Reflection from Deacon Lawrence Oparaji



The message we can derive from the story of today's Gospel is not limited to the generosity of this poor widow. Jesus used the story to denounce religious leaders who are constantly demanding honor and privileges and who take advantage of the poor. His praise of the widow is a radical action, which exalts the humble and humbles the exalted. By praising the widow, He was giving recognition to ordinary, simple, but dedicated people who are hardly noticed in places of worship. He offers the honor of praise to all unsung heroes of our communities and all those people of goodwill whose significant contributions attract little or no attention. Jesus mentions the virtue of the widow to demonstrate to His listeners and followers that true religion is not just external and ostentatious piety, but how much we are able to give of our resources and ourselves to God. A generous gift from the heart is the kind of offering acceptable to God. The two widows in today's readings shunned the temptation of hoarding their resources or wealth and chose to share what they had. The life of Jesus is a story of giving everything. He gave everything of Himself to us. The Letter to the Hebrews speaks of the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus who offers His own blood. He offered Himself as a lamb of sacrifice for us. He became poor so that we could be rich. The story of the two widows and the life story of Jesus tell us something about generous giving.

All it takes to be a true follower of Jesus is to give all you got. I do not mean just monetarily, but also your time, your talent and your entire self to the message of the Gospel. St. Francis of Assisi says, "It is in giving that we receive," and St. Ignatius of Loyola prays, "Lord, teach me to be generous... To give and not to count the cost."

As we receive Jesus today let us ask Him for the grace of generosity, generosity with our time, talent and treasure but most especially the generosity of ourselves to the service of others.

An excellent way to engage in authentic ecumenism is praying together and opening up dialogue with other Christians and people of good will to bring our culture to God, while at the same time acknowledging our obvious differences.
