From the Desk of Fr. Bart

Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

The season of Christmas ended last Sunday on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Now the Season of Ordinary Time begins. Ordinary Time derives its name from the word *ordinal*, meaning *number*. This season, therefore, is

a season of weeks counted by numbers, from the First Week in Ordinary Time through the Thirty-Fourth Week in Ordinary Time. (Depending on the placement of Lent and Advent in any calendar year, Ordinary Time may end before the Thirty-Fourth Week.)

Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ. It's appropriate, therefore, that the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time (which is actually the first Sunday celebrated in Ordinary Time) features Christ's first miracle—the transformation of water into wine at the wedding at Cana. Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. Actually, there's nothing "ordinary" about Ordinary Time!

We have been blessed to host three seminarians recently: Our very own Deacon Lawrence Oparaji, Michael Wanta, and currently Mark Foley. May God continue to bless our diocese with priestly vocations and may more men and women from our own parish of St. Thomas Aquinas, answer the call to service in our Catholic Church in Religious Life.

Reflection from Seminarian, Mark Foley

My name is Mark Foley, and I am a seminarian for the Diocese of Madison in Pre-Theology 2 at St. Paul's Seminary in



St. Paul, MN. I was born in Ireland and came to the United States with my family when I was nine years old. As a young boy I was an altar server and attended Mass, but I never took my faith too seriously, and I struggled to see how Jesus was relevant in my life. This changed my freshman year of high school when a friend showed me photos he had taken from a trip to the Holy Land. Through the pictures of all the places where Jesus had carried out His ministry, He became real for me and I knew that I wanted to know Him more. At this time thoughts of the priesthood began to enter my mind, but I wasn't ready to enter college seminary.

After graduating from high school, I returned to Ireland for a few years. I worked in the construction industry and dated a few girls, but the call to the priesthood remained in my heart. In 2007 I returned to the United States and entered college. In college I really began to encounter the brokenness and wounds that so many of my classmates were experiencing, and I became convinced that people in our culture are really hurting. I felt a call to be an instrument of God's mercy and love to those who are broken and lost and realized that I could no longer run from my vocation to the priesthood, so I decided in spring 2017 to apply for seminary.

Initially it was scary, and it took me awhile to adjust to seminary life, but I have loved every minute of it, and as my prayer life continues to grow, so too does my desire to be a priest. It is a beautiful vocation, and despite my many weaknesses, I hope God can form me into a good priest who loves Him and is willing to follow His example by lovingly serving those I am called to love.

This past December Fr. Greg Ihm told me I would spend my winter break at St. Thomas Aquinas. Since I have known Fr. Bart for many years, I was excited to be spending time with him and this wonderful parish. You have all been extremely welcoming and generous. I have been overwhelmed by your kindness and feel so blessed to have met many of you. Please pray for me and for Fr. Bart, and I will pray for you.



Ordinary Time Notes:

Beginning following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (Sunday, January 13, 2019), we have now entered into Ordinary Time. This period of time is anything but "ordinary" as



The Sunday Celebration of Ordinary Time is the identifying mark of the Christian Community which comes together, remembering that on the first day of the week the Lord was raised up and creation came at last to completion. Sunday as a day of play and worship is a sacrament of redeemed time. How we live Sunday proclaims to the world what we believe about redeemed time, now and for ever. Sunday, like all Sacraments, is simultaneously a point of arrival and departure for Christians on their way to the fullness of the Kingdom. This is not ordinary at all. This is the fabric of Christian living. (taken from the Saint Andrew Bible Missal.)






