Thirty-second Sunday of Ordinary Time

The Sadducees pose a ridiculous scenario to Jesus in the hopes it will trip him up. But Jesus cuts through to the heart of their question about the resurrection of the dead. Do we really believe that God has authority over life and death and the ability to bring life from

death? Jesus is about to live his certainty in the resurrection by submitting to death. He knows, as he tells the Sadducees, that God is God of the living - there is no death in him.

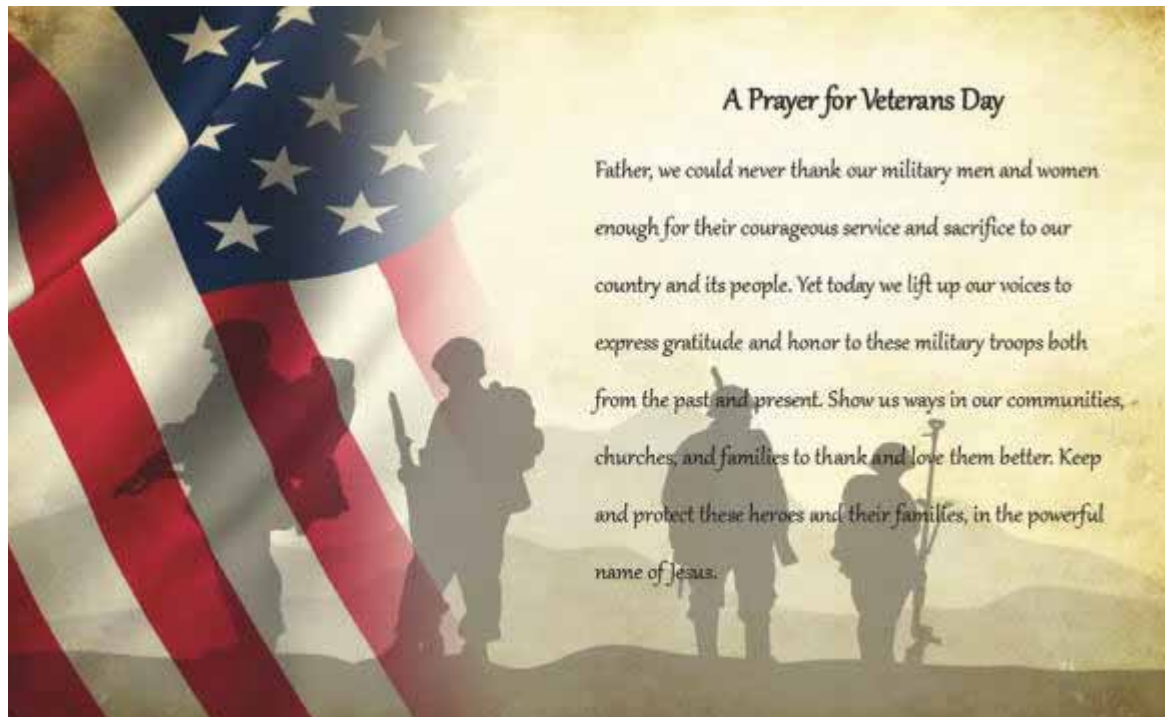


Prayer for Justice

Authentic Ecumenism does not require Catholics to compromise our faith and beliefs, like giving up our Marian devotions. Authentic Ecumenism calls us to join hands with other Christians and people of good will to bring our culture and society to God, while at the same time acknowledging our obvious differences.
