

2020 Presbyteral Assembly:

Forming Intentional Missionary Disciples

This week on Monday and Tuesday the priests of the diocese will be gathering for our annual assembly. The theme this year is Forming Intentional Missionary Disciples. One of the challenges we are facing in our Church is a crisis of discipleship. Our mission is to live as missionary disciples of Jesus and to make disciples. I am looking forward to the assembly and learning more about this topic. Our speakers will be Sherry Weddell, Marcel LeJeune, and Bishop Donald Hying. Sherry Weddell is the author of the book: *Forming Intentional Disciples*. Our STA Staff and many of our parish leaders have read this book and it was the beginning of developing our Parish Vision of becoming an Evangelizing Parish of Missionary Disciples. Marcel LeJeune is a Catholic Evangelist and the President and Founder of Catholic Missionary Disciples.

This year, due to the pandemic we are not spending Sunday through Wednesday in the Wisconsin Dells like previous years. Some priests will attend in person and some will attend virtually. Please keep us in prayer during these important days for our presbyterate.

Dispensation for Attending Sunday Mass Ends September 27:

I am sure you have heard by now about the dispensation from the Obligation to attend Sunday Mass will end September 27. All Catholics who can safely and securely do so are invited to return to attending Sunday Mass. The elderly, the immunodeficient, and those who are still at increased risk may refrain from Sunday Mass attendance, without committing sin, as allowed by the Church's Canon Law. For this reason we will continue to live-stream our Masses.

This brings up some practical questions. Because we can only have about 150 people safely attend Mass due to social distancing, how can we accommodate all of our families? The simple answer is that we cannot. Therefore, making the effort to attend, even if one is turned away due to capacity limits, fulfills the Sunday Obligation. At our parish, we have been communicating our Mass attendance via email with Terri Kopplin. By emailing Terri and making a reservation, we can inform you if we have room for you and this fulfills making the effort. If you email Terri and hear back from her that there is no space available, you do not have to come to Church to show your intention. The email and response are sufficient. So please, continue to communicate with Terri, and let's work together so that as many families as possible can be part of the rotation in attending Sunday Mass.

Let us return to Sunday Mass joyfully! For Catholics Sunday Mass is the focal point of our lives and week. We are so blessed to be able to receive the Eucharist and unite ourselves to Jesus and to one another. We need the very real and sacred nourishment of the Mass, hearing the Word of God and receiving the Eucharist, that feeds us and keeps us spiritually alive. By working together, communicating, and making a strong effort, we can safely return to Sunday Mass.

Emailing Terri Kopplin for Mass Attendance

Emailing Terri is the best way I can think of to be in close communication about what to expect when you come to a weekend Mass. It is not meant to be a barrier or make thing hard for people. Of course you can still come to Mass even if you don't email. However, there might not be room for you due to capacity limits and social distancing. You can

Most of our staff will be working from home these days, so please be sure to call or email before heading over to the church to make sure someone is here to assist you.



Bishop Hying on “Go Make Disciples”



A central component of our life in Christ, which each parish and even the whole diocese can live more profoundly, is the reclaiming of the treasure that is the Sabbath – the day of the Lord’s Resurrection. We should consider again the meaning of Sunday. After Peter preaches to the crowds and after they were “cut to the heart,” the Scriptures tell how all those Baptized lived out their faith. We hear that, “they devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers.” I believe that all of us should be challenged to make Sunday, and in particular, the communal celebration of the Mass, the center of our week.

Gospel Reflection By Dcn. Jerome Buhman

Among the wonderful things about the parables of Jesus are the many layers of meaning. In today’s Gospel, for example, we could look at the theme of God’s infinite mercy, or the ways in which God’s ways are not always humankind’s ways. But the aspect I want to highlight is the attitude of the last group of laborers the landowner hires. These laborers were persistent and patient! The Gospel says that the landowner came to them at five o’clock in the afternoon; for many of us, that’s quitting time! Those workers could not have been expecting to be hired, yet they remained in the marketplace, making themselves available to do work. And they were rewarded for their preparedness; the landowner came to them and hired them, and on top of that, they received a full day’s wage. There is a lesson there for us: we don’t know when God might call on us to do work in his vineyard, but we must always be prepared to answer the summons. The call might certainly not come when we expect it, and we never know what work he may ask of us. But one thing we do know – the reward will be great!

also phone the parish if you do not have email.

The email is meant to share important information with you that was changed or updated on Fridays that we cannot put in our bulletin or general email. This was more frequent in the early days of the pandemic. The email also helps us to be able to safely accommodate as many people as possible. For example, with a capacity of about 150 people, we can see by how many are signed up, how many people we can allow to attend Mass in the Church who have not signed up, but come to Church. The more we work together, the better and safer it is for all of us. So you can still come to Church even without emailing Terri. Emailing Terri is a great way for us to work together and be as safe and helpful to one another that we can be. Plus, God forbid there is a coronavirus outbreak at our Church, we will be able to contact the people who attended that Mass. If one doesn’t email, then we will not be able to contact you as easily. It is possible we might decide to drop the request to email Terri due to people not wanting to bother with this extra step, or people telling us that they are not coming because of this request, but to me, it seems to be working well.

Construction Update

A special thank you to everyone who contributed to our Make Disciples Capital Campaign for making these projects possible. We are at the end of the construction part of Phase 1, the completion of the music area renovations, the sacristy remodel, and the new confessionals in the chapel. This week, the glass was installed in the confessional doors, and final details were finished up throughout the various spaces.

We are grateful to all the wonderful people who have worked with us throughout this process. A special shout-out to Matt Schultz, Tia Endres, and Bryan Bjorge for their continuous excellence and professional support! Thanks to the parish team, including Fr. Bart, Holly Irving, Dominick Meyer, Greg Buchberger, Ismael Covarrubias, and Steve Hoff, for all their planning and dedication to St. Thomas Aquinas Parish and helping to create an atmosphere where people can experience Jesus in real and profound ways.

As mentioned last week, the Audio and Video System is still in progress and should be functional by the end of September. You may have noticed that new speakers were mounted on the front wall of the church. It will take some time to finish installation. Once installation is complete, staff members and a few volunteers will attend training on how to use the new system. It will take us a few months to fine tune things and learn the more complex features of the new system.

Once the new AV system is installed, we will finally say goodbye to the temporary, portable speakers that we've been using for over a year now. One of the highlights of the new sound system is the new Renkus Heinz line-array speakers. These new speakers are each 3 sections high and digitally steerable, allowing them to aim the sound where it needs to go, including the top section of each speaker sending sound to the balcony. The sound and clarity in the church should be much more natural and intelligible with these new speakers, helping everyone to hear and understand better. In addition, there will be a new assistive listening system. Those who have difficulty hearing will be able to pick up a device from the Ushers Room which will allow them to hear the sound directly in their own headset or earbud.

Because of the many activities during construction, we waited to install the new carpet in the first floor areas of the church, including the Gathering Area, offices, lower conference room, library, and hallways until the first week of October. This will require our office and ministerial staff to coordinate the moving of all furniture, files, and computers with the maintenance staff. This will complete Phase 1 of the update to our parish prayer spaces and common areas.

The parish team has scheduled our first planning meeting for Phase 2 of our Make Disciples Capital Campaign at the end of September! Thanks to all of you for your continued generosity and support of St. Thomas Aquinas. Through your gifts and sacrifice we are able to continue our mission and grow in our vision for the future. May we continue to become more and more, a parish where people experience Jesus Christ in a way that changes how they live. May we be a passionate community of faith, where all are known, and loved, and called by name. May we continuously dedicate ourselves to the mission of Jesus Christ: to Love God, Love Others, and Make Disciples! Thanks to all of you for sharing your gifts and talents, and love of Jesus with others!

Our Continuing Dialogue on Racism

The Justice and Peace Committee prays for a greater understanding of the sin of racism. We hope that our notes on the topic will lead to more in-depth study, reflection, prayer and conversation that will nurture a conversion of heart and bring healing to all.

In his book, *The Cross and the Lynching Tree*, theologian James H. Cone states that while it is true that in our nation's history, Mexicans, Native Americans, Chinese and whites were lynched, between 1880-1940 nearly 5,000 African-Americans died this way. (p.31) In the beginning, lynching was used as a way to keep ex-slaves subservient. As time went on, it became a way to protect the superiority and control of whites, and for reinforcing the image of Blacks as a subordinate race unfit for governing and not equal to whites politically or socially. (p.7) Accusations of rape were often the stated rationale for the violence of lynching, and shamefully, lynchings even became media spectacles. While lynching most often happened in the South, it was not limited to that region. Cone writes "A black man could be walking down the road, minding his business, and his life could suddenly change by meeting a white man or a group of white men or boys who on a whim decided to have some fun with a Negro*"; and this could happen in Mississippi or New York, Arkansas, or Illinois." (p. 9) As people of faith, can we have the courage to examine the terrible parallels of today?
