- Pray the Rosary while you wait.
- Carry a Rosary in your pocket.

Improved Assistive Listening Devices Available

Updated Assistive Listening Devices Available
One benefit of our new AV system is that we can now offer more up-to-date assistive listening devices to anyone who has difficulty hearing or understanding while worshiping with us at St. Thomas Aquinas. There are two options:

1. a digital receiver with an earbud/earphone
2. a digital receiver and neck loop lanyard for people with telecoil-equipped hearing aids and cochlear implants.

Both options will let you control the volume individually, move around the church, and enjoy excellent clarity and sound. You can check them out from a minister of hospitality or AV Team member in the Ushers Room before Mass. Just look for the "Assistive Listening Available" sign by the Ushers Room. Please bring your own headset to use for more comfort and better fit.

Gospel Reflection By Dcn. Jerome Buhman

RSVP. You are probably familiar with receiving an RSVP to a party or a wedding and just assumed “Oh, it’s an invitation.” And it is, but it’s also a bit more than that, especially in the light of today’s Gospel. RSVP comes to us from the French; it is an abbreviation of *répondez s’il vous plait* – meaning, respond, if you please. In today’s Gospel, we are invited to the wedding feast of the God, the King – we are invited to share in the banquet of eternal life. But it’s an RSVP; that is, we have to respond! And not just show up at the feast. In the extended version of the Gospel, a guest arrives but is not wearing the proper attire, and he is thrown out. For us to be able to share in God’s feast, we must “wear the proper attire” – we must put on Christ and live the life he asks of us in word and deed. So, the next time we receive an RSVP, let’s take a moment to reflect about how we respond to God’s invitation to his feast of salvation.

All donors and vendors that supported this effort (438 households/companies) have been invited to this Mass, and it is filling up fast.

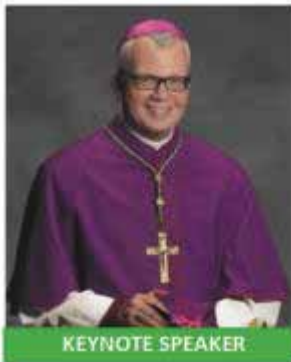

Our Continuing Dialogue on Racism

The Justice and Peace Committee prays for a greater understanding of the sin of racism. We hope that our notes on the topic will lead to more in-depth study, reflection, prayer and conversation that will nurture a conversion of heart and bring healing to all.

James Cone, in his book, *The Cross and the Lynching Tree*, explores the largely unexamined theological similarity between the lynching tree and Golgotha. He writes, "Both the Cross and the lynching tree were symbols of terror, instruments of torture and execution, reserved primarily for slaves, criminals and insurrectionists—the lowest of the low in society. Both Jesus and Blacks were publicly humiliated, subjected to the utmost indignity and cruelty. They were stripped, in order to be deprived of dignity, then paraded, mocked and whipped, pierced, derided and spat upon, tortured for hours in the presence of a jeering crowd... In both cases, the purpose was to strike terror in the subject community. It was to let people know that the same thing would happen to them if they did not stay in their place." (p. 31)

People of faith must have the courage and humility to examine hard truths. When contemplating the crucifixion, the terrible parallels to the injustice of lynching should lead to an examination of conscience. How has white privilege played a damaging role in the history of our nation, and how can it be corrected?

Diocesan Hispanic Leaders attend V Encuentro Regional Gathering Virtually

Once again Hispanic leaders from our diocese come together to continue the 5-year process of the V Encuentro. Back in March, about 12 people of the team were going to attend a regional gathering in Mundelein Seminary in Illinois. This event was focused on welcoming the participation of all the dioceses of Region VII (consisting of Illinois, Indiana, and Wisconsin) to lead valuable discussion and helping Region VII establish strategies for different ministerial areas. However, this event was postponed in Spring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. At the beginning of September, the diocesan core team met again to continue working on the process of the V Encuentro, and on Saturday, September 26, eleven leaders participated on the Regional Gathering virtually. The diocesan team will be finishing this process once they virtually attend the V Encuentro National Workshops on October 9 and 10. Reflexión del Evangelio

RSVP, o Por Favor Responda. Probablemente usted esté familiarizado con recibir una confirmación de asistencia a una fiesta, una quinceañera, o una boda y simplemente asumió "Oh, es una invitación". Y lo es, pero también es un poco más que eso, especialmente a la luz del Evangelio de hoy. El Por Favor Responda (RSVP) nos llega del francés; es una abreviatura de répondez s'il vous plait, es decir, responde, si lo deseas. En el Evangelio de hoy, se nos invita a la fiesta de bodas del Dios, el Rey; se nos invita a participar en el banquete de la vida eterna. Pero es un Por Favor Responda (RSVP); es decir, ¡tenemos que responder! Y no solo presentarse a la fiesta. En la versión extendida del Evangelio, un invitado llega, pero no lleva la vestimenta adecuada y es expulsado. Para que podamos participar en la fiesta de Dios, debemos "vestir el atuendo adecuado", debemos vestirnos de Cristo y vivir la vida que Él nos pide de palabra y de obra. Entonces, la próxima vez que recibamos una confirmación de asistencia, tomemos un momento para reflexionar sobre cómo respondemos a la invitación de Dios a su fiesta de salvación.
