Our annual Ecumenical Thanksgiving Prayer Service with our neighbors at Advent Lutheran Church, ELCA, and Community of Hope, U.C.C. has been cancelled due to the pandemic. Instead we will be emailing to all parishioners a recorded message by the three pastors. Please watch for this message in an upcoming parish email. Authentic ecumenism is a vital mission of the Catholic Church. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states "Christ bestowed unity on His Church from the beginning. This unity, we believe, subsists in the Catholic Church as something she can never lose, and we hope that it will continue to increase until the end of time. Christ always gives His Church the gift of unity, but the Church must always pray and work to maintain, reinforce, and perfect the unity that Christ wills for her.... The desire to recover the unity of all Christians is a gift of Christ and a call of the Holy Spirit" (n. 820). In the book, Crossing the Threshold of Hope, Pope John Paul II also speaks of the urgent need for Christian unity: "By the year 2000 we need to be more united, more willing to advance along the path toward the unity for which Christ prayed on the eve of His Passion. This unity is enormously precious. In a certain sense, the future of the world is at stake. The future of the Kingdom of God in the world is at stake." Please join us in praying for Christian unity.

Make Disciples Capital Campaign Update

We have begun the Planning and Design stage of Phase II of our Campaign, which will be the remodeling of the Kitchen and the Social Hall. Construction of Phase II is scheduled to begin in June 2021. We continue to work with Vogel Brothers and ADC Architects.

Thank You to All Who Donated to Our Priests for Our Future Campaign!

My sincerest gratitude goes to the generous parishioners who helped us in the Priests for Our Future Campaign. What an overwhelming, generous response we made to support seminarian education! We raised 169% of our goal and received \$416,051 as our over-goal sharing. All the over-goal sharing money was placed in our Capital Improvement Fund and used to make long lasting improvements to our campus and worship space. The Capital Improvement Fund has been used over the past 5 years to pay for everything from a new boiler, to the extensive sanctuary remodeling (pews, flooring, lights). We will offer Mass on November 8 at 10:00 AM for the households who participated as a thank you to them.



Gospel Reflection By Dcn. Jerome Buhman



This week's parable is the second one in a row from Matthew about waiting. Last week, the ten virgins were waiting for the bridegroom; today we have the three servants waiting for their master's return. What is central to one interpretation of this Gospel is the actions of the servants in this time of waiting. He has given each a large amount of money, and the master trusts that each will

utilize the money well. The first two servants work with the money – they use what they have been given to create more. The third servant is paralyzed by fear. He believes that if he returns exactly what he has been given, that is all that should be expected. He is so fearful of doing something wrong that he doesn't actively use what he was given as his master intended him to do. While Fr. Bredan Byrne cautions against directly equating the master in the parable with God, he does point out that this "parable challenges a particular type of religiosity that, flowing from a fearful image of God, is concerned simply with not doing anything wrong in order that God will not find anything to punish. Such an attitude neglects to ask what God really wants of believers in the present time, which is an enterprising, even risk-taking, practice of the 'weightier matters of the law' - 'justice, mercy and faith.' [Mt. 23:23]

In our time of waiting for the return of the Lord, what are we doing with what has been given to us? Are we using what God has given to us to promote his kingdom?



Christmas Food Basket Time Is Right Around The Corner!

During the Christmas season, you can make a difference by sharing food with our neighbors in need. This year's Christmas Food Baskets are even more important than past year's as many of our neighbors are struggling due to the pandemic. Food donations to fill 125 baskets will be



collected starting the weekend of November 28 and will continue through December 17.

We understand that this year is like no other, but we would still like to include as many parishioners as possible while taking extra precautions to keep volunteers safe.

If you are coming to the STA campus, you can bring your food donations and put them in the brown bins as usual.

We understand that some members of our parish family want to donate food but are unable to come to the church due to health or other restrictions. Therefore, we will be holding a Donation Drive Through Event on Sunday, December 13 from 11:30 AM until 1:30 PM. Just drive up to the main entrance of the church and volunteers will be present to empty your trunk of groceries!

In the Gathering Area we will have empty boxes that you can "check out," fill, and return. Each box will have an attached list of groceries with which to fill it. Filled boxes should be brought back to church by December 17.

Financial donations are also most welcome. Checks should be made payable to St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church, with the notation "Christmas Food Baskets" in the memo line.

In order to allow us to practice social distancing, we intend to sort and pack donations in three smaller shifts of volunteers, starting on the evening of Thursday, December 17 and continuing with two shifts (afternoon and evening) on Friday, December 18.

The delivery of the baskets will take place Saturday, December 19. As in years past, we need many delivery volunteers. Baskets will be set outside the doors of recipients' homes.



Reflexión del Evangelio

Diácono Jerome Buhman

La parábola de esta semana es la segunda consecutiva de Mateo sobre la espera. La semana pasada, las diez vírgenes estaban esperando al novio; hoy tenemos a los tres sirvientes espe-



rando el regreso de su amo. Una interpretación de este Evangelio son las acciones de los siervos en este tiempo de espera. Le ha dado a cada uno una gran cantidad de dinero, y el amo confía en que cada uno utilizará bien el dinero. Los dos primeros sirvientes trabajan con el dinero: usan lo que se les ha dado para crear más. El tercer sirviente está paralizado por el miedo. Él cree que, si devuelve exactamente lo que se le ha dado, eso es todo lo que se debe esperar. Tiene tanto miedo de hacer algo mal que no usa activamente lo que se le dio como su maestro pretendía que hiciera. Esta próxima cita del Padre Bredan Byrne advierte en contra de equiparar directamente al maestro en la parábola con Dios, y señala que esta "parábola desafía un tipo particular de religiosidad que, que surge de una imagen terrible de Dios, se preocupa simplemente por no hacer nada malo para que Dios no encontrará nada para castigar. Tal actitud deja de preguntar qué es lo que Dios realmente quiere de los creventes en el tiempo presente, que es una práctica emprendedora, incluso arriesgada, de las "cuestiones más importantes de la ley": "justicia, misericordia y fe" [Mt. 23:23]

En nuestro tiempo de espera por el regreso del Señor, ¿qué estamos haciendo con lo que se nos ha dado? ¿Estamos usando lo que Dios nos ha dado para promover su reino?


