St. Thomas Aquinas parish will soon begin a new opportunity for the renewal of our faith and our parish. The program, called The Journey, allows us to grow a deeper sense of personal encounter with Jesus Christ.

Through scripture, various forms of prayer, video and discussions, we engage with those who met Jesus two thousand years ago and relate these experiences to life today.



The eight small-group sessions last 90 minutes. The first get-together is simply a chance to meet your group, receive materials and share some great food. ## Reflection from Seminarian, Michael Wanta



Merry Christmas! I pray that you continue to experience the grace of the Incarnation throughout this Christmas season. This Sunday marks a highpoint within the Octave of Christmas, the eight-day celebration to unpack the mystery, as today we zoom in on the Holy Family.

Praying over this mystery, I was reminded of a town in Italy called Greccio, where I have spent my last two silent retreats. It happens to be the same place where St. Francis invented the nativity scene. In a

small room, only big enough to hold a few people, he gathered some of the villagers to act out the parts of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus. He even got some of the local farm animals! St. Francis wanted to remind the people of Greccio that the Incarnation is real. God, Jesus, without stopping to be God, became a little baby. During my retreats I liked to sit in front of this scene and contemplate the raw fact of the Incarnation. God has a face. Jesus cried, He was hungry and cold. He felt the love and warmth of His mother. I wonder how this living nativity changed the lives of those who saw it and those who played the parts.



The thought struck me: Our families are like walking nativity scenes, providing us with opportunities to contemplate the Christmas mystery. A father can imagine how Joseph played with Jesus, or even how God the Father was proud of Jesus. A mother knows the deep love that Mary had for Jesus as she nursed Him. A child can know the care that Jesus felt from His parents.

Our families might not be perfect but they can give us a practical window to think about the Holy Family and even to know how God loves us, cares for us, and is proud of us. This simple contemplation opens the door to participate in the Holy Family: to be inspired by their virtues, to imitate their lives, and to be drawn into God's love for us which is infinitely more than we can ask or imagine.

## Christmas Basket - Thank You

The 2018 Christmas Basket Project was one of the best ever! We sorted food for 110 baskets on Dec. 14 and delivered them on Dec. 15. The "overflow" was taken to the Lussier Community Education Center, where the food pantry shelves were almost bare.

## Reflection from Deacon Lawrence Oparaji



The Gospel reading today gives us an example of a godly family, or more specifically, the Holy Family. The question that will immediately spring forth is: "What made them holy?" This question leads us to another: "What constitutes holiness?" To be holy among other meanings, has to do with being set apart and dedicated to something sacred or divine. So, to answer the question, what made them holy includes, but not restricted to, their steadfast dedication of their lives to God, and their commitment to divine direction.

It is very significant to note that the Holy Family was able to achieve all the aforementioned within the framework of their vocation as members of a family. This family is called holy because it loved God above all and the members were ready to do the will of God at all times. The family is called holy because everyone in the family revered, appreciated, and celebrated the presence of God in their family. Joseph accepted and carried out God's plan. Mary fully and unreservedly accepted the will of God for her with striking humility. Our Lord Jesus Christ had the doing of his Father's will as his mission on earth. In all these instances, we can collectively agree that the first step to holiness is the readiness to submit oneself to God's divine will. The ability to let go of one's interests and plans and concentrate on God's own plans and will.

Another notable aspect of the Holy Family was their willingness to sacrifice for each other. The birth of Jesus basically changed the life of Joseph and Mary, just as the birth of a child changes the life of their parents, but this is what love calls for, love calls for sacrifice. My seminary rector in Nigeria would always tell young people "if someone always says I love you but cannot sacrifice for you, then you should run away from that kind of love. Sacrificing for one another is the visible sign of love" So Joseph by agreeing to the Angel's message sacrificed, Mary by being obedient and docile to the promptings of God, sacrificed! And Christ by taking on our human flesh, sacrificed a lot! I think this is a concept we need to revitalize in our homes, this idea that I love you and I am willing to give this up for you because sacrificing for one another is truly the visible sign of love.

Today's feast challenges us to uphold family values of love, peace, and togetherness in the society. So, let us ask God to help our family to be holy. Let us ask him to give us a sense of love, a sense of sacrificing/giving up, for one another.

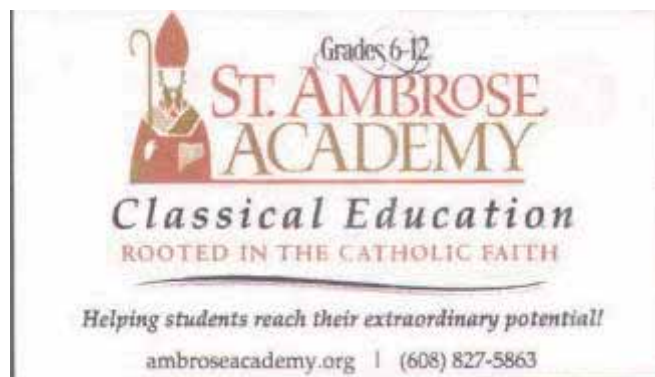
