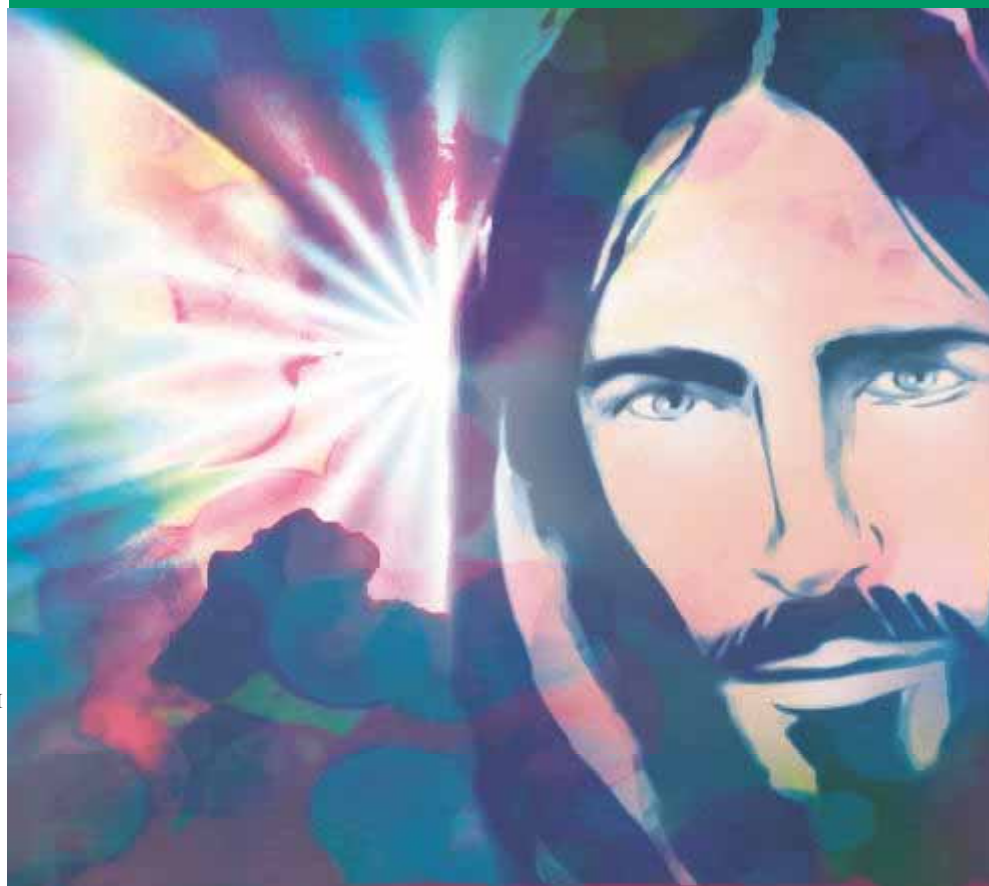

First Sunday of Lent

Our Lenten practices of Prayer, Fasting, and Alms-giving help us strive for holiness of life. Today I want to reflect on Fasting. In numbers 2013 and 2015 of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* it says that all Christians in any state of life are called to holiness and that Spiritual perfection passes by the way of the cross. To live the Gospel, we must daily struggle to die to self and sin and rise to new life in Jesus. In Colossians 3:1-2, it says, "If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above; not of what is on earth." Fasting helps us to be less occupied by earthly material things and to think more about heaven.

The Lenten rules for fasting and abstaining are that every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. Every person between 18-60 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

In Isaiah 58:7, it says that fasting should result in "sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the oppressed and the homeless, clothing the naked when you see them," and the like.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

During Lent we are encouraged to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation which strengthens us to fast from sins such as grudges, resentments, and unforgiveness. I invite each parishioner to take the time to encounter Christ in this Sacrament of healing. Beyond the regularly scheduled times, you can also contact the parish to schedule an appointment:

Primer Domingo de Cuaresma

Nuestras prácticas cuaresmales de oración, ayuno y limosna nos ayudan a luchar por la santidad de la vida. Hoy quiero reflexionar sobre el ayuno. En los números 2013 y 2015 del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica dice que todos los cristianos en cualquier estado de vida están llamados a la santidad y que la perfección espiritual pasa por el camino de la cruz. Para vivir el Evangelio, debemos luchar diariamente para morir al yo y al pecado y resucitar a una nueva vida en Jesús. En Colosenses 3: 1-2, dice: "Si, pues, fuiste resucitado con Cristo, busca lo que está arriba, donde Cristo está sentado a la diestra de Dios. Piense en lo que está arriba; no de lo que hay en la tierra ". El ayuno nos ayuda a estar menos ocupados por las cosas materiales terrenales y a pensar más en el cielo.

Las reglas de Cuaresma para ayunar y abstenerse son que toda persona de 14 años o más debe abstenerse de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza, el Viernes Santo y todos los viernes de Cuaresma. Toda persona entre 18 y 60 años debe ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo.

En Isaías 58: 7, dice que el ayuno debe resultar en "compartir tu pan con los hambrientos, albergar a los oprimidos y sin hogar, vestir a los desnudos cuando los veas", y cosas por el estilo.

Sacramento de la reconciliación

Durante la Cuaresma se nos anima a celebrar el Sacramento de la Reconciliación, que nos fortalece para ayunar de pecados como rencores, resentimientos y falta de perdón. Invito a cada feligrés a tomarse el tiempo para encontrar a Cristo en este Sacramento de sanación. Más allá de los horarios programados regularmente, también puede comunicarse con la parroquia para programar una cita:

Solicitud Católica Anual (ACA, por sus siglas en inglés)

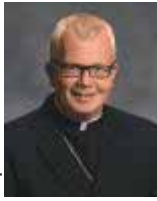

Gospel Reflection By Dcn. Jerome Buhman

“The key to understanding the meaning of Lent is simple: Baptism.” This quote from a Catholic Online article might strike us as strange, but it is true. We often think of Lent in terms of Reconciliation, ashes, and sacrifice. But the roots of Lent lie in the sacrament of baptism. We see evidence of this in our readings today. The first reading tells of Noah and the Flood, washing the world clean and brining new life. Of this event, Peter tells us in our second reading that “[t]his prefigured baptism, which saves you now.” Our Gospel of Jesus in the desert follows immediately after his own baptism and just before he begins his public ministry. Lent is a season made to reflect on the graces and the responsibilities we received at baptism, not only to rejuvenate our own personal spiritual lives, but to assess our role as an evangelizing member of a baptized community. In the words of Cardinal Timothy Dolan: “In a way, Lent is Mother Church’s annual memo to her children - us - to remember our baptism. Our supernatural rebirth by water and the Holy Spirit gave us an identity as a child of God the Father, redeemed by God the Son, now a dwelling place for God the Holy Spirit.” So take some time this Lent to consider your own baptism and all the things this sacrament calls you to be as a child of God.

Reflexión del Evangelio

"La clave para comprender el significado de la Cuaresma es simple: el Bautismo." Esta cita de un artículo de Catholic Online puede parecer extraña, pero es verdad. A menudo pensamos en la Cuaresma en términos de reconciliación, cenizas y sacrificio. Pero las raíces de la Cuaresma se encuentran en el sacramento del bautismo. Vemos evidencia de esto en nuestras lecturas de hoy. La primera lectura habla de Noé y el Diluvio, limpiando el mundo y trayendo nueva vida. De este evento, Pedro nos dice en nuestra segunda lectura que "[el] su bautismo prefigurado, que te salva ahora". Nuestro Evangelio de Jesús en el desierto sigue inmediatamente después de su propio bautismo y justo antes de que comience su ministerio público. La Cuaresma es un tiempo creado para reflexionar sobre las gracias y las responsabilidades que recibimos en el bautismo, no solo para rejuvenecer nuestra propia vida espiritual personal, sino para evaluar nuestro papel como miembro evangelizador de una comunidad bautizada. En palabras del cardenal Timothy Dolan: “En cierto modo, la Cuaresma es el memorando anual de la Madre Iglesia para sus hijos, nosotros, para recordar nuestro bautismo. Nuestro renacimiento sobrenatural por el agua y el Espíritu Santo nos dio una identidad como hijos de Dios el Padre, redimidos por Dios el Hijo, ahora una morada para Dios el Espíritu Santo ". Así que tómame un tiempo en esta Cuaresma para considerar tu propio bautismo y todas las cosas que este sacramento te llama a ser como hijo de Dios.

Lenten Study of Racial Justice

The Justice and Peace Committee recommends reading on our calling to work for racial justice. Reading on the issue will help “to heal the brokenness in our society and our church.”

To learn more about the church's history and teachings on racial justice, we encourage checking out Fr. Bryan Massingale's book: *Racial Justice and the Catholic Church*. Fr. Bryan, a professor of Christian ethics at Fordham University and former associate professor of moral theology at Marquette University “explores how Catholic social teaching has been used to combat racism and promote reconciliation and justice.”

Fr. Bryan ends his book:

“...social life is made by human beings. The society we live in is the outcome of human choices and decisions. This means that human beings can change things. There is nothing necessary or fated about racial hierarchies or white racial privilege. They are the result of human agency; it does not have to be so. What humans break, divide, and separate, we can—with God's help—also heal, unite, and restore.

What is now does not have to be. Therein lies the hope. And the challenge.”

What better time than Black History Month to begin reading this book!

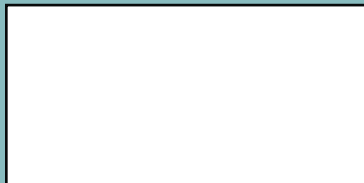
