The Epiphany of the Lord

The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world and celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East. In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel shows the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. In today's Gospel, creation itself proclaims the birth of Jesus to the magi, the kings who are strangers in the land of Israel. They follow the star in their search for Jesus, the newborn King. When they find Him, they worship this baby, and offer Him kingly gifts. In our day, we, the Church, continue this procession, this reaching out towards Jesus Christ. There is an inner aspiration in our human spirit, to want to know God. The celebration of the Epiphany points us to Jesus Christ, who saves us! May we use our energy and time this year to grow closer to Jesus Christ and make our life a gift, an offering to Him.

You're Invited! Small Groups Begin at the End of January

St. Thomas Aquinas parish will soon begin a new opportunity for the renewal of our faith and our parish. The program, called The Journey, allows us to grow a deeper sense of personal encounter with Jesus Christ.



Through scripture, various forms of prayer, video and discussions, we engage with those who met Jesus two thousand years ago and relate these experiences to life today.



The eight small-group sessions last 90 minutes. The first get-together is simply a chance to meet your group, receive materials and share some great food. Following the first night, there will be six sessions, and each group will also explore doing a service activity together. Finally, on April 7, everyone will come together for a potluck and Mass. Some of the Journey groups will

meet in homes, others at the parish. There will be groups for those with particular interests, e.g., parents, young adults, or seniors, as well as mixed groups that include people from a variety of walks of life.

Wonder what the big deal is about small groups?

What exactly is it about small groups that helps Christians grow? Here are five reasons you should consider joining one:

1. **Jesus' Way of Life Cannot Be Learned Alone.** Jesus' teachings require practice partners who can provide insight, advice, and encouragement. Small groups are tried-and-true places to find such support.
2. **Support Encourages Change.** Change comes as we practice the teachings of Jesus. But it's hard work, and it is nearly impossible if we're trying to do it alone. A small group is a safe place to receive encouragement.
3. **Relationships Lead to Sharing.** Sharing helps us to move beyond our self-focused obsessions. Small groups provide a place to make meaningful relationships where such sharing can take place.
4. **Mission Happens in Small Groups.** One powerful way that Christians grow from small groups is by working toward shared goals and common causes. They bond over pursuing similar goals, like developing a spiritual discipline. When small groups unite to accomplish a meaningful mission, growth is the result.
5. **Small Groups Take Church Beyond Sunday.** If a person's spirituality is limited to one hour a week, it will be difficult for them to grow. A small group leads to growth by creating more opportunities to come to know God, to practice the teachings of Jesus, and to grow spiritually.
