

Your generosity and support has made it possible to have a newly remodeled Choir area, a new piano, a new sound system, new projector screen, two new Confessionals, and a remodeled Sacristy including a bathroom! This will be a great improvement for our parish. Our Church is the heart of our parish life and life in Christ. We have a new "engine" now that can propel us to be even stronger missionary disciples. The Sunday experience when people return to worship or join us for the first time can be the inspiration for them to encounter Jesus Christ in a way that changes how they live. A dynamic music program can enhance and add so much beauty to the Sunday Mass. The new projector screen can be utilized to evangelize our youth. The new Confessionals can draw attention and importance to this under-utilized Sacrament of Healing and Reconciliation. The newly remodeled Sacristy will be a more prayerful and functional space and helpful in preparing for Liturgies. We have enjoyed working with our partners at Vogel Brothers and are excited to see this project completed on September 4, 2020. Planning for Phase II of the MDCC will begin immediately and we hope to remodel our kitchen and social hall next summer. Thanks for your patience with us during the construction period that began on May 11, 2020. May God continue to bless us as we accomplish our plans for improving our campus so we can make disciples!



## Gospel Reflection By Dcn. Jerome Buhman



Today the disciples get “called out.” To call someone out is to challenge them, and Jesus asks them: Who do you say that I am? Peter, inspired by God, answers, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” Jesus, in turn, tells Peter “You are Peter [a name which means ‘rock’], and upon this rock I will build my church.” Peter, then, after the resurrection, takes up leadership of the Church. Peter was by no means a perfect man; in the Gospel two week ago, he sinks into the sea for lack of faith (maybe another reason to call him ‘rock’?). In next week’s Gospel (spoiler) he is rebuked by Jesus. But Peter is repentant when he errs, and is doggedly persistent in trying to accomplish his mission to bring Christ to others, even to his death as a martyr. And what of the Church? The word for church in the Gospel of Matthew is ‘ecclesia,’ a term the author uses only twice. The word means “to call out of.” We, as church, are called out as the disciples were to tell others who Christ is, to bring Christ to them. Like Peter, we will stumble, but like him as well, we must persevere. Jesus asks us today, and every day, “Who do you say that I am?”

## Construction Update

A special word of thanks to everyone who has contributed to our Make Disciples Capital Campaign for making these projects possible. We are proud and excited about the wonderful improvements which we will all enjoy because of your generosity. We are making steady progress on our work and look forward to seeing the finished product in only a couple weeks! Thanks for your patience while we are under construction.

Last week, the new tile floor in the Chapel and the Sacristy Bathroom was finished. This took much of the week, between preparation, installation, and grouting—all of which had to be done and completely dried before the new floor could have any foot-traffic. The exterior door next to the music area was finally replaced and the new wood was installed over the door so that it matches the rest of the wood on the interior of the church. The new sound-reflecting acoustic panels were installed behind the choir. Trim-work was crafted to frame the music area and the new acoustic panels. We are still waiting for some finish wood-work, so that this part of the project can be completed.

This week we focused on the finishes in the music area. The wood flooring was installed this week, and the wood trim and slats on the walls were installed on the wall between the choir and the storage room, as well as the wall between the choir and the sanctuary platform. There are some other trim details on the pipe/organ platform which also got attention this week, and then all the trim should be finished up. Once this is done, there will be a few areas that will receive touch-up paint, including the sacristy, the storage room, and the confessionals. We are hoping that the carpet will also get installed in the sacristy, storage room, and confessionals this week.

While all that was happening, our AV (Audio & Video) installers were onsite for a couple of days beginning to pull wires into place for the new sound and video system. Wires have to be pulled from the sacristy to the choir steps, from the sacristy to the chapel, from the sacristy to the gathering space, from the sacristy to the cameras on the church ceiling and above the cry room window, from the sacristy all the way to the IT closet in the RE wing, from the sacristy to the monitors/televisions in the chapel, gathering space, and from the sacristy to the Ushers Room where we will manage the livestream and the screen in the church once everything is finally installed and setup!

Drawings have been revised and are moving forward to have new hymn boards crafted to match the woodwork in the rest of the church. They will have additional lines so that we have more space to list the music for the various parts of the Mass, as well as the page numbers of the readings for those who choose to follow along with the proclamation of scripture. We have also finalized drawings for a cantor stand to be built to match the music area, where a cantor (or two) can lead sung prayer from a dedicated place, and still allow the choir and other musicians to move around. This is especially important during the Communion procession. In addition, this creates a dedicated place which doesn't require any additional microphones to be setup or moved around, keeping the music area clean and free from clutter.

It is quite amazing to watch all the moving pieces of the project come together! Thanks to all of you for your patience! We are all looking forward to the day when we can utilize and celebrate in our newly updated space and pray together. Blessings!

## New Men's Group at STA: Men Ascending

In *Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic*, Matthew Kelly poses one of the most important questions any of us can ask: "How is the best way to live?" What is God's will for us?

In a world fraught with selfishness, war, poverty, huge economic disparities and racial injustice, we can see how crucial it is to answer that question. The seven deadly sins and more – dishonesty, self-pity, fear and despair -- are driving much of the dysfunction that has produced the world we live in. We want to give men a chance to change that and overcome those stumbling blocks. The answer to Kelly's critical question is to cultivate the virtues in our daily lives, and it doesn't start by trying to change the world. As men we each need to begin with ourselves personally. And this doesn't even start with Kelly's question.

Applying the approach used by 12-step recovery programs in dealing with addictions, in "Men Ascending" we will struggle with the question behind Kelly's question: "What kind of man do I want to be?" We will share our experience, strength and hope with each other in order to cultivate the virtues. Together we can diminish the shortcomings which undermine our efforts to be the best men we can be as we discover the best way for us to live and fulfill God's will for us.

More than ever before, men need practical tools to cultivate the virtues and we cannot effectively do this all by ourselves. We need each other.
