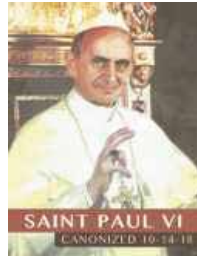
I am taking the opportunity while Fr. Pascual is here, to spend time with family and friends. I will return on Wednesday, October 17.

Canonizations Today in Rome!

Pope Francis will canonize two new saints this Sunday at the close of a meeting of the Synod of Bishops at the Vatican. Here is a short background on our two new saints!

Pope St. Paul VI

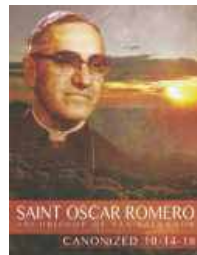
Born Giovanni Montini in 1897 in the town of Concesio, Italy, the future Pope Paul VI was ordained a priest at the age of 22. He served as archbishop of Milan before his election as Bishop of Rome in 1963. As pope, he oversaw much of the Second Vatican Council, which had been opened by Pope St. John XXIII, and in 1969, he promulgated a new Roman Missal. He died in 1978 and was beatified by Pope Francis Oct. 19, 2014. Pope Francis himself unofficially confirmed the news of Paul VI's canonization during his annual meeting with the priests of Rome Feb. 17. Apart from his role in the Council, Paul VI is most widely known for his landmark encyclical *Humanae Vitae*, which was published in 1968 and reaffirmed the Church's teaching against contraception in wake of the sexual revolution. This year marks the 50th anniversary of the historic encyclical.



Both miracles attributed to Paul VI's intercession involve the healing of an unborn child. I would encourage us to pray for St. Paul VI's intercession for healing, especially for unborn children and mothers who are experiencing health problems and worrisome pregnancies.

St. Oscar Romero

Oscar Romero, who was beatified by Pope Francis May 23, 2015, in El Salvador, was the archbishop of the nation's capital city of San Salvador. He was shot while celebrating Mass March 24, 1980, during the birth of a civil war between leftist guerrilla forces and the dictatorial government of the right.



An outspoken critic of the violence and injustices being committed at the time, Archbishop Romero was declared a martyr killed in hatred of the faith due to his vocal defense of human rights.

The Vatican-approved miracle that was performed through his intercession happened to a 35 year old woman who was diagnosed with HELLP syndrome, a life-threatening condition that affects some pregnant

“Jesus, *looking at him, loved him* and said to him, ‘You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.’” Sometimes I am afraid to give God everything. Sometimes I am uncertain how exactly to follow him. But I am always struck by this Gospel verse which calls us to be detached from the world and what we own. Possessions are not the enemy. There is no commandment against making money. But God calls us to care also for our neighbors with what we have.

In Rome, I encounter beggars often, almost whenever I walk into the street. Some are truly poor and others are unfortunately trying to scam people. It is easy to grow cold to the confusion of this reality when you see it so often, but this verse always reopens my eyes. It reminds me that I must do something. Give food to the hungry at the cost of being scammed, or at least say a kind word, and support charities that give practical aid.

We must care for the poor, but at the root of this Gospel is God calling us to be attached to Him. Jesus saw that the young man was trying “to inherit eternal life,” and He looked at him lovingly. He knew the man’s desire for God and wanted to show him a better way to follow God: to let go of earthly attachments and to follow. We are all called to this spirit of poverty, but the command to sell all is not for everyone. Parents must support their kids and so on. But a young man or a young woman, who has no such responsibilities, has the freedom to give of themselves. Jesus calls each of us individually to a unique relationship with Him.

From what is Jesus calling you to be detached? Remember His loving gaze. He looks on you with such tenderness and wants you to know the joy of His friendship, sweeter than any earthly honey.

women and damages their liver. The woman, who was in a coma and near death, made a full recovery after her husband found a holy card of Blessed Oscar Romero in his grandmother’s Bible and prayed to him for his intercession.

Knowing that his life was in danger for speaking up for the human rights of the poor *campesinos*, Archbishop Romero said, “A martyr’s death is a grace of God that I do not believe I deserve...but if I am killed, let my blood be a seed of freedom.” Martyrs help us live, help us understand there is more joy in giving than in receiving. This is why we need to preserve their memories and the reason that we ask Father Romero to pray for us today. Please, St. Romero on your canonization day, ask Jesus for us today, from your place in heaven, to bring peace to this holy, broken, world. That the blood of all those dying these days, in our country, in Iraq and Palestine, in Israel and Syria, in Central America, and everywhere in the world, will also be seeds of freedom for future generations.

Throughout the year, our singers and choir members spend many hours in rehearsal in order to help us to pray well during our Masses. While it is the primary role of the choir to support and enhance the sung prayer of those gathered for prayer, it is also the role of the choir to provide music to help those gathered to enter more deeply into prayer.

At times, the choir performs its ministry by singing alone. They may draw on the treasury of sacred music, singing compositions by composers of various periods and in various musical styles, as well as music that expresses the faith of the various cultures that enrich the Church. Appropriate times where the choir might commonly sing alone include a prelude before Mass, the Entrance chant, the Preparation of the Gifts, during the Communion procession or after the reception of Communion, and the Recessional (Sing to the Lord, 2007).
