Local Flood Relief

Thank you for your generous response to our Flood Relief Collection. To date, a total of \$48,284.31 has been collected via the voluntary special parish collection, \$7,154.50 from our parish alone. Pet Blessing on Thursday, October 4, at 5:30 PM

In honor of St. Francis of Assisi's Feast Day (October 4), we will have a special blessing for our pets in the courtyard in front of the Education Wing, by the parking lot. Saint Francis of Assisi was an Italian Catholic friar and preacher. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor (Franciscans), the women's Order of St. Clare, and the Third Order of Saint Francis. Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in history. In 1224, he received the stigmata, making him the first recorded person to bear the wounds of Christ's Passion. He died during the evening hours of October 3, 1226, while listening to a reading he had requested of Psalm 142. On July 16, 1228, he was proclaimed a saint by Pope Gregory IX. He is known as the patron saint of animals and the environment, and is one of the two patron saints of Italy (with Catherine of Siena). It is customary for Catholic churches to hold ceremonies blessing animals on his feast day. He is also known for his love of the Eucharist, his sorrow during the Stations of the Cross, and for the creation of the Christmas crèche or Nativity Scene.

Mass Intention Scheduling for 2019



Mass Intentions for 2019 will be scheduled starting **Monday, October 1**. **Each registered household may schedule 3 Masses in 2019 for existing intentions.** You can schedule Masses by phone, email, or in person at the parish office by the Gathering Area. The stipend is \$10 per Mass, payable in cash or by check payable to St. Thomas Aquinas.

Because so many people can only attend Mass on the weekend, **each registered household is limited to one Mass on a weekend (Saturday or Sunday)** so that these available to as many families as possible. This limit does not apply to new needs that arise during the year.

Other guidelines:

- One Mass each week will be left unscheduled until the preceding week to handle last-minute parish needs.
- Canon law requires us to offer one Mass each Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation for St. Thomas Aquinas Parishioners. These are **not** unscheduled Masses.

People who are not registered with the parish may request one Mass Intention starting January 1, 2019, subject to the availability of unscheduled dates.

Reflection from Deacon Lawrence Oparaji



As Catholics we are called to be in communion with Christ and with one another especially when gathered around the altar for the Eucharistic feast. But one thing can destroy this community building and this is jealousy, when we are not thankful for the many gifts God has freely chosen to bestow on others. We see this playing out in our first reading and Gospel today. We see men outside the “camp and the group of disciples” prophesying and preaching in the power of the Holy Spirit; and also casting out devils in the name of Jesus respectively. We see the zealous and envious disciples getting afraid and worried. Being afraid for their own positions and the authority of their master, they made efforts to stop them from participating in the ministry and mission of God, out of jealousy and envy.

Some people describe jealousy as love in competition. We all have a feelings of jealousy. This can be healthy or unhealthy. It is healthy when we are conscious of it and still retain good will towards the person or group we feel jealous about. For example, God’s jealousy is positive, because he wants the best for us and does not want us to worship other gods that cannot save us. Unhealthy jealousy, on the other hand leads to destructive rivalry and to envy. It is unhealthy rivalry that St. James refers to as bitter jealousy. St. James adds: “For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice.” This is what led Cain to kill his brother Abel. There are many ways of addressing the jealousy that is in each of us. One of the most effective ways is to accept it as natural and another way is to learn to praise and acknowledge the success of other people, and be happy for them.

So today Christ is calling each and every one of us to let go of the spirit of envy and jealousy and to invite a spirit of tolerance and a spirit of joy, joy in knowing that every gift comes from God and it has been given to us to build up one another and to build up God’s kingdom here on earth.

office workroom and first floor conference room, and purchased a new lawn mower. This week we will start installing new lighting in the Church and Prayer Chapel. The total cost of the project will be \$190,000. This will require all the remaining over-goal sharing funds that we forecast receiving if all the pledges are fulfilled. The project includes:

- A complete rewiring of the entire ceiling of the church and new wires to all the lights. This is the majority of the cost, and is necessary to power commercial LED fixtures, which will replace every light in the Church and Prayer Chapel. The new LED fixtures carry a lifetime warranty, are brighter, cost much less to operate, and allow us to adjust and dim the lights for the time of year, type of service, etc. In addition, the angle of the lights will be adjustable so they can give light from an optimal angle.
- A new catwalk to reach all the lights from the attic, making maintenance easier and safer.
- More lights: hanging light fixtures in the main body of the Church for improved fill-lighting, especially by the staircases and balcony seats; adjustable halogen lighting fixtures to illuminate the Sanctuary Platform and highlight the Ambo, Altar, Tabernacle, and Presider’s Chair for easier reading and better focus on the action of the liturgy; dedicated lights for each of the Stations of the Cross so that we can see and pray better with these beautiful images; decorative up-lighting by the wooden beams in the Sanctuary; additional lighting in the choir area to help them perform their ministry safely and see their music well.
- Multiple control panels to let us turn lights off and on and adjust them more easily. The control system will be fully digital, so it can be updated easily and will last for many years to come.

There will be some disruption for the next few weeks while the project is underway. On weekdays we will celebrate daily Mass in the Social Hall. Thankfully, we will still be able to worship in the Church on weekends. Before the dimmers are installed, we will have one weekend where the new lights will be on full strength, and it will be VERY bright in the church. However, this is necessary so that we can complete the project in a timely fashion. The lights will never need to be at full brightness after installation is complete, which will extend the life of the fixtures and save operational costs. By the following weekend, the dimmers will be fully operational and we will have a completed project with excellent lighting in the Church and Prayer Chapel.

I apologize for the inconvenience this project causes us as we come together for worship. I believe that the new lighting system will be a great benefit to all of us for decades to come!
