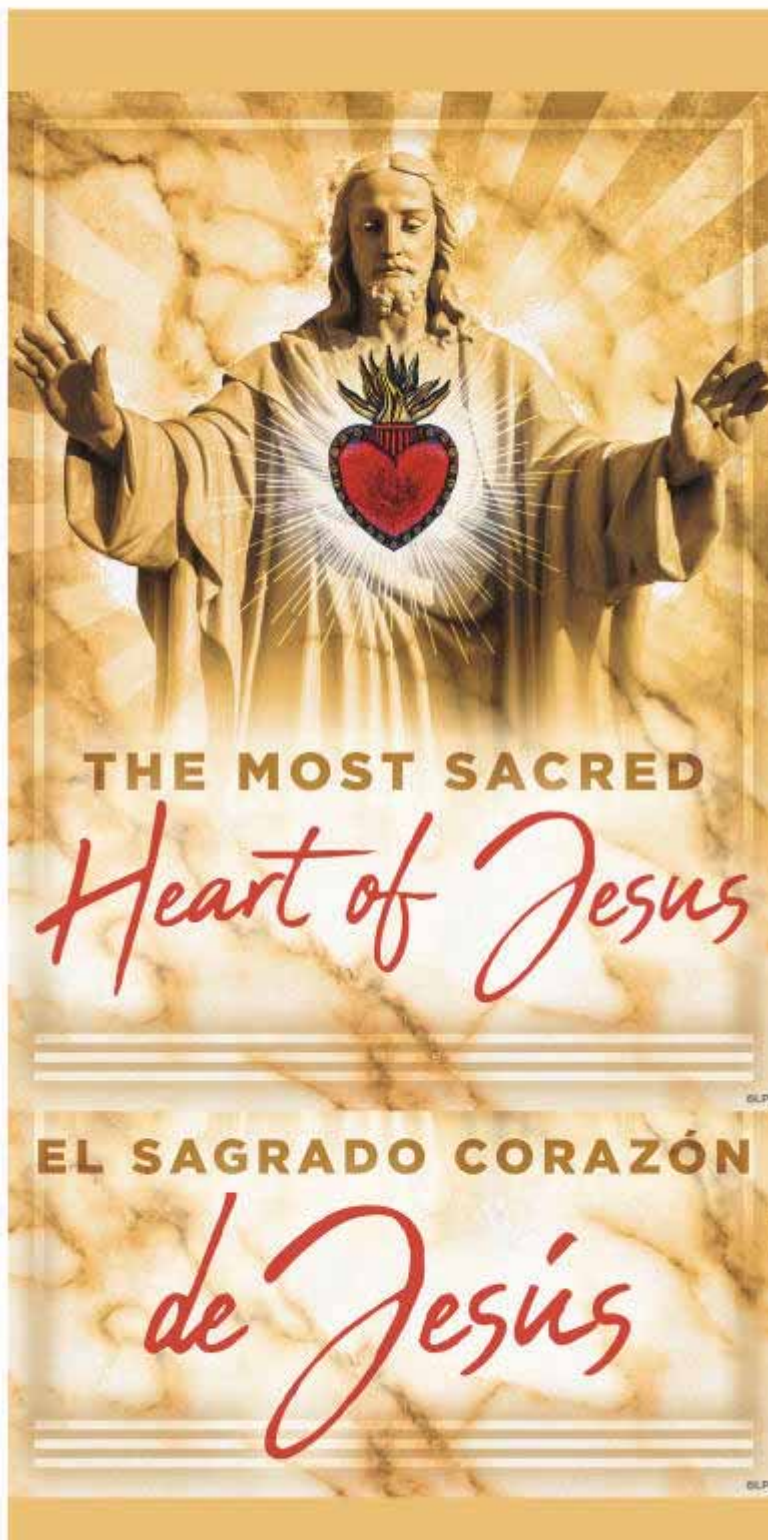

### Solemnity of The Most Sacred Body and Blood of Christ- Corpus Christi

The Feast of the Sacred Body and Blood of Jesus reminds us that Christ still gives Himself to us in the Most Holy Eucharist. It is a profound, prophetic and powerful Feast in the liturgical year of our Catholic Church. When it is celebrated, it is meant to be a richly significant day in Catholic Christian life. In our Holy Communion we receive the Body of Christ! Let us choose to become what we consume. Today's Solemnity is not just a ritual on a Church calendar. It is an invitation to encounter the Lord Jesus Christ, and then offer Him to a world waiting to be born anew. On this Feast of Corpus Christi, let us ask the Lord to come and take up residence within us anew. Let us receive, adore and become Eucharist for others.

In 1264, Pope Urban IV asked St. Thomas Aquinas, our Patron Saint, to compose two Offices of Prayer. He did so, along with five hymns- and they have nourished the piety of Christians for centuries. In one of them St. Thomas noted:

*"Material food first of all turns itself into the person who eats it, and as a consequence, restores his losses and increases his vital energies. Spiritual food, on the other hand, turns the person who eats it into Itself. Thus, the proper effect of this sacrament is the conversion of man into Christ, so that he may no longer live for himself, but that Christ may live in Him. And as a consequence it has the double effect of restoring the spiritual losses caused by sins and defects and of increasing the power of the virtues."*

On this Feast we proclaim our belief in the Real presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. We also proclaim that same Jesus lives within each one of us who are baptized into His Body, the Church, of which we are members. That is also a Real presence. He comes to dwell within us - and we live our lives now in Him. We are invited to become a living monstrosity, carrying the Lord within us, showing Him forth to the world, in word and deed.

### A Prayers of St. Thomas Aquinas Before and After Communion

*These prayers below by St. Thomas Aquinas before and after Communion give us a moving example of love and humility in the presence of our Savior. St. Thomas, pictured below, the celebrated 13th century "Angelic Doctor" of the Church, is considered to be one of the greatest theologians and intellects in our faith.*



#### Prayer Before Communion

Almighty and Eternal God, behold I come to the sacrament of Your only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. As one sick I come to the Physician of life; unclean, to the Fountain of mercy; blind, to the Light of eternal splendor; poor and needy to the Lord of heaven and earth. Therefore, I beg of You, through Your infinite mercy and generosity, heal my weakness, wash my uncleanness, give light to my blindness, enrich my poverty, and clothe my nakedness. May I thus receive the Bread of Angels, the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, with such reverence and humility, contrition and devotion, purity and faith, purpose and intention, as shall aid my soul's salvation.

Grant, I beg of You, that I may receive not only the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of our Lord, but also its full grace and power. Give me the grace, most merciful God, to receive the Body of your only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary, in such a manner that I may deserve to be intimately united with His mystical Body and to be numbered among His members. May it bring me charity and patience, humility and obedience, and growth in power to do good.

May it be my strong defense against all my enemies, visible and invisible, and the perfect calming of all my evil impulses, bodily and spiritual.

May it unite me more closely to Thee, the one true God and lead me safely through death to everlasting happiness with Thee.

And I pray that Thou willest lead me, a sinner, to the banquet where Thou with Thy Son and Holy Spirit, are true and perfect light, total fulfillment, everlasting joy, gladness without end, and perfect happiness to Thy saints.

Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

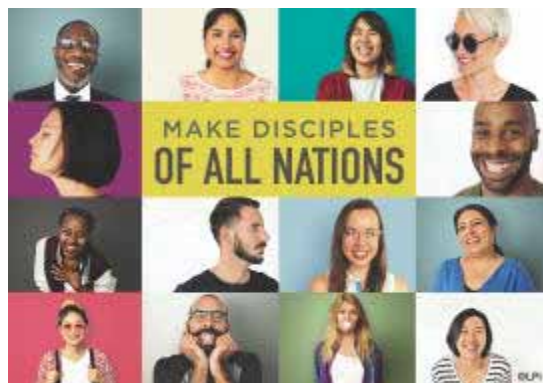

Recently, I received an email from a parishioner commenting on my article a couple of weeks ago. She says: "I have five siblings who have drifted away from the church. Whenever they talk about a problem they have, I always say, "I'll say a prayer for you." Some roll their eyes as if saying "There's Aunt Joan again." When my nephew was trying to sell his home, I emailed him to ask how it was going. He let me know he hadn't sold it. I emailed back that I would say a prayer. He responded immediately saying, "Thank you, Aunt Joan!!!" That made my day. When I asked again, he responded, "Keep praying, Aunt Joan." There's always hope. We just have to keep evangelizing." There is always hope! Keep praying!

## Construction Update

A special word of thanks to everyone who has contributed to our Make Disciples Capital Campaign for making these projects possible. We are proud and excited about all the wonderful improvements which we will all enjoy because of your generosity. We are making steady progress on our construction work and look forward to seeing the finished product in a few months! Thanks for your patience while we are under construction.

The organ pipe/speaker platform is getting some major attention this week. The new tie-rod supports were delivered at the end of last week. They will be installed by attaching them to the front of the platform and then angling them up and attaching to the wall behind the pipes. These tie rods will be hidden from view, so that we can maintain the beautiful pipe façade. This will create a whole new support system for the organ speakers and pipe façade, and will allow the pillar which is currently in the middle of the music area, to be removed, resulting in more usable floor space without having physical and visible objects in the way. Once the new supports are in place, then a portion of the floor will be removed, to allow for the sound of the organ speakers to travel down to the choir members, who will be positioned directly under the platform. In the past, the choir members had an exceedingly difficult time hearing the organ, because the platform and speaker placement did not allow the sound a path to effectively reach them. And hopefully by the end of the week, we will be able to put the organ speakers back in place on the platform, so they can be reconnected to the organ console, once most of the other work in the church has been finished.

Electrical work continues in the sacristy and the confessionals this week. Since we have made so many adjustments and changes to the layout in the sacristy, we have had to move HVAC, plumbing, and a lot of electrical lines. There are still a few electrical lines which still need to be adjusted this week before other work in the Sacristy can continue and remain on schedule. We are extremely excited that the new confessionals have a lot of natural light, but we have had to make a few adjustments to the lighting inside of the confessionals to accommodate the large, new skylights! In addition, we have made a few modifications to the placement of switches, to allow ease of use for all our priests! Of course, we included additional receptacles for future use.

Once the necessary electrical work is completed in the sacristy this week, work will begin laying new plywood sub-flooring, framing the new walls, and furring out the concrete block walls to allow for necessary plumbing and additional electrical to be run and installed in these new walls. As you can tell from these updates, there are a lot of moving parts here.

While we are happy that we are still on schedule, we are also glad that we are able to see changes at each step of the process so that we can make any adjustments which might be needed to make all of these spaces as functional as they absolutely need to be! Thanks to all our contractors and workers for being so flexible and great to work with!

Thanks to all of you for your patience! We are all looking forward to the day when we can utilize and celebrate in our newly updated space and pray together. Blessings! Greg
