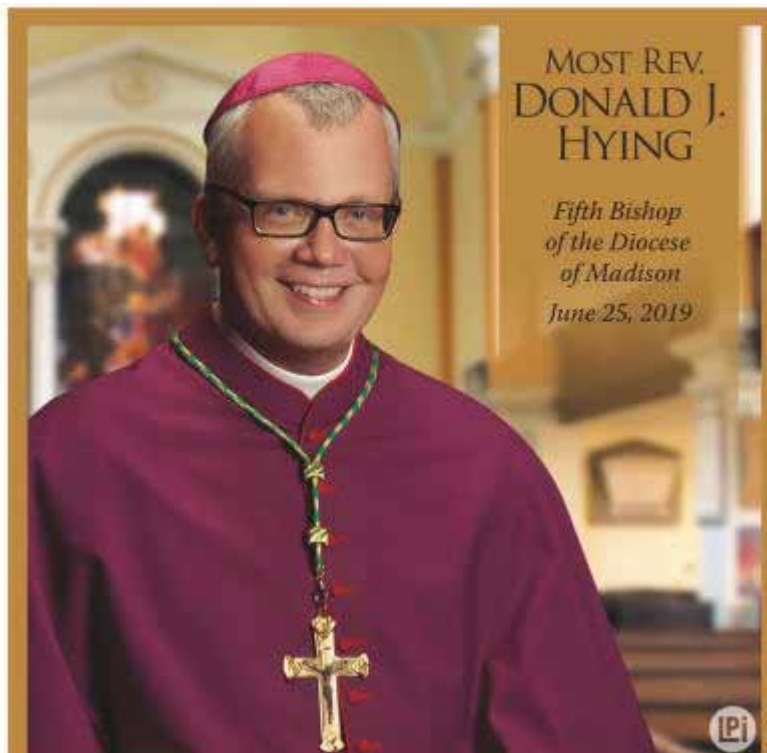

Thirteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

We are in the midst of summer and we are fully within Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time in our Liturgical Calendar is not ordinary or plain. Actually, it is far from unimportant or uninteresting. Ordinary Time is called “Ordinary,” because these weeks are numbered. The Latin word “ordinalis,” refers to numbers in a series. This is also where we get the word “order.” Ordinary Time is the numbered weeks which represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (Christmas and Easter), nor in penance (Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation on the Second Coming of Christ. Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ walks among us and transforms our lives. There’s nothing ‘ordinary’ about that!

In today’s Gospel, Jesus invites His disciples and us to “follow me.” What have been the turning points in your life when you experienced Jesus’ call and responded to it?

Reflection from Seminarian Vince Racanelli

Evangelization and Discipleship

Last time we concluded with the Great Commission from Matthew 28:19-20, in which Jesus commissions us to “go therefore, and make disciples of all nations.” What is a disciple though?



Well, discipleship is the response to Jesus’ call to “follow me.” To become a disciple is to enter into a relationship in which we are the students and Jesus is the master; indeed, the word “disciple” derives from the Latin *discipulus*, which is the word for student. To be a disciple, however, is not just to be a part-time or even a full-time student. Discipleship goes beyond that. Discipleship touches the very core of our identity. To be a disciple, we leave everything that keeps us from following Him. Sometimes what keeps us from following Him may be material wealth, but not always. Other times it may be certain relationships, ambitions, political persuasions, or presuppositions about the world; things that close our minds to the teachings of our master. Regardless of what our stumbling-blocks are, Jesus calls us all to follow Him. “And He said to all, ‘If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me’ Luke 9:23.”

La evangelización y el discipulado

La semana pasada, concluimos con la Gran Comisión de Mateo 28:19-20, en cual Jesús nos da el mandato “vayan, pues, y hagan discípulos de todos los pueblos.” ¿Qué es un discípulo?

Pues, el discipulado es la respuesta a la llamada de Jesús: “sígueme.” Hacerse discípulos es entrar en una relación en la cual somos los estudiantes, y Jesús es el maestro; la palabra “discípulo” derive de la palabra latina “*discipulus*,” que quiere decir “estudiante.” No obstante, ser discípulo no es ser estudiante de media jornada o aún de jornada completa. El discipulado toca el corazón de nuestra identidad. En ser discípulo, dejamos todo lo que impide que sigamos a Jesús. A veces, el impedimento puede ser la riqueza; pero a veces, no. Otras veces, el impedimento puede ser una relación, una ambición, una idea política, o una presuposición del mundo; a veces éstas son las cosas que cierran la mente a las enseñanzas de nuestro maestro. En cualquier caso, Jesús nos llama: “y les decía a todos: si alguno quiere venir detrás de mí, que se niegue a sí mismo, que tome su cruz cada día, y que me siga (Lucas, 9:23).”

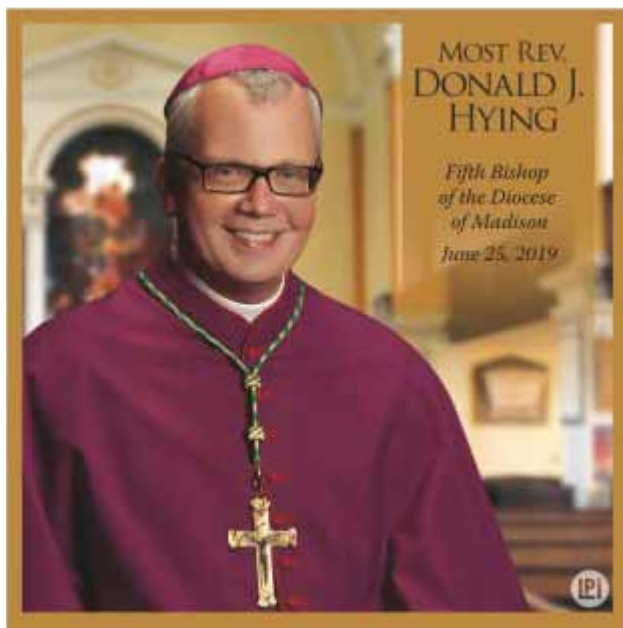

Décimo Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Estamos en medio del verano y completamente en el Tiempo Ordinario. Este Tiempo en nuestro Calendario Litúrgico no es ordinario ni sin sentido. En realidad, está muy lejos de no ser importante ni interesante. Pero es llamado “Ordinario” porque estas semanas son enumeradas. La palabra en Latino “ordinalis,” se refiere a los números en una serie. De aquí también obtenemos la palabra “orden.” Entonces este Tiempo Ordinario con semanas enumeradas representa la vida de la Iglesia – el periodo que vivimos donde no tenemos celebraciones (Navidad y Pascua) ni penitencia (Adviento y Cuaresma), sino que velamos y esperamos por la Segunda Venida de Cristo. Para los católicos, este Tiempo Ordinario es cuando vemos a Cristo caminar entre nosotros transformando nuestras vidas. ¡Y no hay nada ‘ordinario’ en eso!

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús invita a Sus discípulos y a nosotros a que “me sigan.” ¿Cuáles han sido los momentos en tu vida en los cuales has presenciado a Jesús y a su llamado, y has respondido?
