Lent Begins on Ash Wednesday February 17

Please join us at Mass or via the livestream on Ash Wednesday at 6:30 AM, 12:10 PM, and 6:30 PM.

This year we will use the form the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship recommends during a pandemic by which ashes are sprinkled over the people's heads instead of being placed on their foreheads. This eliminates physical contact and close talking. This is different from what we are used to but will help keep everyone as safe and healthy as possible. Ash Wednesday ultimately is a day of repentance and sorrow for our sins and changing of our hearts to life in Christ. We pray that despite all we are enduring with the pandemic, we can turn our hearts towards God and away from sin.



February is Black History Month- Let's celebrate Black Catholics!

This Black History Month, we celebrate the black Catholics whose causes for canonization are being advanced. In 2018 the historically black Xavier University of Louisiana (founded by Saint Katharine Drexel) announced that its Institute of Black Catholic Studies (IBCS) would support efforts toward the canonization of five black Catholics:

1. Venerable Pierre Toussaint (1766-1853), the former slave and philanthropist who is buried in New York's Saint Patrick's Cathedral;
2. Venerable Henriette Delille (1813-1862), from New Orleans, a descendant of slaves who founded the Sisters of the Holy Family;
3. Servant of God Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange (ca. 1794-1882), the Haitian refugee who had a passion for educating children and founded the Oblate Sisters of Providence;
4. Servant of God Father Augustus Tolton (1854-1897), who was born in slavery, attended seminary in Rome because no American seminary would accept him, and was a pastor in Chicago;
5. Servant of God Julia Greeley (c. 1833-1918), the former slave who was Denver's "Angel of Mercy," now buried in Denver's cathedral.

What Will You Do for Lent this Year?

Now is a good time to prepare to experience Lent as a time to grow closer to Jesus and celebrate His saving passion, death, and resurrection during Holy Week. The traditional Lenten practices of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving help us to love Jesus more. Make a specific plan for yourself in what you can do for Lent. Here are some suggestions:

- Participate in our Lenten Devotions (Daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, Adoration, etc.) online or in person.
- Experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Choose a charity and offer financial support.
- Call someone who might be isolated due to the pandemic.
- Read the Make Sundays Special Booklet and choose something you can do to enhance how your family observes Sundays as the Lord's Day.

Acompáñenos en la Misa o mediante la transmisión en vivo el Miércoles de Ceniza a las 6:30 AM, 12:10 PM y 6:30 PM.

Este año usaremos la forma que recomienda la Congregación para el Culto Divino del Vaticano durante una pandemia, mediante el cual las cenizas se esparcen sobre las cabezas de las personas en lugar de colocarse en sus frentes. Esto elimina el contacto físico y la conversación cercana. Esto es diferente a lo que estamos acostumbrados, pero ayudará a que todos estén lo más seguros y saludables posible. El Miércoles de Ceniza, en última instancia, es un día de arrepentimiento y dolor por nuestros pecados y cambio de nuestro corazón a la vida en Cristo. Oramos para que a pesar de todo lo que estamos soportando con la pandemia, podamos volver nuestro corazón hacia Dios y alejarnos del pecado.

Febrero es el Mes de la historia afroamericana: Reconozcamos a los católicos negros

Este Mes de la historia afroamericana, celebramos a los católicos negros cuyas causas para la canonización están avanzando. En 2018, la Universidad Xavier de Louisiana fundada por Santa Katharine Drexel e históricamente de estudiantes de raza negra anunció que su Instituto de estudios católicos negros (IBCS, por sus siglas en inglés) apoyaría los esfuerzos hacia la canonización de cinco católicos negros:

1. Venerable Pierre Toussaint (1766-1853), exesclavo y filántropo que está enterrado en la Catedral de San Patricio de Nueva York;
2. Venerable Henriette Delille (1813-1862), de Nueva Orleans, descendiente de esclavos que fundó las Hermanas de la Sagrada Familia;
3. Sierva de Dios Madre Mary Elizabeth Lange (ca. 1794-1882), la refugiada haitiana que tenía una pasión por educar a los niños y fundó las Hermanas Oblatas de la Providencia;
4. Siervo de Dios El Padre Augustus Tolton (1854-1897), quien nació en la esclavitud, asistió al seminario en Roma porque ningún seminario estadounidense lo aceptaría y fue párroco en Chicago;
5. Sierva de Dios Julia Greeley (c. 1833-1918), la exesclava que fue el "Ángel de la Misericordia" de Denver, ahora se encuentra enterrada en la catedral de Denver.



Gospel Reflection By Dcn. Jerome Buhman

Happy Valentine’s Day! And boy, what a romantic reading we have from Leviticus – a discussion of scabs, pustules and blotches on the skin! But actually our readings today do tell us a lot about love, which is the theme of Valentines day. Both our first reading and the Gospel deal with leprosy, a dreaded disease in the ancient world. The reading from Leviticus discusses how to treat lepers for the protection of the rest of the community, and the Gospel focuses on Jesus’ curing of a leper. Leprosy is not as dangerous for most of us today as it was in the ancient world, but in these readings it is analogous to something that is – sin. Sin can be a kind of leprosy in our lives, a pustule on our soul that can grow and spread if left untreated. Luckily, in the Gospel we read of Christ’s love and mercy that cures the leper. That same love can cure us of our sinful leprosy through the sacrament of reconciliation. Through reconciliation, God shows his love for us by absolving our sins, and we show our love by working to reconcile our lives with God. So, this Valentine’s day when you are contemplating which gift of love to give to your beloved, remember the gift of love given to you by God in the sacrament of reconciliation and consider going – after all, Valentine’s day is a day for confessing our love.

Reflexión del Evangelio

¡Feliz día de San Valentín! Y vaya, qué lectura tan romántica tenemos de Levítico; una discusión sobre costras, pústulas y manchas en la piel. Pero en realidad nuestras lecturas de hoy nos dicen mucho sobre el amor, que es el tema del día de San Valentín. Tanto nuestra primera lectura como el Evangelio tratan de la lepra, una enfermedad temida en el mundo antiguo. La lectura de Levítico analiza cómo tratar a los leprosos para la protección del resto de la comunidad y el Evangelio se centra en la curación de un leproso por Jesús. La lepra no es tan peligrosa para la mayoría de nosotros hoy como lo era en el mundo antiguo, pero en estas lecturas es análoga a algo que es: el pecado. El pecado puede ser una especie de lepra en nuestras vidas, una pústula en nuestra alma que puede crecer y extenderse si no se trata. Afortunadamente, en el Evangelio leemos sobre el amor y la misericordia de Cristo que cura al leproso. Ese mismo amor puede curarnos de nuestra lepra pecaminosa mediante el sacramento de la reconciliación. Mediante la reconciliación, Dios muestra su amor por nosotros al absolver nuestros pecados, y nosotros mostramos nuestro amor trabajando para reconciliar nuestras vidas con Dios. Entonces, este día de San Valentín, cuando esté contemplando qué regalo de amor darle a su amado, recuerde el regalo de amor que Dios le dio en el sacramento de la reconciliación y considere ir; después de todo, el día de San Valentín es un día para confesar nuestro amor.

TOTUS TUUS 2021:


Week of July 12 – 16

Why Does Lent Exist?

What is remembered during these three days is so spectacular and miraculous that it takes the Church fifty days to celebrate it. From the close of Easter Sunday until Pentecost we celebrate with great joy that which Jesus has done for us. Lent is a time to prepare ourselves to more fully celebrate the Paschal Mystery! The Paschal Mystery is Jesus' passing over from life on earth through his Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension to a new and glorified life with the Father. We celebrate this Sacred Mystery at every Mass in our sharing of the Eucharist, but during Lent we focus on preparing to celebrate this more fully during our liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday! These celebrations highlight our belief in Jesus Christ as our Risen Lord and Messiah.

Our liturgical celebrations during this season encourage our ongoing repentance and conversion. The songs and hymns at Mass will be modeled after these themes. As a parish, we will sing together each week, "Turn my heart, O God; Take my pain and brokenness; Shape my life for you; Come and turn my heart, O God!" We then come to God in the Penitential Rite and pray together the Kyrie Eleison (Lord, have mercy) in Greek. In addition, we will be singing the Mass of Charity and Love by Steven Warner. This setting of the Ordinary of the Mass is based upon the chant "Where Charity and Love Prevail" by Paul Benoit, OSB.

TAIZÉ PRAYER

During Lent this year, our parish musicians will be offering simple Taizé Prayer on Thursdays, via our LiveStream (facebook.com/Stamadison/live) or (youtube.com/c/StThomasAquinasChurchMadison/live), starting at 7:00 PM. Taizé Prayer is evening prayer for all Christian faiths. It is a simple, meditative form of worship, calling us to dwell deeply on Christ's presence around and within us. Mantra songs like "Jesus, Remember Me" and "Take, O Take Me As I Am," prayerful silence, and short readings guide the focus of the prayer in a candle-lit environment. Services typically last about 30-40 minutes. Taizé Prayer is named for the ecumenical Christian community formed in Taizé, France during World War II. Today the Taizé community includes brothers from all Christian denominations, including Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox traditions.
