Fourth Sunday- Rejoice Sunday

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called, Laetare Sunday, which is taken from the first words of the Entrance Antiphon for this Sunday's Mass: "Rejoice O Jerusalem!" On this Sunday, the Church allows special signs of joy to be permitted in the midst of our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, in order to encourage the faithful in their course through the season of penance. Some of the practices forbidden during Lent, but allowed on Laetare Sunday are the use of flowers and the rose-colored vestments instead of purple.

Lenten Theme: Come Holy Spirit, Lead Us to Easter Renewal

As the Holy Spirit leads us through this season of Lent to an experience of renewal at Easter, we are reminded to rejoice on this Laetare Sunday! Even in the midst of our Lenten penances, we remain joyful followers of Jesus Christ, we hold on to hope in the final victory of Christ in his Resurrection. This is the renewal that we all look forward to joyfully as we continue our Lenten journey.

The Pontifical Good Friday Collection

Like Jesus we are called to humility: to look past our preconceived notions. We are called to compassion: to better understand our Palestinian brothers and sisters and to reach out to them. We are also called to mercy: to pray, to become involved on their behalf, and to embrace their suffering as our own.

Doing this provides an opportunity to let those who are estranged and forgotten know that they are not alone. When we confront our preconceived notions and reach out in humility, mercy and compassion, we, like Jesus will find our family enlarged, restored, and whole. Canonization of Two Palestinian Nuns.

Pope Francis on May 17, 2015 canonized two nuns from what was 19th century Palestine in hopes of encouraging Christians across the Middle East who are facing a wave of persecution from Islamic extremists.



Sister Mariam Bawardy - St. Mary of Jesus Crucified (pictured above left) was a mystic born in 1843 in the village of Ibilin in what is now the Galilee region of northern Israel. She is said to have received the “stigmata” - bleeding wounds like those that Jesus Christ suffered on the cross - and died at the age of 33 in the West Bank town of Bethlehem, where she founded a Carmelite order monastery that still exists.

Sister Marie Alphonsine Ghattas - St. Marie-Alphonsine (pictured above right), born in Jerusalem in 1847, opened girls’ schools, fought female illiteracy, and co-founded the Congregation of the Sisters of the Rosary. The order today boasts dozens of centers all over the Middle East, from Egypt to Syria, that operate kindergartens, homes for the elderly, medical clinics and guest houses.

The Justice and Peace committee paired up with the middle and high school faith formation families to imagine what it might feel like to be a refugee. The simulation took a group of 8 people who pretended to be a family. These eight people picked what roles they would play for the simulation.



The simulation started with each person having to pick 6 things that they would need from their home to journey to a new country and a new life. As the simulation went on items were lost, wrecked, used to barter with, and sometimes just left behind.

People were hurt, sad and sometimes even separated.

The simulation ended with the family in a new country and very little to start a new life with. It was an eye-opening event for the 64 people who attended.

Why a Lenten Creation Care Fast? Food is a precious life-giving resource requiring enormous energy for growing and distribution.

WEEK FIVE: The average U.S. family wastes \$1,600 of food each year. Before shopping, check what you have on hand. Plan your meals for the week, (how often will you eat out?), then buy only things needed for those meals. Prepare perishable foods soon after shopping. Food waste in landfills generates greenhouse gas (methane). Reducing waste and composting minimizes this or more efficient use of this important resource and to be good stewards of the environment God has given us.

Food Waste Fast - Plan meals, make lists, avoid duplicates, keep less food on hand, and compost.
