From the Desk of Fr. Bart

Baptism of the Lord

In the beginning of Luke's Gospel Jesus is named, "Son of God" by the angel Gabriel, "my Lord" by Elizabeth, and "Messiah" by the angel of the Lord. Now, after being baptized in the River Jordan, Jesus is given another name, "beloved Son." Assured of God's love and approval, Jesus is ready to begin His public ministry. We are God's beloved children as well through our Baptism. Is it easy or difficult for you to believe that you are God's beloved? Why do you think this is?

Liturgical Notes

Now that we are returning to Ordinary Time, I would like to update you on some liturgical notes that people have asked me about.

First, we will return to praying the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel as prescribed by Bishop Morlino. As pastor, I deemed it more helpful for us at STA to rest from praying this prayer every Sunday due to our focus for Advent and Christmas on being welcoming and hospitable. This focus added two practices to our Masses—namely the greeting of one another at the beginning of Mass and the bilingual sung response to our intercessions. Given the length of time and the spirit of welcome that this added to the Mass, I thought it was good for us to omit the additional prayer that seemed to me to strike a serious tone that could distract from our tone of welcome, especially to new visitors and new parishioners who might not be used to praying this prayer or feel confused by it. Plus, I value inclusivity and welcome and wanted to prioritize the bilingual response ahead of this additional prayer. I felt that something needed to be omitted to keep us within our time frame. It is always a balancing act with the liturgy and this is the reason why I made this decision.

Secondly, I would like to continue the practice of introducing ourselves to one another and praying for one another at Mass at least one time per month. On the second Sunday of the month, the same Sunday that we have our Registration Weekend for new members, we will begin by introducing ourselves and promising to pray for each other.

From the feedback I have received, I feel very strongly that our renewed efforts in offering welcome and hospitality to those who attend Mass with us is making a big difference in helping people feel at home in our parish family and building up our community. Thank you for your continued efforts in this regard.

March For Life 2019: Unique from Day One: Pro-Life is Pro-Science

This coming Friday, January 18, the 46th Annual March for Life will take place in Washington D.C. The March for Life is an annual rally protesting both the practice and legality of abortion, held on or around the anniversary of Roe v. Wade, a landmark decision issued January 22, 1973 by the United States Supreme Court legalizing abortion. The march, whose stated mission is to "End abortion by uniting, educating, and mobilizing pro-life people in the public square," advocates for overturning Roe v. Wade. This is the world's largest annual human rights demonstration. This year's theme stated above is described by Jeanne Mancini, President of March for Life: "Science is behind the pro-life movement. We see that medical and technological advancements always affirm the pro-life movement, for example, DNA is present at fertilization and no fingerprint on earth, past, present, or future, is the same. We know, too, a baby's heart beats at just six weeks and we can distinctly observe it ourselves with ultrasound technology. As science progresses, we see clearly that every life is unique from day one in the womb. Life

January 22 Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children at STA

The over 60 million abortions in the USA since the 1973 decisions of *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton* reflect heartbreakingly what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard.

The Catholic Church designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children: In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms.

"A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Through special initiatives and in daily prayer, may an impassioned plea rise to God, the Creator and lover of life, from every Christian community, from every group and association, from every family and from the heart of every believer." Pope Saint John Paul II, *Evangelium Vitae*, no. 100

We will pray a **Rosary for Life on Tuesday January 22 at 5:00 PM** before the Blessed Sacrament in the STA chapel. In addition the 5:30 PM Mass that day will include prayers for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life, and we are encouraged to do acts of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through abortion.

9 Days for Life Novena: January 14-22

9 Days for Life is a multi-faceted novena for the respect and protection of every human life. Each day, a different intention is accompanied by a short reflection, suggested actions, and related information. Participants can receive the novena by downloading the free 9 Days for Life app, or by subscribing to daily emails or text messages. A printable version is available online. 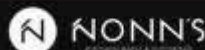
