miracle recorded in all four Gospels. This event was cherished by the first Christians for whom the Eucharist was becoming the center of their life together. Jesus’ actions are indeed “Eucharistic:” Bread (and fish) is collected, Jesus gives thanks (the word used in the Greek text of Mark’s Gospel is *eucharisteo*) and breaks the bread, and the community feasts.

The Gospel readings over the next few Sundays will invite us to consider the deeper meaning of the Eucharist: Christ, the Bread of Life, present to us in this Sacrament that is given to us in order that we might become sacrament for one another.

### Summer Vacations

Thank you to Fr. Steve Kortendick for his willingness to help us by presiding at our weekend Masses while I am away this weekend. Fr. Steve is the full-time chaplain at the UW Hospital and lives on the other side of our duplex home, here on our campus.

Our upcoming Baptism Prep sessions are scheduled for Saturday, August 11 at 10:30 AM and Saturday, September 8 at 10:30 AM. ## Reflection from Deacon Lawrence Oparaji



Life is all about sharing, and sharing is fundamental to life. Without sharing, life would be redundant, boring and difficult. Imagine if the sun refuses to share its light which is very important to humans, plants and animals. Imagine if the air we breathe freezes! Imagine if all the oceans, rivers, lakes, and streams just dry up! Imagine if the earth refuses to allow the germination of crops and plants! Imagine if God withdraws His favors, mercy, love, and even His image and likeness from us! The best thing to do is not to imagine any of the above because that would be very detrimental to us. However, they all tell us that sharing is really indispensable in life.

Today our Lord Jesus Christ is presented to us as a sharer. Sharing summarizes why He came into our world. He came to share not only the Word of God with us, but also His total self: body, blood, soul and divinity. He feeds the body and soul, He takes care of both material and spiritual needs.

Sharing is an expression of Love. When we hear that we are created in the image and likeness of God, we are simply being told that God gave us a share of His being. When we hear that God loved the world so much that He gave His Son for our salvation, we are being told that God shared that which is so precious to Him with us. The kingdom of God is God's kingdom but He wants to share with us, so long as we do His loving will. Jesus shared the word of God, He shared bread and finally shared His life so that we can live not just now but forever. If Jesus Christ is a sharer of the things listed above and we are His followers, it follows then that we should be sharers of His Word, sharers of His life, sharers of our blessings and material possessions.

Today let us reflect on how best we can share our blessings, especially the blessing of knowing Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. Let us also reflect on how we can share God's material blessings to us with those who are in need and suffer from material poverty.

## Hospitality is a Virtue that is Essential for Disciples of Jesus!

Hospitality is a common and recurring theme throughout the Bible. In the New Testament alone, hospitality is given as an essential characteristic of a mature and practicing Christian.

Here are just a few of the many places hospitality appears in Sacred Scripture:

- Romans 12:13: Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.
- Hebrews 13:2: Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it.
- Titus 1:8: ...but he must be hospitable, a lover of goodness, prudent, upright, devout, and self-controlled.
- 1 Timothy 3:2: Now a bishop must be above reproach, married only once, temperate, sensible, respectable, hospitable, an apt teacher . . .

In fact, hospitality is such serious business for the Church that the Council of Trent laid it out as a duty that,

“all who hold any ecclesiastical benefices, whether secular or regular, to accustom themselves, as far as their revenues will allow, to exercise with alacrity and kindness the office of hospitality, so frequently commended by the holy Fathers; being mindful that those who cherish hospitality receive Christ in the person of their guests.”

Hospitality is not only a Christian duty, but an easy and practical way to extend to others the love of Christ – and it has a huge and lasting impact for those on the receiving end. We are focusing on becoming more hospitable here at STA and all of us have a role to play in welcoming and receiving.

## Service as a Catalyst for Missionary Discipleship

The Corporal Works of Mercy play an important part in discipleship. When acts of service are planned to intentionally proclaim the Gospel and treat all people as if they were Jesus in disguise (see Matthew 25:34–40), they are a catalyst for initial and ongoing conversion.

In her wisdom, the Church outlines a systematic and comprehensive process of evangelization and faith formation that nurtures conversion. This process of evangelization includes the following five stages.

1. Pre-evangelization
2. Initial proclamation of the Gospel
3. Initiatory catechesis
4. Mystagogical or post-baptismal catechesis
5. Continuing or perfecting catechesis

When I outlined these stages during a catechist in-service, one of the catechists approached me afterward. She said that she finally understood why her daughter would never read the life-changing book that she had given her or watch the eight-session DVD series that she herself found so interesting. She presumed that her daughter was at the stage of initial catechesis when she was still at the pre-evangelization stage. Now that she knew better, she would do better. She said that she would adapt to where her daughter was in her journey and spend more time listening and walking with her rather than trying to teach her. Rather than formal catechesis, I suggested that her daughter might be better served in her faith journey by serving others. Months later, this catechist shared with me that serving others had transformed her daughter and helped her to become more disposed to hearing the message of the Gospel and applying it in her own life.

Service work provides an important bridge in the conversion process as we carry out the work of evangelization. It is a particularly effective strategy in helping those in the pre-evangelization stage of discipleship become more active in their faith journey. Within the evangelization process, pre-evangelization is the most passive stage in terms of connection to any kind of formal religious affiliation. Those in this stage

tend to have some link with the Catholic Church but are not actively practicing their faith. Many faith formation parents, for example, are in this stage of pre-evangelization. They have a connection to Catholicism but have not consciously decided to follow Christ and go deeper.

The pre-evangelization stage builds upon basic human desires for security, love, friendship, and acceptance—desires that ultimately find their fulfillment in God. Fundamental questions of life are explored: *Why do I exist? Where does everything come from? Why is the world the way it is? What is my purpose in this world?* Friendship, witness of life, and listening are appropriate pastoral methods to apply here, and this is why service is so important. Not only does it build up the Kingdom one member at a time, but those who serve others in a tangible and real way become the hands and feet of Jesus.

Young people are attracted to a Church that seeks to make a difference rather than one that exists solely within the walls of the parish, as Pope Francis reminds us: “I prefer a Church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a Church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security.” (*Joy of the Gospel*, #49) In our faith formation classes, we can model what it means to live as a disciple, and that involves serving others, for it is in the grit of life that we see grace. It is in weakness that real strength is revealed. It is in serving others that we become more fully alive.

How might you incorporate service opportunities into your home or classroom as a way to help those in a pre-evangelization stage of faith?

## Volunteers Needed: Answer Pregnancy Helpline Calls from Home!

Phone volunteers are greatly needed. The goal of a phone volunteer is to help the caller determine the kind of assistance she or he needs and to facilitate the next step. Phone volunteers provide compassion, active listening, and connect the caller with community resources. All calls are confidential, and the volunteer's contact information remains private as well. You can choose the monthly shifts that work in your schedule. All training is provided, including monthly meetings for ongoing education and support. The minimum commitment is 4 hours a month.

Bilingual volunteers also needed for our Spanish-speaking Team. It can be intimidating to think of counseling a woman out of an abortion, but Pregnancy Helpline doesn't see a large number of those types of calls. Most of the calls are from women who already intend to keep their baby but just need resources.
