## From the Desk of Fr. Bart

### Twenty-ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus explains the importance of service and sacrifice in the life of a disciple. In particular, he seems to be preparing the Twelve for their leadership roles in the emerging Christian community. Jesus acknowledges that his teaching is countercultural by contrasting the dynamics within the community of disciples with that of the rulers of the Gentiles. Following Jesus' example of sacrificial love continues to be countercultural in our day as well. The Christian life does not put the self in the center, but puts the other, with his or her needs, in the center. Let us consider as we begin a new week, whose needs will I put before my own? Who am I being called to serve?

### Healing Mass with Communal Anointing of the Sick and Luncheon, Wednesday, October 24:

Each fall we celebrate a Communal Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at a weekday Mass, followed by a luncheon. This year the Mass will take place on Wednesday, at 11:00 AM. This is a great opportunity for those in need of God's healing power to receive this Sacrament during Mass. If there is someone in your family who would like to receive this sacrament, perhaps you could arrange with them to bring them to the Mass and luncheon, which follows immediately after the Mass. Please RSVP using the form on page 3. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not the "Last Rites." The "Last Rites" are the prayers we pray with people who are dying or near death and usually includes "Viaticum" or Last Eucharist. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for those who are suffering serious illness of body, mind, or spirit and need the special help of God's grace in this time of anxiety. This sacrament is a prayer for healing. Please call the Parish Office with any questions or concerns about this special Sacrament. There will be no Mass at 8:30 AM that day.

### October- Month of the Rosary

The rosary is a form of mental and vocal prayers that focus on events or "mysteries" in the lives of Jesus and Mary. By its nature the recitation of the Rosary calls for a quiet rhythm and a lingering pace, helping the individual to meditate on the mysteries of Jesus' life as seen through the eyes of Mary who was the closest to Him. In this way the unfathomable riches of these mysteries are unfolded. Please join us in praying the Rosary for Life 30 minutes prior to each weekend Mass during October and every Friday at 8:00 AM. The traditional mysteries of the Rosary are:

**Joyful Mysteries:** *Annunciation, Visitation, Nativity, Presentation, and Finding in the Temple.*

**Sorrowful Mysteries:** *Agony in the Garden, Scourging at the Pillar, Crowning of Thorns, Carrying of the Cross, and the Crucifixion.*

**Glorious Mysteries:** *Resurrection, Ascension, Descent of the Holy Spirit, Assumption, and Coronation.*

In 2002, St. Pope John Paul II, introduced five new mysteries:

**Luminous Mysteries:** *Christ's Baptism in the Jordan, the Wedding at Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom, Transfiguration, and the Institution of the Eucharist.*

### October Count

Each year in October we record the number of people at each Mass and report these data to the Diocese of Madison. This statistical information helps the diocese see trends in Mass attendance at each parish and helps with decision making and future planning. Our Director of Discipleship, Holly Irving, takes a count at every Mass throughout the year for our parish's internal records. It helps with planning purposes here at the parish level.

## Seminarian, Michael Wanta

Reading today's Gospel filled me with memories of Camp Gray, where we pride ourselves on our motto of servant leadership, since Jesus came to serve, and taught his disciples to do likewise. But today, the reading made me stop in surprise at the line I had read so many times before: "[He came] to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many." Wow! What amazing service! What could cause someone to be willing to serve to the point of death?

The answer is given by the first reading which talks about the suffering servant: The one who would be crushed, bearing the guilt of others, for the forgiveness of their sins. Jesus, "Who came that we might have life," is this suffering servant. And it reveals that the goal of Christian service is not mere satisfaction of needs, or comfort, but freedom from slavery to sin itself.

Christian service is not simply waiting tables, holding doors, writing a check, or even helping at the soup kitchen. All of these are authentic expressions of Christian service only if they are done out of love. A love which is a divine gift that we call charity: the very love with which God loves Himself, through which He created all things, and wills all things to come to perfection in Him. To love like this may seem like a difficult task, but we do it all the time, even if we do it imperfectly.

Jesus asked us to participate in this love when He said: "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). He gave us the power to love in this way when He gave us His Body and Blood in the Eucharist and then offered that same Body and Blood on the cross to the Father. He offers us this grace every day in the intimacy of our hearts and above all in the sacraments. By this love we are compelled to praise God and to draw others into a real relationship with Him.

So let us continue in this love of God. Let us pray for the salvation of all souls and seek to spread this divine charity remembering that "Love consists in this: Not that we have loved God, but that He has loved us first, and sent His Son to be the expiation for our sins" (1 John 4:10).

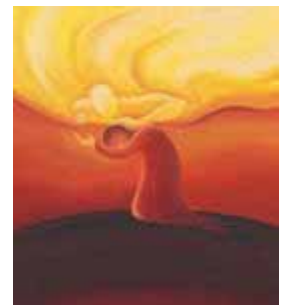
## Anointing Mass and Luncheon, October 24

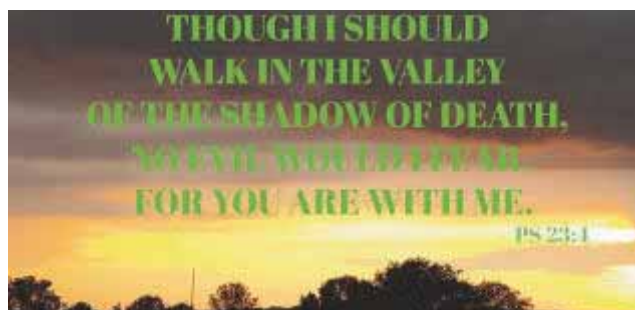
