From the Desk of Fr. Bart

Fifth Sunday of Lent:

“Come Holy Spirit, Lead Us to Easter Renewal!”

We are coming to the end of our Lenten journey. There is still time for us to make this a good Lent through our Lenten practices of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.

There is still time for us to make a good confession and be prepared to receive Holy Communion on Easter Sunday. The Holy Spirit is helping us to see the areas of our lives that need conversion so that we can truly be renewed in our discipleship of Jesus Christ.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Jesus has a powerful encounter with a woman who was caught in adultery and she experiences the forgiveness and mercy of Jesus. He tells her, “Go, and from now on do not sin any more.” We are invited to experience a healing encounter with Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is essential for the forgiveness of our sins and a new way of living. Besides our usual times for Confession on Saturdays at 3:15 PM and Sundays at 9:00 AM; we will have an opportunity for private individual confessions this Tuesday evening from 6:00 PM - 7:30 PM with four priests available. You can also call the parish to make an appointment.

Stations of the Cross

This Tuesday will be our final opportunity to pray the Stations of the Cross at 6:00 PM in the Church. Pope Francis explains 8 reasons this is a good spiritual practice during Lent:

1. They Allow Us to Place Our Trust in God. Only in Christ crucified and risen can we find salvation and redemption.
2. They Put Us into the Story. Imagine that you are one of the people in the scriptures. How will you respond to Jesus?
3. They Remind Us that Jesus Suffers with Us. We do not carry our cross alone; Jesus bears our suffering with us.
4. They Compel Us to Action. They help us to look with compassion on those who suffer.
5. They Help Us Make a Decision for or Against Christ. Following Jesus is a choice we make. Embracing him brings us salvation, rejecting him brings condemnation.
6. They Reveal God’s Response to Evil in the World. God is not silent in the face of suffering, God enters our suffering and gives us His love, mercy, and forgiveness.
7. They Give Us the Certainty of God’s Love for Us. Jesus loved us so much; He gave His life to save us.
8. They Guide Us from the Cross to the Resurrection. Evil shall not have the last word.

What is this Parish Renewal?

It's a perfect beginning for the Easter season, and an answer to our Lenten theme of “Come Holy Spirit, lead us to Easter renewal!” International speaker, Deacon Keith Strohm, will preach at all Masses during Divine Mercy weekend (April 27-28). On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evening, from 7:00-8:30 PM, he will speak about the powerful message of God’s love and the fullness of blessing that the Holy Spirit has in store for us. It is an important time for all of us at St. Thomas Aquinas as we continue to develop into a parish where people experience Jesus is a way that changes how they live. Bring one guest, or even better, bring many!

Who is Deacon Keith Strohm?

Deacon Keith is the former Director of the Office for the New Evangelization and a deacon for the Archdiocese of Chicago. A well-known international and conference keynote speaker, he has helped tens of thousands of men and women hear the Gospel message and encounter the mercy, love and power of Jesus Christ. Deacon Keith has extensive experience in creating and sustaining processes and programs of evangelization and formation at the group, parish and diocesan level that focus on the making, maturation and missioning of disciples of Jesus Christ. He is the Executive Director of M3 Ministries and a long-time teacher and collaborator with the Catherine of Siena Institute. He is author of 2 books, *Jesus: The Story You Thought You Knew* and *The 10 Biggest Lies of the Enemy and How to Combat Them*, and a co-author, along with six other collaborators, with Sherry Weddell, for the book *Becoming a Parish of Intentional Disciples*.



Reflection from Seminarian Dcn. Lawrence Oparaji



One word I have heard quite often since I have been in America is “judging.” People often say things like “you are judging me” or “I feel judged by you” in various settings to mean various things. Today, Christ uses it to tell us of our own unworthiness and warn us of the sin of self-righteousness, of thinking I deserve Christ because I have done this and that.

Jesus is not asking us not to make certain judgements, like carefully discerning what is wrong from what is right and striving to make choices that help us lead a holy and joyful life. Instead, He is asking us to be aware of our own sinfulness and never to condemn another (of course we can correct one another but not condemn). The only condition in which we are free to condemn anyone or discuss their sins is that we ourselves must be completely sinless! In other words, so long as we sin, whether consciously or unconsciously (which we all do), we are not permitted to judge anyone. It is surprising that Jesus himself, who was obviously the only person there without sin, did not cast a stone at the woman. He asked her: “Where are they? Has no one condemned you?” She said, “No one, Lord” And Jesus said, “Neither do I condemn you; go and do not sin again.”

Our primary goal as Christians is not to discern who goes to hell or who goes to heaven; it is not to discern who sins and who is righteous. We leave that to Christ and His Church. The essence of being a Christian according to St. Paul is not pointing accusing fingers at others; it is simply to strive for perfection. Even St. Paul acknowledges that we cannot be perfect based on our own efforts alone; the perfection he sought after is that which is based on Faith, a perfection that seeks to replicate the sufferings of Christ on the cross.

Each of us here has a past. There is no one who has never sinned before. The Scriptures say “for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.” But today, God is saying to us, forget the past; begin a new life. You may have gone deep in sin, yet God is saying: “My child, your past is past, you can become a Saint.” The God who called a fervent persecutor of his people and changed his name from Saul to Paul, the same God who showed mercy to a woman condemned by others, is still alive, and that is the God we serve.

Lenten Fast for Creation Care



This Lent, consider a Lenten Sacrifice focused on Care for God's Creation

Why a Lenten Creation Care Fast? Things we buy impact our environment, take time from our life and often control us.

WEEK SIX: If you have a tradition of giving gifts on Easter, think about how your purchases impact the life of our planet. Consider how much energy it took for the gift to be manufactured and transported to your doorstep. Think about alternative gifts that nurture relationships instead. Consider how you can detach from temporal goods and be mindful of church teachings to seek a simpler, less materialistic life. Abstain from buying "stuff" and purchase only the minimum essentials.

"Stuff" Fast - Set aside specific days to devote your free time to contemplative thought, prayer and spiritual development. And then, rather than shopping, spend time sharing meaningful conversation with a friend in need.

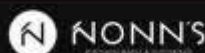
