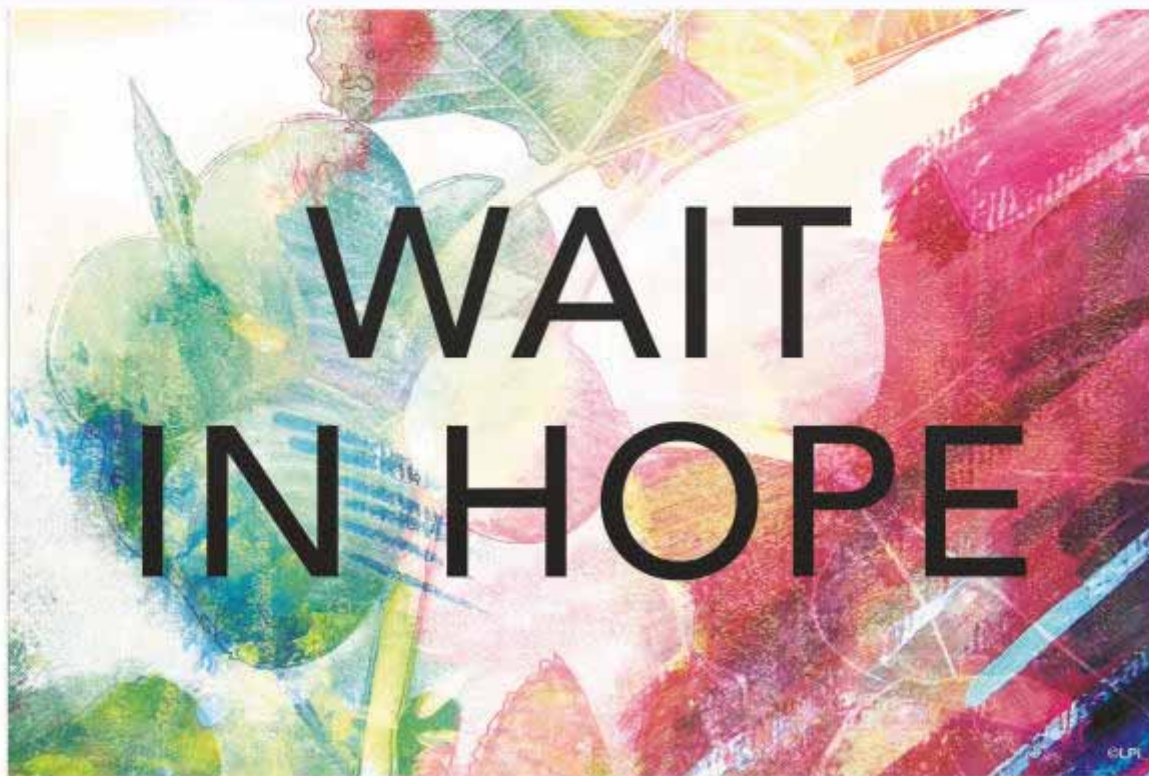

From the Desk of Fr. Bart

Third Sunday of Lent:

“Come Holy Spirit, Lead Us to Easter Renewal”

How is your Lent going? I hope you have been making good progress towards conversion, over-coming temptation, and giving your life to Jesus Christ. We especially want to focus on that one thing in our life that seems to be the part of our life that we are resisting handing over to Christ. We know that a glorious new life of resurrection and joy awaits us if we do the work of penance, repentance, and conversion and are truly renewed in our faith and in our love for Jesus!

This week, we are told that we will perish if we do not repent of our sins. This is a spiritual death, not a physical death. We are called this week to focus on the fruitfulness of our own fig trees. Have we been cultivating and fertilizing the soil of our lives so that we might bear good fruit in the kingdom of God?

One way to “fertilize the soil” of our spiritual lives and our relationship with Jesus is to attend our Parish Renewal on April 29, 30, and May 1. Please make plans to attend; this will be a great experience for us!

We Celebrate the Annunciation of the Lord on Monday, March 25

The word, “Annunciation,” is derived from the word, “announce.” In Luke 1:26-38, the Archangel, Gabriel, announces the birth of Jesus Christ in advance. So “Annunciation,” is just another way of saying, “Announcement.” Mary’s acceptance of this role is momentous and will entail suffering. It is momentous because she will be the mother of the Son of God Himself. It will entail suffering in ways that she cannot yet foresee (e.g., witnessing the Crucifixion), but some she could foresee.

In particular, she will be regarded as having been unfaithful to Joseph, and that would involve not only public shame but, as Matthew records, endangered her relationship with Joseph and her future livelihood and social position. Yet she placed herself completely at the service of God’s will.

Commenting on this, Pope Benedict XVI writes:

"In one of his Advent homilies, Bernard of Clairvaux offers a stirring presentation of the drama of this moment. After the error of our first parents, the whole world was shrouded in darkness, under the dominion of death. Now God seeks to enter the world anew. He knocks at Mary’s door. He needs human freedom. The only way He can redeem man, who was created free, is by means of a free 'yes' to His will. In creating freedom, He made Himself in a certain sense dependent upon man. His power is tied to the unenforceable 'yes' of a human being. So Bernard portrays heaven and earth as it were holding its breath at this moment of the question addressed to Mary. Will she say yes? She hesitates ... will her humility hold her back? Just this once - Bernard tells her - do not be humble but daring! Give us your 'yes'! This is the crucial moment when, from her lips, from her heart, the answer comes: 'Let it be to me according to your word.' It is the moment of free, humble yet magnanimous obedience in which the loftiest choice of human freedom is made" (*Jesus of Nazareth 3: The Infancy Narratives*, ch. 2).

Invitation to the Sacrament of Reconciliation

You are invited to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation and to be absolved of your sins in order to receive Holy Communion at Easter in the state of grace. This is an important aspect of our parish renewal. Please see our schedule for Confessions during Lent or

Reflection from

Deacon Lawrence Oparaji



In today's Gospel, Jesus was very direct in His words when He said: "Unless you repent you will perish." We might say that this is too harsh to come from Christ who is merciful and compassionate. The truth is that when Jesus speaks this way, it does not diminish His compassion and mercy. Rather, He does so because He actually cares for us and sees what we cannot see. He simply warns us of the negative consequences of living a sinful life and wants us to repent and live a better life. He wants us to live life fully both for ourselves and for others and the only way we can live life fully is when we are rooted in Christ, when we strive daily to conform our lives to Him.

Compassion (*cum passio*) means to suffer with, and also to love with. The cross is the greatest sign of compassion, Christ suffering for us and out of love for us and Lent is one of the best times for compassion, to deny ourselves for Christ (and for others) and out of love for Him. So this Lent, as always, Jesus is ready to suffer with us so that we might be free from the slavery of sin. We on our part should try in our own little ways to resolve to deny ourselves daily and constantly invite Christ into our lives.

May God bless us with a deeper love and hunger for Him and may we all journey through Lent and have that life-changing experience that fuels the rest of our lives even after the Lenten season.

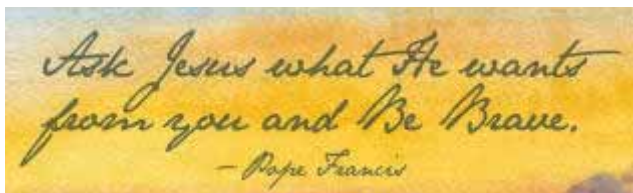

The Pontifical Good Friday Collection

We must begin by tearing down the separation walls we have built in our lives that divide us from our neighbors and from those who are different from us. Then we can perform works of mercy for our neighbors by letting the word of God fertilize our hearts so that we will all bear good fruit. A true work of mercy this Lenten season would be to make a generous contribution on Good Friday to the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land that will help preserve the Christian presence in the Holy Land and maintain the Holy Sites.

The Pontifical Good Friday Collection is applied to these programs below:

Faith, Memory and Culture - The Holy Places

Holy Land Franciscans staff and maintain the Holy places and shrines. This enables those who live in the Holy Land and those who visit to deepen their faith and their spiritual and cultural connection to Salvation history.

Social and Charitable Activities

In order to assist Christians to remain in the Holy Land, including the poor and young couples, the Custody builds thousands of residential units. Additionally, they build senior care facilities. Medical assistance is provided for the needy.

Educational and Scientific Activities

The Franciscans operate and support schools open to all regardless of religion or nationality. They provide scholarships for students to prepare them to get jobs and remain in the Holy Land as part of living Catholic communities. Funds are distributed to young men studying to become Franciscan priests or brothers. Finally, Franciscan archaeologists pursue ongoing research at the Holy Places discovering historical artifacts.

Pastoral Activities

The Franciscans provide pastoral care in 29 parishes in the Holy Land offering Worship, Christian Formation, you and family programs.

Liturgical, Ecumenical and Communications Programs

The Franciscan Media Center tells the story of the Holy Land through multimedia distributed throughout the world in more than seven languages. The friars organize Liturgical Celebrations for the local Christians and Pilgrims and share with other Christian communities in the Holy Land in ongoing Ecumenical cooperation.

Lenten Fast for Creation Care

This Lent, consider a Lenten Sacrifice focused on Care for God's Creation



Why a Lenten Creation Care Fast? Water is a precious life-giving resource requiring enormous energy for distribution/treatment.

WEEK FOUR: How you use water can have a significant environmental impact over time. Low flow shower heads, washers, dishwashers, and toilets reduce water waster and cost, as does avoiding letting water run unnecessarily. Fully load washers and dishwashers for more efficient use of this important resource and to be good stewards of the environment God has given us.

Water Waste and Energy Fast - Turn water heater to 120° F setting, shorter (3 minute) showers instead of baths, cold water clothes washing, turn off water while brushing and shaving, fully load washers and dishwashers.

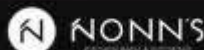
