





Parents preparing for the Baptism of their first child are required to attend a Baptism Preparation session. They do not need to repeat the class for each child. Classes are normally held on the second Saturday of the month from 10:30 AM - 11:45 AM.

First Eucharist and First Reconciliation

The Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist are usually celebrated for the first time during the second grade or second year of faith formation for the child. Orientation sessions for parents which detail the specific preparation process for these sacraments are usually held in the Fall and Winter. There is a two year minimum of preparation prior to these sacraments.

Confirmation

Confirmation is a sacrament of Christian Initiation which completes baptismal grace and strengthens the individual with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish youth are ordinarily confirmed in the spring of their freshman year of high school. Adults who have not celebrated the sacrament are encouraged to prepare for the sacrament during the Lenten Season and celebrate the sacrament in the Easter Season.

Matrimony

Preparing for marriage at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish is much more than arranging your wedding. The primary goal is to prepare the couple to enter into a life-long, sacramental union. The wedding season often gets quite busy, so the earlier the parish receives the request, the more likely it is that the date will be available.

If you or a family member are at the end of life and would like a Pastoral Visit to celebrate the Sacraments of Anointing of the Sick, Reconciliation, and/or Eucharist (Viaticum), please contact the parish office and provide detailed information to our receptionist. For "after hours" calls and/or emergencies, please leave a detailed message on the voice mail of the Pastor and/or Erik Gyr.

After a loved one dies, the family calls the Funeral Home. The Funeral Director alerts our parish and informs us of the day and time of the family meeting. Either the Pastor or Erik Gyr, or both, will join the family at the Funeral Home and help with making arrangements and planning the Funeral Liturgy.

For advanced Funeral Planning or Grief Support, please contact Erik Gyr.

We encourage all parish members to consider pre-planning their funeral liturgy. Making your wishes known to your loved ones is a real gift in the time of need. Planning materials are available in the parish office. Contact Erik Gyr to discuss the various considerations or for assistance.

Liturgical Ministries

Liturgical Roles

There are many opportunities for parishioners to participate in our liturgies. Parishioners can serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Readers, Commentators, Altar Servers, Gift Presenters, Sacristans, Ministers of Hospitality, Greeters, Altar Linen Stewards, Robe Care Stewards, and Art & Environment.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Readers, and Commentators must have celebrated the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist must be in good standing with the Church, be at least 16 years of age, able to fully comprehend the ministry they are undertaking, and properly trained through parish and diocesan training. Schedules will accommodate your availability.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion distribute Holy Communion at Mass when there are not enough clergy present.

Readers proclaim the first and second readings during Mass. A Reader's workbook and training are provided.

Commentators begin the Mass with a greeting and lead/pray the intercessions after the Creed.

Altar Servers assist the priest in the celebration of Mass. Servers must be at least 10 years of age and attend training sessions.

Gift Presenters take up the gifts of bread and wine during the Preparation of the Gifts.

Sacristans get everything ready for Mass, i.e., unconsecrated hosts, wine, water, Father's chalice, patens, etc. After Mass, they purify the sacred vessels used during Mass.

Ministers of Hospitality have several roles.

- **Greeters** welcome people as they enter the church, answer any questions they may have, and after Mass thank parishioners for praying with us.
- Ushers assist people in finding seats, lock the doors 10 minutes after Mass begins, let people into the building after the doors are locked, take up the offertory collections, open the doors after Communion time, hand out bulletins, straighten up pews after Mass, as well as be ready to contact First Responders in case of emergency.
- **Emergency Responders** sit in a designated, reserved pew so they are easily accessible for emergencies.

Livestreaming: AV Team livestreams each Mass and funerals, and other special events. This allows people to pray with our parish family even if not here in person. No experience needed! Training available.

Altar Linen Stewards wash and iron the linens used during Mass. Stewards are scheduled for a month at a time.

Robe Care Stewards wash the servers' albs. This is done once a month, except during the summer when they may need more attention. Stewards are scheduled for a month at a time.

Art & Environment

This new team of individuals will help to craft and oversee specifically, the Liturgical Environment and Décor in the church. This team will work together with our staff. Here are some specific areas and skills which we are hoping to find among our parishioners:

Liturgical Art & Church Documents: The care and decoration of Altar and the church environment requires a working knowledge of some of the documents of the Church. There are specific requirements, guidelines, and restrictions that we follow throughout the year, working to highlight our liturgical seasons and the Holy Mass, which is our primary celebration as Catholics.

Decorators/Designers: Along with knowledge of liturgical art and Church documents, those who are skilled at designing and arranging our environment are extremely important. This is more than just arranging flowers, although that skill is helpful. With an eye to what we celebrate, those who can envision and help to create a welcoming space that draws the assembly into the action of the Mass, are a must in this area. We strive for our whole community to come together in prayer, and our environment helps us to do this in a beautiful and meaningful way.

Fabric Care: We have a lot of fabric and materials that we use in the church, from Altar Cloths, to banners, to fabric to place around flowers, etc. All this material needs to be laundered, ironed, and organized. Many of the fabric pieces have unhemmed edges which will need some attention to clean them up as well. In addition, we are looking for folks whose sewing skills are top-notch and will be able to help us create new Altar Cloths, banners, etc. in the future.

Flower/Plant Care: We also use a lot of plants and flowers throughout the year in our decorations. Some plants are purchased seasonally, like Poinsettias and Easter Lilies. These need regular watering during those seasons. Other plants we keep throughout the year, introducing them into the liturgical environment seasonally or for special events, which need weekly watering and care throughout the entire year.

Heavy Lifters: We are always in need of those who can assist to move flowers and plants, but also for special occasions, those who can do some heavy lifting are essential. This might include climbing ladders to hang fabric banners, carrying in and putting up the Christmas trees and lights, setting up the crèche or the baptismal font, and adjusting lights, etc.

We are grateful to all our parishioners for their support of our parish community, especially during these past months! If you may be able to assist in any of these areas, please let us know. Many hands make light work. And as we continue to develop this new need and ministry, we pray that our prayer as a community of faith will be strengthened by your generosity and goodness.

Music Ministry

The mission of music ministry during the Celebration of the Eucharist is to foster the active participation of the faithful, by encouraging and supporting the sung prayer of all gathered, as well as by providing music for contemplative prayer and reflection.



Cantors & Psalmists – All Masses

The cantor's function is to lead and encourage the congregation in singing. Cantors lead the music at every celebration at St. Thomas Aquinas, by leading the antiphons, acclamations, and litanies. In addition, cantors sing with the assembly and draw them into a deeper experience of our sung prayer. One of the cantors serves as the Psalmist, who has the special task of drawing all present into the proclamation of the Holy Scripture by proclaiming the Psalm. Cantors and Psalmists must be articulate and well-prepared to lead our sung prayer.

Singers/Small Groups/Ensembles – All Masses

In addition to those who serve as cantor and psalmist, additional singers and instrumentalists help to form our small groups/ensembles who assist in leading our sung prayer. These members sing together and play to enhance our worship and bring joy and passion to our Masses. Small group members rehearse once a month throughout the year and serve at our various Masses.

STA Parish Choir - Sunday 10:00 AM Mass

The STA Parish Choir sings weekly at the 10:00 AM Sunday Mass. In addition, this group sings for evening Holy Day Masses, Midnight Mass, Triduum, Confirmation, and other Liturgical Celebrations during the Church Year. This SATB choir sings from September through May each year and sings a wide variety of congregational music as well as a varied repertoire of well-composed choral music. This choir is open to students (grade 7 and up) and adults. No audition required. If you love to sing, this group is for you! Rehearsals are every Thursday from 6:30 to 8:30 PM.

STA Choristers - Saturday at 4:30 PM Mass and Sunday at 10:00 AM Mass, Once or Twice a Month

The STA Choristers sing once or twice a month at the 4:30 PM Saturday Mass and the 10:00 AM Sunday Mass. In addition, this group has the opportunity to sing for other celebrations, including Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Eve Masses. This choir sings from September through May each year and is open to students (grades 4-8) as well as high school students. Rehearsals are most often on Wednesday from 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM.

STA Spanish Choir – Saturday at 6:30 PM Mass

The STA Spanish Choir sings weekly at the 6:30 PM Saturday Mass. This choir joins the STA Parish Choir for bilingual celebrations throughout the Liturgical Year. This choir sings year-round and is open to students (grade 7 and up) and adults. Rehearsals are on Saturdays at 5:30 PM before the 6:30 PM Spanish Mass.

Instrumentalists and Accompanists - All Masses

Instrumentalists and accompanists (piano and/or organ) are encouraged to join our music ministry, depending upon experience. Audition required.

Human Concerns

Justice and Peace Committee (Respect Life and Care for Creation Teams)

This committee facilitates learning about, advocating for, and responding to a wide range of social justice issues. Currently there are two very active teams.

The **Respect Life Team** raises awareness of life issues from conception to natural death and promotes a culture of life by witnessing to the value of each person. The Respect Life Team is engaged in activities defending the right to life---including the unborn, the disabled, the elderly and the terminally ill, as well as those members of the human family impacted by the tragedy of abortion. The **Care for Creation** Team promotes care for God's creation. Inspired by Pope Francis's encyclical Laudato Si', the team has spearheaded parish energy audits and our solar panel installation, encouraged energy efficiency at home and at the parish, and offered educational opportunities for all parishioners, particularly around Earth Day and during the Season of Creation. St. Vincent de Paul Society

Members of the St. Thomas Aquinas Conference of St. Vincent de Paul participate in many activities intended to recognize the face of Christ in those in our community who are in need. These activities include stocking the Society's food pantry, preparing lunches for the residents of Port St. Vincent, and collecting school supplies for the children of homeless and low-income families who have requested our help. Furniture, clothing, bedding, and household items are provided when needed. Financial assistance is given to get utilities turned back on and for rent assistance.

Community Meal Program

Parishioners provide and serve a noon meal to those in need at Luke House on Ingersoll Street on the fourth Wednesday of the month. You can help by preparing food for the meal and/or volunteering to help serve the meal.

Catholic Multicultural Center Meal Program (CMC)

St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Parish hosts the evening meal on the third Sunday of every month. Three-four cooks arrive at 9:30 AM to make the meal. Four other volunteers provide help from 11:00 AM-1:00 PM with setting tables, serving the clients, and cleaning up. Older children (ages about 12+) with their parents are welcome to participate in serving the guests. All food is provided by the CMC.

Food Collection Weekend

On the third weekend of each month, parishioners bring non-perishable food items to Mass. These food items are given to the St. Vincent de Paul and Lussier Community Education Center food pantries, as well as to neighbors in need. You can help by bringing in food or transporting the donated items to food pantries on third Sundays.

Christmas Food Baskets

Parishioners provide residents of Wexford Village apartments and others in our parish neighborhood a basket of grocery staples to help them celebrate Christmas. A few days before Christmas, you can help assemble and distribute over 100 baskets of non-perishable and fresh foods.

"Gifts from the Heart"

During Advent, donated unwrapped Christmas gifts are placed in the Parish Gathering Area. Some of these gifts are given to parish and neighborhood families who need assistance. St. Vincent de Paul receives the rest of the Christmas gifts to distribute.

Waspam, Nicaragua

The purpose of this outreach effort is to provide financial support to the people who live along the Rio Coco in the northeast part of Nicaragua by assisting the school and parish community of St. Rafael in Waspam.

Parish Care Team

Our Parish Care Team seeks to aid those who are homebound or living alone to preserve a rich and independent lifestyle. We offer friendly visits and phone contacts, assistance with shopping, errands and household tasks, and emotional support, prayer and Home Communion visits. We also offer respite, relief and support to family caregivers so they may rest and relax while their loved one has a friendly visitor from our parish. Care Team volunteers are background checked, Safe Environment approved, and receive ongoing training through Catholic Charities.

A partner (client) or caregiver calls team members when they are needed, or they can make weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly arrangements. Team members' typical service times last about two hours. Every other month our team members get together for some spiritual renewal, sharing, and education.



Rooted in the mission of Christ and His Church, Faith Formation works to promote and provide diverse opportunities for continuing conversion and growth toward mature discipleship for all members of the parish community.



Alpha

Alpha is a series of 10 sessions. Each Alpha gathering begins with good food. Following refreshments, there is a video of a short talk exploring various basic aspects of the Christian faith. We consider things like, Is there more to life than this? Who is Jesus? Why did he die? Why and how do I pray? Why and how should I read the Bible? After the video, guests break into small groups where everyone is welcome to share thoughts and ask questions in a nonjudgmental and relaxed setting.

Anyone who wants to get to know Jesus and their faith better, or perhaps get to know about these things for the first time, will find Alpha an easy way to begin. Those who have family members who have stepped away from the Catholic faith will find that Alpha gives them new, more accessible ways of talking about why Jesus and the Church are important to them, while at that same time, strengthening their personal faith life. Alpha is not intended to teach the depth of Catholic knowledge; instead, it is a starting point.

Safe Environment for All

Protection of Children and Young People

In November of 2002, the Bishops of the United States issued the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. In that document, the Bishops reaffirmed the obligation of all involved with the Church to "protect young people and to prevent sexual abuse."

Protection for All

Although the Protecting God's Children program was primarily designed to address the issue of creating safe environments for children and young people, it was also extended to encompass those adults considered to be vulnerable. This includes adults with a physical, mental, or emotional condition that renders them unable to defend, protect, or get help for themselves when injured or emotionally abused. It also includes the elderly.

Requirements

In order to ensure the safety and well-being of all persons, anyone who wishes to serve as a volunteer on behalf of the parish must first complete the corresponding Safe Environment requirements before being placed in a particular ministry role. These components vary based on the volunteer position, but may include a criminal background check, and completion of a VirtusOnline Session. The coordinator for ministries of interest to you will advise you of any training you need.


